

1 Amend 2 Cal. Code Regs., Section 18427.1 to read:

2 **§ 18427.1. Notification to Contributors of Filing Obligations**

3 (a) A candidate or committee that receives contributions cumulating \$ 5,000 or more in a  
4 calendar year from any person shall, within two weeks of receiving such contributions, provide  
5 notice to the contributor that the contributor may be required to file campaign reports. A  
6 candidate or committee that receives contributions cumulating \$ 10,000 or more from any person  
7 during any period in which late contribution reports are required to be filed pursuant to Section  
8 84203 shall within one week of receiving such contribution, provide notice to the contributor that  
9 the contributor may be required to file campaign reports.

10 (b) The notice shall contain the following language or substantially similar language:

11 Major Donors: If your contribution(s) to this committee and to other California state or local  
12 committees total(s) \$ 10,000 or more in a calendar year, California law requires you to file a  
13 Major Donor Committee Campaign Statement (Form 461). The deadline and location for filing  
14 this statement will depend upon the timing and type of contribution(s) you have made. For

16 Nonprofit Groups: If your organization is a nonprofit organization, it may qualify as a major  
17 donor committee required to file Form 461 or as a recipient committee required to file the Form  
18 460 disclosing donors. Refer to ~~Government Code~~ Section 84222 and ~~FPPC~~ Regulation 18422 to

21 24-Hour Reports: Major donors, nonprofits and other multipurpose organizations that trigger  
22 reporting obligations must also file a 24-hour contribution report if ~~you~~ they make contributions

1 totaling \$1,000 or more to a single candidate, any of the candidate's controlled committees, or to  
2 a committee primarily formed to support or oppose a candidate or ballot measure during the 90  
3 ~~days before the election~~ 90 days prior to the election, or on the date of the election, in which the  
4 candidate or ballot measure is being voted on. The 24-hour reports are also required if they or  
5 make contributions totaling \$1,000 or more to state or county political party committees during  
6 the 90 days prior to a state election, or on the date of the election, including state special  
7 elections.

8       Electronic Filing: State committees that make contributions of \$ 25,000 or more must file  
9 electronically with the Secretary of State. State committees that are required to file the Form  
10 Form 497 24-hour contribution report must file this form electronically even if the \$ 25,000  
11 threshold has not yet been met. For more information on the electronic filing requirements,  
12 contact the Secretary of State's office at (916) 653-6224. Local committees should contact the  
13 local jurisdiction to determine if there are electronic filing requirements.

14       Failure to file campaign statements may result in late filing penalties (\$ 10/day) and fines (up  
15 to \$ 5,000/violation). For assistance with your filing obligations, contact the Fair Political

18       (c) Candidates and treasurers shall maintain a record of all notices sent pursuant to this  
19 section, containing the date of each notice and the name and address of the person to whom each  
20 notice is sent.

21       (d) Notice to a contributor is not required if:

1 (1) A notice has previously been sent to the contributor pursuant to this section in the same  
2 calendar year; or

3 (2) The contributor has been issued a recipient committee identification number by the  
4 Secretary of State.
