Dear Mr. Nasworthy:

This is in response to your letter of June 25, 1984, requesting confirmation of my telephone advice to you regarding printed campaign materials such as lawn signs, bumper stickers and billboards. As I advised you, the Political Reform Act (Government Code Sections 81000-91014) contains no provisions requiring that such items include a disclaimer. However, the Act does require that the name and address of the sender of a mass mailing (200 or more identical or nearly identical pieces of mail sent in a calendar month) be included on the outside envelope and on at least one insert in no less than six-point type (Gov. Code Section 84305).

I hope this information is helpful. Please let me know if you have any additional questions.


Dear Ms. Wardlow:
