RE: **Advisory Letter**

FPPC Case No. 100118; Korina Tabarez, Shanna Panella, and Concerned Parents and Citizens - CPAC

Dear Ms. Tabarez and Ms. Panella:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the Act).<sup>1</sup> We recently received a complaint against you and Concerned Parents and Citizens (CPAC), a copy of which is enclosed, alleging that you and CPAC have violated the campaign disclosure provisions of the Act.

Among other things, the Act imposes reporting requirements on organizations, called committees, formed to recall elected officeholders. The flyers submitted in the complaint expressly advocate the recall of two school board candidates, which means that, when payments made for the costs of such communications total \$1,000, CPAC will be required to register as a committee. The first filing required for a recipient committee is the Statement of Organization (Form 410), due within 10 days of receiving contributions totaling \$1,000. (Section 84101.) Funds expended to expressly advocate the recall of the officeholders are considered to be contributions to the committee. Because the contributions received and expenditures made are for the purpose of qualifying or supporting a potential recall, the committee will be required to file periodic campaign reports as a primarily formed ballot measure committee. (Section 82047.5.) The filing requirements for primarily formed ballot

measure committees are explained in detail in the FPPC Campaign Information Manual 3, which is available on our website.

After review of the complaint, we have decided to close this matter without commencing further investigation. The FPPC publishes forms and manuals to facilitate compliance with the Act.
