Dear Congressman Lagomarsino:

I am writing to request your assistance in obtaining the requirements for filing and reporting with the California Fair Political Practices Commission for elective office within the California Republican Party.

As you may know, California specifically provides for political parties in the state Constitution, unlike the U.S. Constitution. I will be running for an elected position within the California Republican Party in early 1989 and am unsure as to the filing and reporting requirements with the FPPC, particularly since the passage of Proposition's 68 and 73.

Specifically, I would like to know, am I as a candidate for an elected position within the California Republican Party required to file and or report any funds that I raise to pay for the campaign; are the individuals, businesses, PAC's, or corporations required to report their contributions to my campaign to the FPPC; am I limited to the amounts that I can raise from the aforementioned; are they limited to the amounts they can donate, and am I limited to an overall amount that I can spend?

As I understand the law, only those running for public, local, legislative, and state-wide office are required to report and file with the FPPC. Your assistance in obtaining the answers to these questions would be appreciated. I wish to begin my campaign immediately and need to advise my treasurer, and donors.
