

1 Amend 2 Cal. Code Regs., Section 18535 to read:

2 **§ 18535. Restrictions on Contributions Between State Candidates.**

3 (a) Under ~~Government Code~~ sSection 85305, a candidate for elective state office, as  
4 defined in ~~Government Code~~ sSection 82024, and any committee controlled by that candidate  
5 may not make any contribution to any other candidate for elective state office in excess of  
6 \$3,000 per election except as provided in subdivisions (b), (c), and (d). This amount is adjusted  
7 for inflation in January of every odd-numbered year, pursuant to ~~Government Code~~ sSection  
8 83124 and implementing regulations, and is \$3,000 in 2002.

9 (b) Pursuant to ~~Government Code~~ sSection 85315, the restrictions of ~~Government Code~~  
10 sSection 85305 do not apply to contributions made by a candidate for elective state office, or any  
11 committee controlled by that candidate, to a committee established by an elective state officer to  
12 oppose the qualification of a recall measure or to oppose the recall election for his or her elected  
13 state office.

14 (c) Pursuant to Section 85304(b), the restrictions of Section 85305 do not apply to  
15 contributions made by a candidate for elective state office, or any committee controlled by that  
16 candidate, to a committee established by an elective state officer to defray attorney's fees and  
17 other related legal costs incurred for the candidate's or officer's legal defense established under  
18 Section 85304(a).

19 (d) Pursuant to Section 85303(c), the restrictions of Section 85305 do not apply to  
20 contributions made by a candidate for elective state office, or any committee controlled by that  
21 candidate, to a ballot measure committee controlled by another state candidate.

22 (e) (e) The \$3,000 limit of ~~Government Code~~ sSection 85305, as adjusted for inflation,  
23 applies to contributions made by officeholders or candidates for Governor, other statewide

1 elective offices, the Legislature, and the Board of Administration of the Public Employees'  
2 Retirement System, and their committee(s), to other candidates for elective state office, subject  
3 to the provisions of subdivision (e).

4 (d) ~~(f)~~ Except as provided in subdivisions (b), (c) and (d), the restrictions of ~~Government~~  
5 ~~Code~~ sSection 85305 on contributions made by one candidate for elective state office to another  
6 apply to the aggregate total of contributions made from the personal funds or assets of the  
7 candidate and contributions made by all committees controlled by that candidate, as defined in  
8 ~~Government Code~~ sSection 82016 and ~~2-Cal. Code Regs. Section~~ Regulation 18217.

9 (e) ~~(g)~~ Except as provided in subdivisions (b), (c) and (d), the restrictions of ~~Government~~  
10 ~~Code~~ sSection 85305 on contributions made by one candidate for elective state office to another  
11 apply to all contributions made from, and all contributions made to, any committees controlled  
12 by a candidate for elective state office, including committees formed for a pre-2001 election.

13 (f) ~~(h)~~ Pursuant to Section 83 of Proposition 34, the restrictions of ~~Government Code~~  
14 sSection 85305 are applicable to contributions made by legislative candidates and their  
15 controlled committees to any candidate for elective state office, on and after January 1, 2001, and  
16 are applicable to contributions made by candidates for statewide elective office, as defined in  
17 ~~Government Code~~ sSection 82053, and their controlled committees, to any candidate for elective  
18 office, on and after November 6, 2002, except as provided in subdivisions (b), (c) and (d).
