Duties and Responsibilities:

Analyze and evaluate facts, statements and other evidence obtained from investigations which relate to possible violations of the Political Reform Act. Formulate and articulate a plan for conducting an effective investigation, including determining what evidence needs to be obtained and what method should be employed to obtain it.

Locate, contact, and interview individuals who may have knowledge of violations of the Political Reform Act. Articulate and present to case attorney, Supervising Special Investigator, and Enforcement Chief the results of the interviews as well as the next step in the investigation.

Prepare correspondence, case chronologies, subpoenas for records and appearance, and investigative reports detailing case evaluations, analyses and evidence received in connection with investigations undertaken.

Obtain, analyze and evaluate public documents filed with the Secretary of State, Fair Political Practices Commission and other state and local agencies.

Establish and maintain cooperative relationships with federal, state, local officials and agencies.

Serve legal papers, subpoenas and other legal documents. Appear as a witness at civil or administrative proceedings.

Who May Apply: Individuals who have eligibility for appointment to the above class (e.g., transfer, list, reinstatement).
