Thursday, February 28, 2013

CALL TO ORDER

Chair Ann Ravel called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. at the Fair Political Practices Commission, 428 J Street, Sacramento, CA 95814. Chair Ravel and Commissioners Sean Eskovitz, Lynn Montgomery, and Gavin Hachiya Wasserman were present and Commissioner Elizabeth Garrett was present by telephone.

WELCOME AND CHAIR'S REPORT

Ann Ravel, FPPC Chair welcomed Commissioner Wasserman to the Commission and provided his biographical summary.
