| Within 24 Hours <i>Contribution/ Independent Expenditure Reports</i> | 9/26/14 – 12/9/14 | 496 497 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ E-File only – no paper copy. Note: Form 497 is filed only through December 8. ▪ 496: File if independent expenditures totaling \$1,000 or more are made to support or oppose a candidate on the December 9 ballot. ▪ 497: File if contributions totaling \$1,000 or more are made to a candidate on the December 9 ballot, or to a political party committee. |
| Within 10 Days <i>Independent Expenditure Verification</i> | Ongoing | 462 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Committees making independent expenditures (“IEs”) must file this form with the FPPC. ▪ Committees file only one Form 462 per election for each candidate supported or opposed by an independent expenditure. ▪ Email only – no paper copy. |
| Within 48 Hours <i>Issue Advocacy Report</i> | 10/25/14 – 12/8/14 | E-530 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ E-File only – no paper copy. ▪ File if a payment or promise of a payment of \$50,000 or more is made during the 45 days prior to the December 9 election for a communication that identifies a state candidate being voted upon but does not expressly advocate the election or defeat of the candidate. |
| Oct 30, 2014 <i>IE Report</i> | 1/1/14 – 10/25/14 | 465 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Paper filing and online for E-filers. ▪ File if independent expenditures totaling \$1,000 or more are made to support or oppose a candidate on the December 9 ballot. |
| Dec 1, 2014 <i>IE Report</i> | 10/26/14 – 11/22/14 | 465 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Paper filing and online for E-filers. ▪ Paper filing must be sent by personal delivery or guaranteed overnight service only. ▪ File if independent expenditures totaling \$1,000 or more are made to support or oppose a candidate on the December 9 ballot. ▪ The November 27 filing deadline falls on an official state holiday, so the deadline is extended to December 1 as November 28 is also an official state holiday. |
| Feb 2, 2015 <i>Semi-Annual</i> | * – 12/31/14 | 450 or 460 & possibly 465 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Paper filing and online for E-filers. ▪ 450 or 460: All committees must file this report. ▪ 465: File if independent expenditures totaling \$1,000 or more were made between November 23 and December 8 to support or oppose a defeated candidate in the December 9 election. ▪ The January 31 deadline falls on a Saturday, so the deadline is extended to the next business day. |

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- **This filing schedule is prepared for the special primary election only. If a general election is held, a revised schedule will be prepared. Committees making payments in connection with other elections may trigger other reporting deadlines.**
- ***Period Covered:** The period covered by any statement begins on the day after the closing date of the last statement filed or January 1 if no previous statement has been filed.
- **E-Filer:** A state committee that has received contributions or made expenditures totaling \$25,000 or more.
- **Form 496:** 24-hour independent expenditure reports must be filed through December 9 for the December 9 election.
- **Form 497:** Unlike the 24-hour independent expenditure reports (Form 496), the deadline for 24-hour contribution reports (Form 497) closes December 8 for the December 9 election.
- **Filing Deadlines:** Deadlines are extended when they fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or an official state holiday. This extension does not apply to any 24-hour independent expenditure reports (Form 496) or to 24-hour contribution reports (Form 497) that are due the weekend before the election. Such reports must be filed within 24 hours regardless of the day of the week. A \$10 per day late fine may be assessed on both the paper and electronic report resulting in a \$20/day fine.
- **Contribution Limits:** Contributions to state candidates and to committees that make contributions to state candidates are subject to contribution limits. Refer to the [contribution limits chart](#) on the FPPC website. Committees making “issue ads” featuring state candidates are also subject to contribution limits.
- **Public Documents:** All forms are public documents. Campaign manuals and instructional materials are available at www.fppc.ca.gov, click on the [Campaign](#) link.
- **Multi-Purpose Organizations (including non-profits):** Effective July 1, 2014, multi-purpose organizations making political contributions or expenditures are subject to new campaign disclosure rules. In general, an organization that uses its general dues account to make contributions or expenditures may qualify as a major donor or independent expenditure committee and report payments on Campaign Form 461. Such organizations qualify as a recipient committee if expenditures exceed \$50,000 in 12 months or \$100,000 in four years. Organizations qualifying as a recipient committee may need to file reports disclosing contributors. Some organizations will not need to file the year-end semi-annual report.
