

You can learn to cut through the bureaucratic red-tape in a snip at Assemblyman Jerry Eaves' Second Annual Government on Saturday, March 4, 1989 from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at Central City Mall on Second Street, between G and E Streets in San Bernardino. "This event is the equivalent of Sacramento coming to San Bernardino for a day," said Assemblyman Jerry Eaves.

It will be a marketplace brimming with government information. "Shoppers" can get updates on just about every benefit program for children and seniors and on controversial issues such as the insurance initiative Proposition 103. A new twist at Assemblyman Jerry Eaves Second Annual Government Day is that agencies will be recruiting new employees. So you can come to Government Day prepared to complain or to court the Government.

Scores of government staffers are giving up their Saturdays "to meet with the people" in a fair-like atmosphere throughout the mall. Assemblyman Jerry Eaves' Government Day concept has proved successful.
