Warning Letter: Case No. 14/1202; Paige Gordon

Dear Mr. Gordon:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (Act)<sup>1</sup>. This letter is in response to a non-filer enforcement referral from the Complainant. The FPPC has completed its investigation and found that you failed to timely file a pre-election statement by the October 6, 2014 deadline.

Section 84200.5 provides that candidates and committees must file pre-election campaign statements. Your actions violated the Act because you failed to file the abovementioned statement by the specified deadline. However, since you do not have an enforcement history and you were unsuccessful in the election, we are closing your case with this warning letter. This information will be retained and may be considered should a future enforcement action become necessary.

Although the FPPC is closing its case at this time, you will be responsible for any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer. (§ 91013.)

A warning letter is an FPPC case resolution without administrative prosecution; however, this resolution does not provide you with the opportunity for a probable cause or administrative hearing. If you wish to avail yourself of these proceedings by requesting that your case proceed with prosecution rather than a warning, please notify us within ten days from the date of this letter. Upon this notification, the FPPC will rescind this warning letter and proceed with administrative prosecution of your case. If we do not receive such notification, this warning letter will be posted on the FPPC's website.
