**Warning Letter Re: FPPC No. 11/871, California Leadership PAC; David L. Gould,
Treasurer**

Dear Mr. Gould:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "FPPC") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"),¹ found in Government Code section 81000, et seq. The Act requires campaign committees to file campaign statements at periodic intervals. This letter is in response to a referral from the California Secretary of State that alleged that you and your committee, the California Leadership PAC, failed to timely file your semiannual campaign disclosure statements.

The FPPC has completed its investigation of the facts in this case. Specifically, the FPPC found that the California Leadership PAC failed to timely file a semiannual campaign statement for the period of January 1, 2011 through June 30, 2011 with the California Secretary of State.

Section 84200 of the Act provides that elected officers, candidates, and committees shall file semiannual campaign statements. In addition to the campaign statements required by Section 84200, elected officers, candidates, and committees shall file pre-election statements as specified in Section 84200.5 by the deadlines set down in Section 84200.7.

Your actions violated the Act because you failed to file the aforementioned campaign statement by the specified deadline. However, since the outstanding filing has since been submitted to the California Secretary of State after you were contacted by the FPPC, and you have filed a terminating Statement of Organization (Form 410) with the Secretary of State retroactively terminating your committee as of February 28, 2011, we are closing your case with this warning letter. The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on newly discovered information or future

conduct. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future will result in monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.

Although the FPPC is not seeking a penalty in the current matter, you are still required to immediately file any remaining outstanding statements with the California Secretary of State. You will be responsible for any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer. (§ 91013.)

A warning letter is an FPPC case resolution without administrative prosecution of fine. However, the warning letter resolution does not provide you with the opportunity for a probable cause hearing or hearing before an Administrative Law Judge or the Fair Political Practices Commission. If you wish to avail yourself of these proceedings by requesting that your case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten (10) days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the FPPC will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of this case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the FPPC's website ten (10) days from the date of this letter.
