Feb 1, 2021 <i>Semi-Annual</i>	* – 12/31/20	460	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All committees must file this statement unless the committee filed termination Forms 410 and 460 before December 31, 2020.
April 30, 2021 <i>Quarterly</i>	1/1/21 – 3/31/21	460	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Committees formed for a measure not yet voted upon: Committees formed for a measure to be voted upon in a future election (e.g., 2022) must file quarterly reports until the pre-election period begins for the election in which it will be voted upon, regardless of activity. Committees formed for measures already voted upon: File only if contributions or expenditures are made in connection with another measure.
Aug 2, 2021 <i>Semi-Annual</i>	* – 6/30/21	460	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All committees must file this statement. Period covered is 4/1/21 – 6/30/21 if a quarterly report was filed.
Nov 1, 2021 <i>Quarterly</i>	7/1/21 – 9/30/21	460	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Committees formed for a measure not yet voted upon: Committees formed for a measure to be voted upon in a future election (e.g., 2022) must file quarterly reports until the pre-election period begins for the election in which it will be voted upon, regardless of activity. Committees formed for measures already voted upon: File only if contributions or expenditures are made in connection with another measure.
Jan 31, 2022 <i>Semi-Annual</i>	* – 12/31/21	460	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All committees must file this statement unless the committee filed termination Forms 410 and 460 before December 31, 2021. Period covered is 10/1/21 – 12/31/21 if a quarterly report was filed.

Additional Notes:

- *Period Covered:** The period covered by any statement begins on the day after the closing date of the last statement filed, or January 1, if no previous statement has been filed.
- Local Ordinance:** Always check on whether additional local rules apply.

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- **Deadline Extensions:** Deadlines are extended when they fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or an official state holiday. This extension does not apply to a 24-Hour/10-Day Contribution Report (Form 497) that is due the weekend before the election, and this extension never applies to any 24-Hour/10-Day Independent Expenditure Report (Form 496). Such reports must be filed within 24 hours regardless of the day of the week.
- **Method of Delivery:** All paper filings may be filed by first class mail unless otherwise noted. A paper copy of a report may not be required if a local agency requires online filing pursuant to a local ordinance.
- **Public Documents:** All statements are public documents. Campaign manuals and instructional materials are available at www.fppc.ca.gov. Click on Learn, then Campaign Rules.
- **Independent Expenditures:** Committees making independent expenditures totaling \$1,000 or more to support or oppose other candidates or ballot measures also file:
 - **462:** This form must be e-mailed to the FPPC within 10 days.
 - **496:** This form is due within 24 hours if made in the 90-day, 24-hour reporting period of the candidate's or measure's election. Refer to the applicable election filing schedule. Form 496 is filed with the filing officer in the jurisdiction of the affected candidate or measure.
- **Form 511 – Paid Spokesperson Report:** File within 10 days of making either of the following expenditures related to an advertisement to support or oppose a ballot measure: 1) A payment totaling \$5,000 or more to an individual to appear in an advertisement, or 2) A payment of any amount to an individual portraying a member of a licensed occupation (e.g., nurse, doctor, firefighter).
