You have requested confirmation of telephone advice provided to you concerning the status of Taxpayers to Limit Campaign Spending v. FPPC (Case No. B039177, Court of Appeal, Second Appellate Dist., Div. 3).

Since our conversation of October 13, 1989, the Supreme Court has decided to grant the Commission's petition for review. Until the Supreme Court issues an opinion in the Taxpayers case, candidates are not subject to the limitations, including the off-year ban on contributions, set forth in Proposition 68. It is anticipated that it will be several months before the final opinion is issued.
