Dear Mr. Knoblock:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act")¹. As you are aware, the Commission initiated an investigation into whether you violated the Act's conflicts of interest provisions specified in Government Code Section 84308 based on findings published in the Orange County Grand Jury Report-CalOptima.

After a full investigation, the Enforcement Division has found insufficient evidence to find a violation of the Act. Our investigation revealed that as a member of the member of the CalOptima Board of Directors, you are an officer of an agency under Section 84308. However, for Section 84308 to apply, the decisions must be in proceedings involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use pending before the agency, as defined by Section 84308 and its companion regulations. None of the decisions reviewed during our investigation were in proceedings involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use pending before the CalOptima board. Therefore, we have closed our file in this matter.
