Placement Agents: Lobbying Registration Requirements

Registration Requirements

Effective January 1, 2011, individuals who serve as placement agents before an entity such as CalPERS or CalSTRS must register as lobbyists and file disclosure reports. (AB 1743, Chapter 668, Stats. 2010). This fact sheet outlines the registration process and contains important information regarding restrictions applicable to lobbyists. Individuals are encouraged to contact the Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC") at 1-866-275-3772 for specific guidance. The FPPC is considering regulations to clarify the new law's application.

Who Must File

"Placement agent" means any person hired, engaged, or retained by, or serving for the benefit of or on behalf of, an external manager, or on behalf of another placement agent, who acts or has acted for compensation as a finder, solicitor, marketer, consultant, broker, or other intermediary in connection with the offer or sale of the securities, assets, or services of an external manager to a board or an investment vehicle, either directly or indirectly.

However, the new law provides exceptions for certain individuals from registering as a lobbyist. Individuals who are uncertain of their status are advised to contact the FPPC. For purposes of this fact sheet, "placement agent" means an individual who must register as a lobbyist.

Registration Deadline

Individuals who qualify as placement agents must file registration forms with the Secretary of State. In addition, forms may be filed online with Secretary of State.

- An individual must register as a lobbyist **before acting as a placement agent** in connection with any potential system investment made by a state public retirement system. (California Government Code Section 7513.86)
- Lobbyist forms may be filed in December for those who wish to do so.

Required Forms and Payment

An individual who qualifies as a placement agent must complete and sign Form 604 - Lobbyist Certification Statement. Please note an individual must mark the box that he/she will attend the Lobbyist Ethics Orientation Course within 12 months of registering as a lobbyist. **This form must be filed along with one of the following form(s):**

- If a placement agent is employed on a "contract basis", the Form 604 is filed with the Form 601 Lobbying Firm Registration Statement. Generally, the placement agent will complete both forms. The external management firm, other placement agent or similar entity will complete the Form 602 Lobbying Firm Activity Authorization. Three forms must be filed under this arrangement. (See Illustration A)
- If a placement agent is an "employee" of an external management firm or another placement agent, the
 required forms are different. In this case, the Form 604 is filed with Form 603 Lobbyist Employer/Lobbying
 Coalition Registration Statement, which identifies the external management firm, another placement agent or
 similar entity. (See Illustration B)

In addition, include:

- \$50 registration fee payable to Secretary of State for each lobbyist
- · Recent photograph from the shoulders up of each lobbyist
- Quarterly disclosure forms must be filed with the Secretary of State

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Lobbyist Restrictions

Unlawful Gifts.

It is unlawful for a lobbyist, or lobbying firm, to make gifts to a person aggregating more than ten dollars (\$10) in a calendar month, or to act as an agent or intermediary in the making of any gift, or to arrange for the making of any gift by any other person, if that person works for a state retirement system such as CalPERS or CalSTRS. (California Government Code Section 86203)

Contributions.

An elected state officer or candidate for elected state office may not accept a contribution from a lobbyist, and a lobbyist may not make a contribution to an elected state officer or candidate for elected state office, if that lobbyist is registered to lobby the governmental agency for which the candidate is seeking election or the governmental agency of the elected state officer. (California Government Code Section 85702) (e.g. CalPERS Board Members, CalSTRS Board Members, Supt. of Public Instruction, State Treasurer, State Controller)

Other Prohibitions.

No lobbyist or lobbying firm shall:

- Do anything with the purpose of placing any elected state officer, legislative official, agency official, or state candidate under personal obligation to the lobbyist, the lobbying firm, or the lobbyist's or the firm's employer.
- Deceive or attempt to deceive any elected state officer, legislative official, agency official, or state candidate with regard to any material fact pertinent to any pending or proposed legislative or administrative action.
- Cause or influence the introduction of any bill or amendment thereto for the purpose of thereafter being employed to secure its passage or defeat.
- Attempt to create a fictitious appearance of public favor or disfavor of any proposed legislative or administrative
 action or to cause any communication to be sent to any elected state officer, legislative official, agency official,
 or state candidate in the name of any fictitious person or in the name of any real person, except with the
 consent of such real person.
- Represent falsely, either directly or indirectly, that the lobbyist or the lobbying firm can control the official action of any elected state officer, legislative official, or agency official.
- Accept or agree to accept any payment in any way contingent upon the defeat, enactment, or outcome of any proposed legislative or administrative action. (California Government Code Section 86205)

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Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. What forms are required if more than one employee of an entity qualifies as a placement agent and must register as a lobbyist?
- A. Each individual placement agent must complete Form 604. A recent photo from the shoulders up and a \$50 registration fee is required for each lobbyist. These are filed with Form 603.
- 2. I qualify as a placement agent/lobbyist when must the forms be filed with the Secretary of State?
- A. Individuals may not contact agencies such as CalPERS or CalSTRS unless the individual/placement agent is registered to lobby and the external manager/client is identified on lobbying registration forms. Registration forms identifying the parties must be on file before communications with agencies such as CalPERS or CalSTRS can take place.
- 3. May I file my registration forms electronically?
- A. You may file your registration forms electronically, but all registration documents must also be filed in paper with original signatures.
- 4. A registered lobbying firm (Firm A) with an individual placement agent/lobbyist has registered several external managers as clients which Firm A will be representing before CalPERS and CalSTRS. Firm A decides it wants to subcontract with another individual/placement agent to represent one of Firm A's registered clients before CalPERS and CalSTRS.
 - What registration forms are required?
- A. The registration forms are different depending whether the subcontractor is registered as a lobbying firm as described below:
 - Firm A must provide to the subcontracting firm, Firm B, Form 602, Lobbying Firm Activity Authorization, which lists the name(s) of the subcontracted external manager(s).
 - Firm B, **if currently registered**, completes Form 605, Amendment to Registration and identifies Firm A in Part I. Both Firm A and the identity of the subcontracted external managers are provided in Part II, Section B. File both the Form 605 and the Form 602 with Secretary of State.
 - Firm B, if not registered, completes Form 601, Lobbying Firm Registration Statement. In Part I, list each individual placement agent who will be representing "clients" before CalPERS and CalSTRS, and include a Form 604, Lobbyist Certification Statement for each lobbyist. Complete Part II, Section B, identifying Firm A and the subcontracted external manager(s). File Forms 601, 604, and the Form 602 with Secretary of State, along with the lobbyist photo(s) and the registration fees.

Note: The law requires a specific description of the external manager, on Page 2 of the Form 602/603. Most entities must check the Business category in and, in the appropriate sections, further define the nature and interest of the external manager.

- 5. What if information changes on my registration forms?
- A. In most cases, amendments to the registration forms must be filed within 20 days of the change. This includes information such as a change of address. The exception is for the entities registered as lobbying firms. Those entities must file Form 602 for each new external manager prior to attempting to influence CalPERS or CalSTRS on behalf of that client as noted in Question 2.
- 6. My offices are located in New York and Chicago. Is the Lobbyist Ethics Orientation Course offered online?
- A. No, the Lobbyist Ethics Orientation Course is not offered online. Information concerning the course schedule and sign up is available on the websites of the CA Secretary of State (Link 2 under Resources), the CA Fair Political Practices Commission (Link 1 under Resources), and the Senate Committee on Legislative Ethics (Link 6 under Resources).

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- 7. The lobbying registration forms request a date qualified. How is that date determined?
- A. Generally, that date is the day an individual is employed to engage as a placement agent before a California state public employee pension program. Individuals must file lobbying registration forms before engaging in communications with the state agencies.
- 8. Traditionally, our company provides a contingency fee or bonus for successful arrangements. May we continue to offer these financial benefits?
- A. Government Code Section 86205(f) specifically prohibits contingency fees and similar arrangements. A written document outlining payment services should be kept in order to show compliance with the law.
- 9. Our firm anticipates contacts with the pension program administrators for the University of California. Must our firm's placement agents register?
- A. Yes. The law provides no exemptions for the University of California's pension system.
