Re: **Warning Letter**  
**FPPC Nos. 14/497: Save Proposition 13 Newsletter; 14/499: California Public Safety; and 14/582: National Tax Limitation Committee; and James Lacy, Treasurer**

Dear Slate Mailer Organizations and Mr. Lacy:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the “FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”)<sup>1</sup> found in Government Code Section 81000, et seq. This letter is in response to a pro-active investigation begun against you by the FPPC for a violation of the Act’s slate mailer identification laws.

The FPPC has completed its investigation of the facts in this case. Specifically, the above listed slate mailer organizations produced and mailed slate mailers which supported a number of candidates listed on the June 3, 2014 Primary election ballot that failed to have the proper boldface type printed on the mailers.

Section 84305.5 requires a slate mailer organization to include certain disclosures in its mailers. Subdivision (a)(2) requires that at the top or bottom of the front side or surface of at least one insert or at the top or bottom of one side or surface of a postcard or other self-mailer, there is a notice in at least 8-point roman boldface type, which shall be in a color or print which contrasts with the background so as to be easily legible and in a printed or drawn box and set apart from any other printed matter.

While the mailer had the required notice language, it was not printed in roman boldface type. However, because the mailer contained all other requirements of Section 84305.5, we are closing this case with this warning letter.


The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on newly discovered information or future conduct. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future will result in monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.

A warning letter is an FPPC case resolution without administrative prosecution or fine. However, the warning letter resolution does not provide your client with the opportunity for a probable cause hearing or hearing before an Administrative Law Judge or the FPPC. If your client wishes to avail himself of these proceedings by requesting that his case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten (10) days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the FPPC will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of this case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the FPPC's website ten (10) days from the date of this letter.

The FPPC publishes forms and manuals to facilitate compliance with the provisions of the Act.
