Warning Letter Re: FPPC No. 07/299, Chris Edgecomb

Dear Mr. Edgecomb:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "FPPC") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"),¹ found in Government Code section 81000, et seq. This letter is in response to a pro-active investigation begun against you by the FPPC that alleged you failed to timely file a late contribution report for a contribution you made to the Bill Brown for Sheriff 2006 campaign on or about October 21, 2006.

The FPPC has completed its investigation of the facts in this case. Specifically, the FPPC found that you failed to file a late contribution report for your October 21, 2006 contribution. However, we also determined that you were out of the country at the time the contribution was made, and the campaign treasurer for the Bill Brown for Sheriff 2006 campaign agreed to file the required Form 497 (Late Contribution Report) on your behalf but failed to do so. Additionally, we determined that you corrected this error once you became aware of it and the Bill Brown for Sheriff 2006 campaign filed its Form 497 for the receipt of the contribution in a timely manner.

The Act provides that failing to file a late contribution report for a contribution in excess of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more is prohibited. Specifically the Act provides that a "late

contribution" is defined as any contribution that totals in the aggregate one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more that is made to or received by a candidate before the date of the election at which the candidate is to be voted on but after the closing date of the last campaign statement required to be filed before the election.. (Government Code Section 82036) Each candidate or committee that makes or receives a late contribution shall report the late contribution within 24 hours. (Government Code Section 84203)

Your actions violated the Act because you failed to file a late contribution report for your contribution of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to the Bill Brown for Sheriff 2006 campaign which was made after the closing date of the last campaign statement required to be filed before the election but before the election itself. However, due to the mitigating circumstances previously identified, we have decided to close this case with a warning letter.

This letter serves as a written warning. The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on newly discovered information or future conduct. Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future will result in monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.

A warning letter is an FPPC case resolution without administrative prosecution or fine. However, the warning letter resolution does not provide you with the opportunity for a probable cause hearing or hearing before an Administrative Law Judge or the Fair Political Practices Commission. If you wish to avail yourself of these proceedings by requesting that your case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten (10) days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the FPPC will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of this case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the FPPC's website ten (10) days from the date of this letter.
