**Warning Letter Re: FPPC File No. 10/112; Chabot Space and Science Center Foundation**

Dear Mr. Zwissler:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "FPPC") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"),<sup>1</sup> found in Government Code section 81000, et seq. This letter is as a result of a pro-active investigation begun against you by the FPPC that alleged that the Chabot Space and Science Center Foundation ("Foundation") failed to file major donor statements and may have made contributions to the Economic Stimulus of Oakland committee ("committee") by use of cashier's checks.

The FPPC has completed its investigation of the facts in this case. Specifically, the FPPC was provided evidence that the Foundation did in fact file its major donor statements with the City of Oakland. With regard to the use of cashier's checks to make contributions, the FPPC found that the Foundation made two contributions; one in the amount of \$15,000 and one in the amount of \$13,000, to the committee.

The Act provides that no contribution of one hundred dollars (\$100) or more shall be made or received in cash. (Section 84300(a).) The Commission has interpreted cash to include contributions by cashier's check or money order. (*Avila Advice Letter, No. I-99-006.*)

The regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission are contained in sections 18109 through 18997 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations. Your actions violated the Act because the Foundation made two separate contributions by cashier's check to the committee. However, since the cashier's checks contained both the name of the committee as the payee and the name of the Foundation, and both the Foundation and the committee reported the contributions on their respective campaign statements, the Commission is closing this matter.

This letter serves as a written warning. The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on newly discovered information or future conduct. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future will result in monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.

A warning letter is an FPPC case resolution without administrative prosecution or fine. However, the warning letter resolution does not provide you with the opportunity for a probable cause hearing or hearing before an Administrative Law Judge or the Fair Political Practices Commission. If you wish to avail yourself of these proceedings by requesting that your case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten (10) days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the FPPC will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of this case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the FPPC's website ten (10) days from the date of this letter.
