Dear Mr. Yaroslavsky:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "FPPC") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"),¹ found in Government Code section 81000, et seq. This letter is in response to a sworn complaint filed against you that alleged you used campaign funds for a personal purpose. Specifically, the complaint alleged the campaign funds were used to purchase tickets to the Hollywood Bowl and UCLA football and basketball games in violation of Section 89513.

The FPPC has completed its investigation of the facts of this case. Specifically, the FPPC found that you routinely use such tickets to foster relationships with campaign and political supporters, or to host constituents, community leaders and other officials in an effort to advance public policy goals. Since the Act permits the use of campaign funds for purposes directly related to a legislative, governmental or political purpose, we found no violation of Section 89513.
