**RE: Warning Letter**

**FPPC No. 14/1115; Stop the Housing Tax, No on G, a coalition of homeowners, renters, and real estate organizations. Major funding by California Association of Relator Issues Mobilization PAC Committee, and San Francisco Association of Realtors.**

Dear Committee and Mr. Hannigan:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "FPPC") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"),<sup>1</sup> found in Government Code Section 81000, et seq. This letter is in response to a sworn complaint that alleged you failed to have the proper sender identification on your campaign mass mailings. We are closing this matter with a warning letter.

The FPPC has completed its investigation of the facts in this case. Specifically, the FPPC found that the campaign mailers that opposed Measure G failed to have the required sender language. Section 84504 requires any committee that supports or opposes a ballot measure shall print its name on all advertisements. Furthermore, Section 84507 requires the committee's name to be printed in 10 point font.

Your actions violated the Act because you failed to have the specified 10 point font size on your mailings. However, because the mailers included your committee name, address and city, and you do not have an enforcement history, we are closing this matter with a warning letter.

This letter serves as a written warning. The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on newly


discovered information or future conduct. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future will result in monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.

A warning letter is an FPPC case resolution without administrative prosecution or fine. However, the warning letter resolution does not provide you with the opportunity for a probable cause hearing or hearing before an Administrative Law Judge or the Fair Political Practices Commission. If you wish to avail yourself of these proceedings by requesting that your case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten (10) days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the FPPC will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of this case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the FPPC's website ten (10) days from the date of this letter.

The FPPC publishes forms and manuals to facilitate compliance with the provisions of the Act.
