Dear Mr. Curtis:

The Fair Political Practices Commission ("Commission") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act ("Act") found in Government Code section 81000, and following. This letter is in response to a referral from your filing officer that alleged you failed to file your Statements of Economic Interests. The Act requires that employees designated in their employer's conflict of interest code file Statements of Economic Interests (Form 700) when they assume office, annually thereafter, and within 30 days of leaving their position. We have decided to close this case.

The Enforcement Division of the Commission has determined that you failed to file an Assuming Office, a 2005 Annual, a 2006 Annual, and a Leaving Office Statement of Economic Interests with the City of Stockton for your position as a Committee Member with the Measure W Oversight Committee.

We have decided to close this case. Your failure to file the required statements is a violation of the Act. (Gov. Code § 87300.) This letter serves as a written warning. **The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on future conduct or newly discovered information.**

You must immediately file these statements with the City of Stockton.

Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future may result in an enforcement action against you, including monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.

Although the Enforcement Division is not seeking a penalty in the current matter, you are still responsible for any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer. (Gov. Code § 91013.)

A warning letter is a Commission case resolution without administrative prosecution or fine. However, the warning letter resolution does not provide you with the opportunity for a probable cause hearing or hearing before an Administrative Law Judge or the Fair Political Practices Commission. If you wish to avail yourself of these proceedings by requesting that your case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten (10) days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the Commission will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of this case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the Commission's website ten (10) days from the date of this letter.
