Re: Closure Letter
FPPC No. 13/1198; Olympia Chen and Chen for ABC School Board 2013

Dear Ms. Chen:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the “Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ As you are aware, the Commission received a sworn complaint alleging that you and your committee, Chen for ABC School Board 2013, violated the Act’s campaign reporting requirements by failing to report contributions your campaign for ABC Unified School District Board in the November 5, 2013, election received in the form of free advertisements in the Gateway Guardian Newspaper.

The Enforcement Division of the Commission has completed its investigation into the allegations. We found that your committee paid fair market value for the advertisement supporting your campaign published by the Gateway Guardian Newspaper on October 17, 2013. Because your committee paid fair market value for the advertisement, the advertisement did not qualify as a contribution to your campaign, and your committee was not required to report it as such. (Section 82015, subd. (a).) As required, your committee reported the advertisement as an expenditure made.

Based on these findings, we have concluded that you and your committee did not violate the Act as alleged in the sworn complaint. Accordingly, we are closing this case with this letter.
