Note: Political parties are subject to reporting deadlines in connection with each special state election. This is true even if the committee does not make a payment in connection with the particular election, but receives contributions and/or makes contributions/independent expenditures. Please read notes carefully.

Committees file only one Form 462 per election for each candidate supported or opposed by an independent expenditure. Email only – no paper copy.
Within 48 Hours Issue Advocacy Report	10/25/14 – 12/8/14	E-530	 E-file only – no paper copy. File if a payment or promise of a payment of \$50,000 or more is made during the 45 days prior to the December 9 election for a communication that identifies a state candidate being voted upon but does not expressly advocate the election or defeat of the candidate.
Oct 30, 2014 Pre-Election	* – 10/25/14	450 or 460 & possibly 465	 Paper filing and online for E-filers. 450 or 460: File if contributions totaling \$1,000 or more are <i>received</i> or independent expenditures or contributions totaling \$500 or more are <i>made</i> during the period covered by the statement. 465: File if independent expenditures totaling \$1,000 or more are made to support or oppose a candidate on the December 9 ballot during the period covered by the statement.
Dec 1, 2014 Pre-Election	10/26/14 – 11/22/14	450 or 460 & possibly 465	 Paper filing and online for E-filers. 450 or 460: File if contributions totaling \$1,000 or more are received or independent expenditures or contributions totaling \$500 or more are made during the period covered by the statement. 465: File if independent expenditures totaling \$1,000 or more are made to support or oppose a candidate on the December 9 ballot during the period covered by the statement. The paper filing of the Form 465 must be sent by personal delivery or guaranteed overnight service. The November 27 filing deadline falls on an official state holiday, so the deadline is extended to December 1 as November 28 is also an official state holiday.

Paper filing and online for E-filers. 465: File if independent expenditures totaling \$1,000 or more are made between November 23 and December 8 to support or oppose a defeated candidate in the December 9 election. The January 31 deadline falls on a Saturday, so the deadline is extended to the next business day.

- This filing schedule is prepared for the special primary election only. If a general election is held, a revised schedule will be prepared.
 Committees making payments in connection with other elections may trigger other reporting deadlines.
- *Period Covered: The period covered by any statement begins on the day after the closing date of the last statement filed or January 1 if no previous statement has been filed.
- E-Filer: A state committee that has received contributions or made expenditures totaling \$25,000 or more.
- Form 496: 24-hour independent expenditure reports must be filed through December 9 for the December 9 election.
- Form 497: Unlike the 24-hour independent expenditure reports (Form 496), the deadline for 24-hour contribution reports (Form 497) closes December 8 for the December 9 election.
- Forms 496/497: Payments for member communications are reportable within 24 hours if the member communication would otherwise be considered a contribution or independent expenditure and the payments are made during the 90-day election cycle. All reports are filed online only.
- Forms 450, 460 & 465: All state committees must file an original and one copy in paper format by personal delivery or first class mail unless otherwise noted. An E-Filer also files an online/electronic report. All political parties and central committees file with the Secretary of State.
- Filing Deadlines: Deadlines are extended when they fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or an official state holiday. This extension does not apply to any 24-hour independent expenditure reports (Form 496) or to 24-hour contribution reports (Form 497) that are due the weekend before the election. Such reports must be filed within 24 hours regardless of the day of the week. A \$10 per day late fine may be assessed on both the paper and electronic report resulting in a \$20/day fine.
- Contribution Limits: Contributions to state candidates and to committees that make contributions to state candidates are subject to contribution limits.
 Refer to the contribution limits chart on the FPPC website. Committees making "issue ads" featuring state candidates are also subject to contribution limits.
