Dear Mr. Ackerman:

The Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC") enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act")¹ found in Government Code section 81000, and following. The Enforcement Division of the FPPC received a complaint that your client Mr. Rodriguez, a Jurupa Unified School District Board Member, received pro-bono legal services and failed to disclose these services as a gift on his Statement of Economic Interest, in violation of Government Code section 87300. Additionally, the complaint alleged that the pro-bono legal services would have exceeded the gift limits, in violation of Government Code section 89503.

The Enforcement Division of the FPPC has completed the investigation into this case. Specifically, the investigation revealed that Mr. Rodriguez was not provided with pro-bono legal services. Therefore, we found no violation of the Act and have closed our file in this matter.
