Warning Letter Re: FPPC Case No. 12/0195; Daniel Richards

Dear Mr. Richards:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "FPPC") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"),¹ found in Government Code section 81000, et seq. This letter is in response to a proactive investigation regarding whether or not you violated the Act's gift limits.

The FPPC has completed its investigation of the facts in this case. Specifically, the FPPC found that in January 2012 you received a gift in excess of the gift limits imposed by the Act in Government Code Section 89503.

The Act prohibits certain public officials from accepting gifts valued beyond the gift limit. (GC § 89503.) Specifically, the term "gift" is defined as "any payment that confers a personal benefit on the recipient, to the extent that consideration of equal or greater value is not received." (GC § 82028(a).) As Commissioner for the California Department of Fish and Game and President of the California Fish and Game Commission whose position is designated in your agency's conflict of interest code, you are prohibited from accepting gifts from hunting clubs, among other entities, in any calendar year with a total value of more than the gift limit. (GC § 89503(a).) The gift limit in 2012 is \$420. (Regulation 18940.2.) In January 2012, you received a gift of guided mountain lion hunting from Flying B Ranch in excess of the Act's gift limit. Within 30 days of receipt of a gift over the gift limit, you are able to pay the donor the difference

between the value of the gift and the gift limit to bring the value of the gift below the gift limit. (Regulation 18943.) In response to our inquiry regarding this gift, your attorney provided evidence to our staff that you had made a payment to the donor in the amount of the gift; however, this payment occurred past the 30 days.

Your actions violated the Act because you received a gift over the limit. However, because you did repay the donor relatively soon after receipt of the gift, although after the 30-day window for repayment prescribed by the Act, we have decided to close this case.

This letter serves as a written warning. The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on newly discovered information or future conduct. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future will result in monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.

A warning letter is an FPPC case resolution without administrative prosecution or fine. However, the warning letter resolution does not provide you with the opportunity for a probable cause hearing or hearing before an Administrative Law Judge or the Fair Political Practices Commission. If you wish to avail yourself of these proceedings by requesting that your case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten (10) days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the FPPC will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of this case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the FPPC's website ten (10) days from the date of this letter.
