This letter is a request for a written response, in addition to the oral response you gave to my staff person, Eva Nelson, on May 16 regarding a mailing to local governmental entities in my district.

The question was whether a 250-piece mailing to cities, counties, special districts, school districts and community colleges in the 17th Senate District transmitting budget material was exempt from the 200-piece limit.

Your response was that mailings in the normal course of business from one governmental entity to another governmental entity are exempt from the 200-piece limitation.
