Re: Advisory Letter

FPPC No. 12/401: Wallace Edgerton; Menifee Valley Committee to Elect Wallace W. Edgerton; and Judith Edgerton, Treasurer

Dear Mr. and Ms. Edgerton:

As you may know, the Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (the "FPPC") has received a complaint against you. After review of the complaint, the Enforcement Division has decided to close its file on this matter without initiating an enforcement action. The basis for this decision follows.

The FPPC enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"),¹ found in Government Code §810000, et seq. The Act requires candidates to first deposit their personal funds into your campaign bank account before they can be used for your re-election campaign. (Gov. Code §85201(d).)

By failing to deposit your personal funds into your campaign bank account before you made the expenditure supporting your re-election, you violated Gov. Code §85201 of the Act. However, we have determined that further enforcement action for your violation is not warranted because it was clear this was a mailing from your committee regarding your campaign for re-election, you produced a minimal amount and did not mass mail the literature, and you do not have an enforcement history. Nevertheless, although we have decided not to pursue an

enforcement action in this matter, you are advised that your failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future could result in an enforcement action. In addition, the information in this case will be retained and may be used against you should an enforcement action become necessary based on future conduct and/or newly discovered information.
