Aug 1, 2016 Semi-Annual	*– 6/30/16	450, 460 or 461	 All committees must file this report. General Purpose Committees: Use Form 450 or 460. Major Donor and Independent Expenditure Committees: Use Form 461. The July 31 deadline falls on a Sunday, so the deadline is extended to the next business day.

• Local Ordinance: Always check on whether additional local rules apply.

- * Period Covered: The period covered by any statement begins on the day after the closing date of the last statement filed, or January 1, if no previous statement has been filed.
- Filing Deadlines: Deadlines are extended when they fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or an official state holiday. This extension does not apply to 24-hour independent expenditure reports (Form 496) and the deadline for the Form 497 that is due the weekend before the election. Such reports must be filed within 24 hours regardless of the day of the week. Statements filed after the deadline are subject to a \$10 per day late fine.

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- Method of Delivery: All paper filings are filed by personal delivery or first class mail unless otherwise noted. A paper copy of a report may not be required if a local agency requires online filing pursuant to a local ordinance.
- Committee Status: A city committee may make contributions and independent expenditures in connection with other elections. Generally, a city committee is
 one that spends more than 70% of its funds in connection with elections in one city. See FPPC Regulation 18227.5 to determine whether your committee is a
 city, county or state committee.
- Public Documents: All forms are public documents. Campaign manuals and instructional materials are available at <u>www.fppc.ca.gov</u>, click on the Campaign link.
- Form 511 Paid Spokesperson Report: File within 10 days of making either of the following expenditures related to an advertisement to support or oppose a ballot measure: 1) A payment totaling \$5,000 or more to an individual to appear in an advertisement, or 2) A payment of any amount to an individual portraying a member of a licensed occupation (i.e., nurse, doctor, firefighter).
- Multi-Purpose Organizations (including non-profits): Effective July 1, 2014, multi-purpose organizations making political contributions or expenditures are subject to new campaign disclosure rules. In general, an organization that uses its general dues account to make contributions or expenditures may qualify as a major donor or independent expenditure committee and report payments on Campaign Form 461. Such organizations qualify as a recipient committee if expenditures exceed \$50,000 in a 12-month period or \$100,000 in four consecutive calendar years. An organization that qualifies as a recipient committee may need to file reports disclosing contributors. Some organizations will not need to file the year-end semi-annual report. See the FPPC Campaign Manual 4—Chapter 15 for instructions.
