Re: FPPC No. 11/002, Save Our City III, et al.

Dear Mr. Wolowicz:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "FPPC") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"),<sup>1</sup> found in Government Code section 81000, and following. This letter is in response to a referral from the Los Angeles County District Attorney's office, which received a complaint against you alleging violations of the Act's campaign reporting provisions.

After a full investigation, the Enforcement Division has determined that you did not violate the Act under the facts and circumstances of this case. In 2010, you properly made two contributions to Save Our City III with personal, not campaign, funds. Additionally, you recorded a "robocall" for Save Our City III, and the robocall clearly stated that it was paid for by Save Our City III. Additionally, it should be noted that your contributions and the expenditure for the robocall were disclosed in Save Our City III's campaign statements. Therefore, we have closed our file in this matter.
