No paper copy required. |
| Jan 25, 2024 $1^{\text {st }}$ Pre-Election | 1/1/24-1/20/24 | $\frac{450}{460} \text { or }$ | - File if contributions or independent expenditures totaling $\$ 500$ or more were made to a state or county general purpose committee, or to support or oppose a candidate or measure appearing on the March 5, 2024, state primary election ballot. |
| $\begin{aligned} & \text { Feb 22, } 2024 \\ & 2^{\text {nd }} \text { Pre-Election } \end{aligned}$ | 1/21/24-2/17/24 | $\frac{450}{460} \text { or }$ | - File if contributions or independent expenditures totaling $\$ 500$ or more were made to a state or county general purpose committee, or to support or oppose a candidate or measure appearing on the March 5, 2024, state primary election ballot. |
| July 31, 2024 Semi-Annual | * - 6/30/24 | $\frac{450}{460} \text { or }$ | - All committees must file Form 450 or Form 460. |

| Within 10 <br> Business Days <br> \$5,000 Report <br> (State Ballot Measure <br> Payments) | Ongoing | $\frac{496}{497}$ | Only state e-filers file $\$ 5,000$ reports: <br> - 496: Report independent expenditures totaling $\$ 5,000$ or more to support or oppose the qualification or passage of a single state ballot measure. <br> - 497: Report contributions totaling $\$ 5,000$ or more to support or oppose the qualification or passage of a single state ballot measure. <br> - Contributions Received: List all new contributions of $\$ 100$ or more received by the committee that have not been previously reported up through the date of the $\$ 5,000$ or more payment. <br> - No paper copy is required. |
| Within 10 Business Days \$5,000 Report (Local Ballot Measure Qualification Payments) | Ongoing | $\frac{496}{497}$ | - 496: Report independent expenditures totaling $\$ 5,000$ or more to support or oppose the qualification of a single local ballot measure. <br> - 497: Report contributions totaling $\$ 5,000$ or more to support or oppose the qualification of a single local ballot measure. <br> - Contributions Received: List all new contributions of $\$ 100$ or more received by the committee that have not been previously reported in connection with the qualification of the measure up through the date of the $\$ 5,000$ or more payment. <br> - Where to File: File in the jurisdiction of the local measure and not necessarily where the committee files its regular campaign statements. <br> - Method of Filing: File by personal delivery, e-mail, guaranteed overnight service, or fax. You may also file online, if available. |
| Within 10 Days <br> Paid Spokesperson Report | Ongoing | $\underline{511}$ | - File within 10 days of making either of the following expenditures related to an advertisement to support or oppose a ballot measure: 1) a payment totaling $\$ 5,000$ or more to an individual to appear in an advertisement, or 2) a payment of any amount to an individual portraying a member of a licensed occupation (e.g., nurse, doctor, firefighter). E-filers must also file a paper copy.*** |
| Within 48 Hours Issue Advocacy Report | 1/20/24-3/5/24 | E-530 | - File if a payment or promise of a payment of $\$ 50,000$ or more is made during the 45 days prior to an election for a communication that identifies a state candidate listed on the ballot but does not expressly advocate the election or defeat of the candidate. No paper copy is required. |

## Additional Notes:

- *Period Covered: The period covered by any statement begins on the day after the closing date of the last statement filed, or January 1 , if no previous statement has been filed.


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- **Deadlines: Due to the election being held early in the year, the deadline for the first pre-election statement for calendar year 2024 is earlier than the semiannual statement for calendar year 2023. A committee active in both calendar years may file the 2023 statement on January $25,2024$.
- ***Paper Filings: All paper filings may be filed by first-class mail or by email with a verified digital signature unless otherwise noted. Persons required to file a report or statement by paper with the Secretary of State's Office may instead file by email (digitalfiling@sos.ca.gov) with a verified digital signature or other digital means as prescribed by the Secretary of State's Office. Please visit the Secretary of State's website for more information on how to file with a digital signature. Refer to the filing with a digital signature fact sheet for assistance in creating your digital ID.
- Deadline Extensions: Deadlines are extended when they fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or an official state holiday. This extension does not apply to a 24-Hour/10Day Contribution Report (Form 497) that is due the weekend before the election, and this extension never applies to any 24-Hour/10-Day Independent Expenditure Report (Form 496). Such reports must be filed within 24 hours regardless of the day of the week.
- E-filer: A state committee that has received or made expenditures totaling $\$ 25,000$ or more.
- Forms 450 and 460: All state committees, including e-filers, must file paper reports.***
- Forms 496 and 497: All reports filed online only.
- Multipurpose Organizations (including non-profits): A multipurpose organization that uses its general dues account to make contributions or expenditures may qualify as a major donor or independent expenditure committee and may be required to report payments on Form 461 . Such an organization will qualify as a recipient committee if expenditures exceed $\$ 50,000$ in a 12-month period or $\$ 100,000$ in four consecutive calendar years. An organization that qualifies as a recipient committee may need to file statements disclosing contributors. For more information, see FPPC's fact sheet Multipurpose Organizations Reporting Political Spending.
- State Contribution Limits: Refer to the contribution limits chart on the FPPC website.
- Expenditures for Local Elections: Committees making contributions or independent expenditures in connection with a local election should consult the filing schedule for that election as Forms 497 and 496 may be required. Check with the jurisdiction to determine if there are contribution limits or other restrictions.
- Penalties: Late statements and reports are subject to a fine of $\$ 10$ per day on both the paper and the e-filed version (i.e., $\$ 20$ per day for a late e-filed Form 460). Failure to file a statement or report could result in an enforcement penalty of \$5,000 per violation.
- Public Documents: All statements and reports are public documents.
