Dear Ms. Malec:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”)¹. As you may be aware, the Commission initiated an investigation into whether you may have violated certain provisions of the Act. Specifically, the investigation focused on whether a contribution to the Re-elect Supervisor Bill Horn 2010 committee was impermissibly made in the name of another person. The Commission has decided to close this case without further action.

On the Re-elect Supervisor Bill Horn 2010 committee’s semiannual campaign statement, covering July through December 2009, a \$500 contribution from Brett Malec, was reported as having been made on September 14, 2009. A news publication in San Diego County subsequently reported that Mr. Malec had denied ever having made a contribution to the committee.

In an investigative interview, Brett Malec stated that he made the contribution to the committee, that it was his signature on the check, and that he mailed the check to the committee.

As such, the Re-elect Supervisor Bill Horn 2010 committee properly attributed the contribution to Brett Malec in its campaign statements.
