**Re: Warning Letter
FPPC No. 090390; LeeAnn Grigsby-Puente**

Dear Ms. Grigsby-Puente:

The Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”) found in Government Code Section 81000, and following. The Act requires that candidates and committees file campaign statements at periodic intervals.

The Enforcement Division of the Commission has determined that you failed to file a semi-annual campaign statement for the period October 19, 2008 to December 31, 2008, which was due on February 2, 2009.

We have decided to close this case. Your failure to file the required campaign statement is a violation of the Act. (Gov. Code § 84200.) This letter serves as a written warning. The information in this matter will be retained and may be considered should an enforcement action become necessary based on future conduct or newly discovered information.

You must immediately file this campaign statement with the County of Glenn Elections Department.

You are obligated to continue filing campaign statements until you officially terminate your committee. Failure to do so is a violation of the Act. If your committee is no longer active, you may want to terminate your committee at this time as well. Please be advised that after every filing deadline, your local filing officer will refer all non-filers to the Enforcement Division. Any future failure to file your campaign statements will automatically be brought to our attention.

Failure to comply with the provisions of the Act in the future may result in an enforcement action against you, including monetary penalties of up to \$5,000 for each violation.


Although the Commission is not seeking a penalty in the current matter, you are still responsible for any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer. (Gov. Code § 91013.)
