Additional Election Report

Depending on committee activity, the following report may also be required:

- <u>511</u> **Paid Spokesperson Report:** File within 10 days of making an expenditure totaling \$5,000 or more to an individual to appear in an advertisement to support or oppose a ballot measure.
- Period Covered: The period covered by any statement begins on the day after the closing date of the last statement filed, or January 1, if no previous statement has been filed.
- Filing Deadlines: Deadlines are extended when they fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or an official state holiday. This extension does not apply to 24-hour independent expenditure reports (Form 496) or to those 24-hour contribution reports (Form 497) that are due the weekend before the election. Such reports must be filed within 24 hours regardless of the day of the week. Statements filed after the deadline are subject to a \$10 per day late fine.
- Method of Delivery: All paper filings are to be filed by personal delivery or first class mail unless otherwise noted.
- Committee Status: A county or state committee may make contributions and independent expenditures in connection with other elections. See FPPC regulation 18227.5 to determine whether your committee is a city, county or state committee. A "city" or "county" committee is one that spends 70% of its funds in connection with elections in one city or one county, respectively. All other committees are "state" committees, spending on state elections and in multiple jurisdictions throughout the state.
- A committee that makes payments in connection with elections held on a date other than November 5, 2013 must consult the appropriate filing schedule.
- Public Documents: All forms are public documents. Campaign manuals and instructional materials available at www.fppc.ca.gov, click on the Campaign link.
- Effective January 1, 2013, the following legislation took effect. Check the FPPC website for updates:
 - o 24-hour contribution/independent expenditure reports must be filed during the 90 day period before an election. Form 462 affirming the independent nature of the expenditure is required. (AB 481)
 - Local agencies may require electronic filings. (AB 2452)
