Dear Ms. Fletcher:

You have requested advice concerning the campaign disclosure provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act").^{1/} Because you have not asked a specific question of interpretation under the Act, we treat your letter as a request for informal assistance pursuant to Regulation 18239(c).^{2/}

You have asked what your options are for the use of surplus campaign funds remaining in your campaign account. You do not intend to seek re-election.

The Political Reform Act, as amended by Proposition 73, states that campaign funds shall be deemed to be held in trust for expenses associated with the election of the candidate to a specific office or expenses associated with holding that office. (Section 85202.) In addition, Section 85304 prohibits a candidate for elective office from transferring funds to another candidate.

California Elections Code Section 12400 et seq. prohibits the personal use of campaign funds and sets out the permissible use of surplus campaign funds. You may want to contact Ted Prim with
