No reimbursement is required by this act pursuant to Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution because the only costs that may be incurred by a local agency or school district will be incurred because this act creates a new crime or infraction, eliminates a crime or infraction, or changes the penalty for a crime or infraction, within the meaning of Section 17556 **Commented [PU1]:** Spouse or domestic partner are removed because their addition would conflict with (a) which prohibits a spouse or domestic partner from being compensated by a controlled committee which includes a spouses interest in a vendor.

Commented [PU2]: By making it a general interest rather than a majority-owned interest, it would include scenarios where a relative has a minority interest in the vendor or is employed by the vendor.
