Re: Reject McFadden and Democratic Party Stipulations and Require Staff To Interview Witnesses

Dear FPPC Commissioners,

The top aide to the Governor and the former top staffer to the former Assembly Speaker owned up to \$1 million dollars in the same oil and gas company that benefited financially when they used their posts to blunt tough regulation of fracking in the legislature.

What did the FPPC do about these serious allegations?

Fail to interview witnesses, ignore evidence of a pattern of conflict of interest indiscretions, and send a message that this type of conduct is okay in the future.

We ask that you closely examine the facts and reject the staff recommendations for the FPPC's May 25 agenda item No. 16/19635 (In the Matter of California Democratic Party and Katherine Moret), No. 15/124 In the Matter of Yes on Prop 30, and No. 16/263 (In the Matter of Nancy McFadden), which amount to slap-on-the-wrist fines. It is critical to the integrity of the enforcement process that the staff be directed to reopen these files and interview witnesses that they have refused to contact on these matters.

As our communications with the Commission attached show, Consumer Watchdog has repeatedly offered to connect enforcement staff with witnesses in these matters but was rebuffed. These are not trivial issues. California has no fracking ban, while the states of New York, Vermont, and Maryland do, because of the positions of Governor Brown and Assembly Speaker John Perez, decisions the subjects of our FPPC complaints influenced while holding in a company that benefited from them. These are not minor technical violations and the inability of FPPC staff to see the context and importance of these matters requires that you, as Commissioners, direct them to fully investigate the issues.

McFadden and Maviglio's Financial Conflicts & Fracking Advocacy

Nancy McFadden, the executive secretary to Governor Brown, and Steve Maviglio, former top communications deputy to Assembly Speaker Perez, both held significant shares in Linn Energy while fracking legislation was moving through the legislature.

Evidence suggests that they both used their posts to derail a fracking ban embodied in SB 4 fracking legislation introduced in 2012.

Linn Energy, an oil and gas developer with operations in several states, used cyclic steaming in more than 1,000 wells in California prior to its merger with Berry Petroleum, another oil and gas company specializing in the practice. Steam injection uses steam and chemicals in regular, repeated intervals to soak and break up rock in order to reach oil and gas beneath. SB 4 was amended to specifically exclude cyclic steam injection from its regulation, directly benefiting Linn. The analysis provided to the FPPC staff (see **Exhibit A**, emails titled "McFadden Test, April 20, 2016," and "Linn's Cyclic Steam Injection Wells, October 26, 2016"), shows the material benefit to McFadden and Maviglio of the decision to exempt Linn's wells from oversight.

Under a proposed fracking moratorium, amended out of the SB 4 legislation, idling more than 1,000 wells in California would have easily cost Linn at least \$300,000, which meets the conflict of interest threshold of having a material impact on Linn of \$300,000 or more. In addition, Linn was merging with Berry in 2013, as fracking legislation moved. Linn acquired Berry Petroleum and its more than 3,000 production wells in California that were ultimately spared regulation. This further bulked up the material benefit to Linn of the SB 4 amendments.

Despite the fact that we showed a decision by Ms. McFadden to influence SB 4 would have had a material impact on her holdings, the staff refused our offer to connect them with confidential witnesses who could confirm that she was involved in the legislation and its amendment. (See **Exhibit B**, email titled "Linn's Cyclic Steam Injection Wells.")

Ms. McFadden made her presence on that legislation known on the floor of the legislature, offering amendments to the bill on behalf of the governor, and in meetings attended by lobbyists.

Her holdings were particularly suspect because a good friend of hers, with whom she vacations, Steve Maviglio, was the top communications deputy for Assembly Speaker John Perez at the time (Perez opposed the moratorium), and also had holdings in Linn Energy. A complaint was lodged by Consumer Watchdog with the previous FPPC enforcement director Gary Winuk on this matter on August 8, 2012. (See **Exhibit C**, press release, "Consumer Watchdog Asks FPPC

To Review Whether Top Assembly Aide Maviglio Broke Law By Having Economic Interest In Decisions And Not Recusing Himself.")

This previous complaint was brought to the attention of the current Enforcement Director, who could find no official log of the complaint but received the email exchange with us, including a reply from Mr. Winuk who confirmed he was reviewing the matter. Winuk served with Maviglio in the Davis Administration. (See Exhibit D, email "Assembly Conflict").

In our correspondence with the FPPC at the time, we outlined that four top aides to Perez had significant financial holdings in fracking companies, including Maviglio, who was in a position to influence the Speaker. The Assembly killed key anti-fracking bills and even recalled one from the Senate in 2013 that had already passed.

The allegation that the top staffer for the Governor and a top staffer for the Assembly Speaker worked to exempt cyclic steam injection from fracking legislation, while holding substantial shares in a company that benefited greatly from that decision, should not be swept under the rug.

Ms. McFadden's work on this legislation on behalf of the Governor would have violated her public trust and Reg. 18700, which lays out the steps that must be confirmed to find that a public official has a financial conflict of interest. Under § 18703.1 the conflict is triggered if (a) The public official has a direct or indirect investment worth two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or more in the business entity. According to McFadden's amended filings, she has met this threshold. (See Exhibit E)

The FPPC should not condone the highest ranking appointee in the executive branch—expressly tasked with overseeing appointments, legislation, and policy—being involved in such public decisions affecting her portfolio. This is particularly true when that official would have been subject to investigation but for a five-year statute of limitations in a related issue.

Another of the initial complaint's allegations against Ms. McFadden was that she intervened in official decisions related to stock holdings in Pacific Gas & Electric. When McFadden began working for Governor Brown, she held up to \$1 million in PG&E stock, and in addition had been paid a \$1 million bonus by PG&E on her way out the door.

Strong evidence was conveyed to the FPPC that McFadden interfered in the appointment of a commissioner to the Public Utilities Commission on behalf of Pacific Gas & Electric lobbyist Brian Cherry. (See **Exhibit F**, emails "You can call her directly if you'd like" and "back door route") Emails released under the Public Records Act showed Cherry advising then-PUC President Michael Peevey (now under criminal investigation for an under-the-table deal with another major investor-owned utility involving billions of dollars) to feed names of pro-industry candidates for the Public Utilities Commission to Nancy McFadden.

One of the emails could not have been clearer. "Nancy asks if you have any names you would recommend," Cherry wrote Peevey in January 2011. "You can call her directly if you'd like." Elsewhere, Cherry had called McFadden "the back door route" in the Governor's office on whispering names of appointees into Governor Jerry Brown's ear. A pro-utility industry

investment banker was soon named to the PUC who helped steer decisions benefiting PG&E and other major investor-owned utilities.

When queried, enforcement staff informed us that the emails may have been strong enough to prompt an investigation but the acts took place five years ago, beyond the statute of limitations.

Viewed in the context of this troubling pattern, the recommended \$300 fine for McFadden's failure to disclose seven figure holdings looks like a whitewash. This is particularly true because McFadden concealed multiple financial assets for multiple years.

The fracking legislation interference is the type of case for which the FPPC exists, because no one else has the independence to pursue it. Whether the failure to proceed stemmed from political interference by the Brown Administration, or the belief that campaign finance laws couldn't sustain a prosecution, at minimum all witnesses should have been interviewed.

Affirming the proposed slap on the wrist in this matter would show that the commission is prone to take the path of least resistance and does not understand the import of the decisions affected by these abuses of power. The decision about whether the state allows fracking, and if so, whether it will be strictly regulated or not, has major public health implications for the people of California.

Democratic Party Contributions

In the case of the Democratic Party, and possible laundering of contributions to Governor Brown's 2014 re-election campaign of oil and other energy company donations, we offered staff new internal documents and a confidential witness, in addition to our report "Brown's Dirty Hands." Again, enforcement staff chose not to reach out to this individual witness. (See Exhibit G, email, "New info Brown Hands Report complaint.")

The allegations again involved Ms. McFadden, who worked for the Democratic party as a fundraising consultant while serving as the Governor's chief of staff and Appointments chief. One internal document (See **Exhibit H**, "Vacancy List") submitted as part of our complaint found the governor's staff emailing open appointment slots to the fundraising team from the staffer's personal email, suggesting appointments may have been for sale.

Among the additional documents submitted (See **Exhibit I**, "Schedule for three days in '13," and "SAVE THE DATE") were evidence that Democratic Party staff were raising money for Brown's 2014 re-election together with his wife Ann Gust Brown via visits to two dozen Sacramento lobbying shops. The lobbyists involved, who were named, should have been interviewed by the FPPC staff to see what was said and if earmarking of contributions was part of the pitch. The Commission should find out and disclose whether this interviewing of lobbyists occurred.

We also questioned why the Party would transfer massive funds to the Governor's race when his re-election was assured and there was a far more urgent need for funds in highly contested races. In addition, the timing of contributions made to the party, then transferred to the Governor's

committee, in close proximity to official acts helping the donors, raised big red flags. Again, these are critical issues for the people of the state. All witnesses should have been interviewed.

The staff should be directed to go back to the drawing board, interview all witnesses involved, and address the issues raised in this letter and the original complaints so that there is a full public airing of this matter. We appreciate your consideration of this request.

McFadden-Linn Conflicts Test

Reg. 18700 lays out the steps you have to confirm in order to find a financial conflict of interest. Nancy McFadden's investment in Linn Energy meets those criteria.

1) As an employee in the Governor's office, McFadden is a public official within the meaning of the Act - .

2) As the Governor's top advisor, and his representative to the legislature on energy and utility issues, McFadden directly "advises or makes recommendations to the decision maker." In this case, the legislature which passes the bill, and the Governor who can threaten a veto a bill, can both be considered the "decision maker." McFadden attempted to use that official position to influence a government decision - the outcome of SB 4. Sources in the building confirm McFadden was involved in amendments to SB 4.

3) McFadden's economic interest is the investment worth over\$2,000 that she held in Linn Energy throughout the time period SB4 was proposed and enacted.

4) Her economic interest in Linn is indirectly involved in the decision, because the business entity (Linn) did not initiate a proceeding and is not a named party to a proceeding.

5) Linn is listed on the NASDAQ exchange, so the materiality standard is: If the decision results in an impact of \$300,000 or more on Linn's gross revenue, assets or liabilities OR it will result in Linn incurring or reducing expenses by at least \$100,000.

SB 4, enacted in 2013, directly impacted Linn and the company it was buying at the time, Berry Petroleum, detailed more fully below. Briefly, SB 4 was amended so that fracking companies like Berry could continue operations with minimal disclosure or permitting (environmentalists opposed the final version as a result). The bill also initially put a moratorium on fracking until regulations were developed until a June amendment (The bill would-prohibit the supervisor or district deputy, as of January 1, 2015, from issuing a permit to commence a hydraulic fracturing treatment,)- Linn and Berry, which specialize in steam injection of oil wells, also got another huge boon when steam injection was exempted in an amendment from the legislation, so that no permitting or new regulation applied.

Following the Berry purchase, Linn today has 5,796 active wells in CA, according DOGGR, and 3,060 are tagged "Cyclic steam – injection." Amending the moratorium against fracking out of the legislation had a huge financial impact on the purchase of Berry, a fracker, by Linn, and the companies' profitability. Exempting steam wells from permitting and regulation also had huge economic impact for the company – at least millions of dollars, and likely tens of millions of dollars — due to elimination of new regulatory expenses on 3,000 wells. And the lessened regulatory and permitting burden in the final legislation on Linn and Berry's fracking operations also had significant financial benefits. These economic benefits easily to had to total tens of millions dollars if you consider a minimal per well cost of compliance, and likely far more. Considering the cost of a moratorium on fracking, had it passed, the economic benefits to Berry and Linn would easily total well over \$100 million.

6) It was reasonably forseeable that SB 4 would have this material

financial impact on McFadden's holdings in Linn because a multimillion dollar impact on Linn's (revenue or expenses) was substantially likely.

7) The financial effect is distinguishable from the effect on the public generally because SB 4 targeted a specific industry.

8) McFadden is not legally required to participate in legislative affairs, so the conflict of interest is disqualifying.

SB4, by Fran Pavley, was introduced on Dec. 3, 2012 in response to major concern over the pollution of the environment by fracking. The bill sought to regulate fracking via permitting of this radical well stimulation technique, monitoring of environmental effects, and public disclosure of fracking chemicals. The next iteration of the bill, amended in the Senate on March 11, 2013, included language pausing fracking until further studies of its environmental effects were complete: The bill would require the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency, on or before January 1, 2015, to cause to be conducted an independent scientific study on hydraulic fracturing treatments... The bill would prohibit the supervisor or district deputy, as of January 1, 2015, from issuing a permit to commence a hydraulic fracturing treatment, as specified, until the study is completed and peer reviewed by independent scientific experts.

Environmentalists were also concerned about the lack of regulation of acid stimulation for reasons of toxicity, and steam stimulation because it burns greenhouse gas emitting natural gas in generators to produce steam out of large quantities of water, which is a limited natural resource, to boil large quantities of water to produce boiling steam to inject to loosen up oil. That process also involves chemical additives and is often used in tandem with fracking.

Oil companies did not want the legislation to expand to include lucrative and long-standing cyclic steam and

steam flooding extraction techniques.

Berry Petroleum, practices steam flooding and cyclic steaming in hundreds of California oil fields and would have had a lot at stake if the legislation had regulated that method of extracting oil. Linn Energy was attracted to purchasing Berry because one of its major strategies is to find new ways of getting more oil out of existing fields, including through steam injection.

By May 24, 2013, Senate amendments specifically exempted steam injection from the bill. The language read:

3157.

"Cyclic steam injection" means the alternating injection of steam and production of oil with condensed steam from the same well or wells and is an enhanced oil recovery technique. Typical operations using this technique involve a cycle through a steam injection stage, followed by a steam soak stage, and then a production stage.

(3) (A) A hydraulic fracturing treatment that is applied to a well where cyclic steam injection is approved pursuant to Section 1724.8 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, and that is distinct from the process described under Section 3157, is subject to this section.

(B) A cyclic steam injection process as described in Section 3157 is not subject to this section.

By June 19, the Assembly had broadened the bill to include acid stimulation, in addition to fracking:

This bill would define, among other things, the terms *well stimulation treatment*, hydraulic fracturing, and hydraulic fracturing fluid. The bill would require the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency, on or before January 1, 2015, to cause to be conducted an independent scientific study on *well stimulation treatments, including acid well stimulation and* hydraulic fracturing treatments. The bill would require an operator of a well to record and include all data on-hydraulic fracturing *well stimulation* treatments, as specified.

By June 25, the Assembly had clarified the steam exclusion:

3157.

"Well-For purposes of this article, "well stimulation treatment" means-a any treatment-applied-to of a well-in order designed to enhance oil and gas production or recovery, including, but not limited to, hydraulic fracturing and acid well stimulation. Well stimulation treatments include, but are not limited to, hydraulic fracturing treatments and acid well stimulation treatments. Well stimulation treatments-are not underground-injection or disposal-projects that are approved under Sections-1724.6 to 1724.10, inclusive, of Title 14-of the California Code of Regulations. do not include steam flooding, water flooding, or cyclic steaming.

When the bill was chaptered September 20, the final language appeared as:

(b) Well stimulation treatments do not include steam flooding, water flooding, or cyclic steaming and do not include routine well cleanout work, routine well maintenance, routine removal of formation damage due to drilling, bottom hole pressure surveys, or routine activities that do not affect the integrity of the well or the formation.

Ultimately, the bill was weakened, allowing the withholding of public information about specific fracking chemicals, requiring simply the monitoring of all data on fracking and acid well simulation treatments, and requiring that permits be complete for approval. The legislation that passed was ultimately helpful to the oil industry by resulting in no real regulation of fracking or publicizing and banning of dangerous chemicals used in the process. And the legislation produced no regulation whatsoever of cyclic steam stimulation and steam flooding to loosen up hard to reach oil.

Santa Monica, CA -- Consumer Watchdog today asked the Fair Political Practices Commission to review whether top Assembly communications chief Steve Maviglio broke the law by having economic interests as a private consultant on legislation while influencing Assembly decisions about that legislation, and for holding stock in fracking companies while influencing anti-fracking legislation.

The nonprofit public interest group also asked whether two other top Assembly aides who held stock in fracking companies, while anti-fracking legislation stalled in the Assembly, should have recused themselves as well.

State law requires that legislative aides recuse themselves officially from governmental decisions in which they have an economic interest of over \$2,000. Maviglio, who works privately for lobbyist employers as a consultant while serving the Assembly, argues that he is simply "marketing" legislation, not influencing decisions, but the FPPC guidance applies to those who contribute to public decision making as well.



"In the age when polling and public opinion are often the most important influence on legislative decisions, it's outrageous to claim that the top communications officer in the Assembly doesn't influence the Speaker's decision making," said Jamie Court,

president of Consumer Watchdog. "The conflict of interest statutes require official recusal because the public deserves to know that aides' private pecuniary interests are not dictating public policy. It's not up to Maviglio to decide how much influence he has over a decision. His only duty is to follow the law and recuse himself from any decision that impacts his bank account."

Consumer Watchdog had previously asked the FPPC to review four top aides to Assembly Speaker John Perez who have significant financial holdings in fracking companies. Communications Chief Maviglio, who claims significant income from environmental consulting work, reported in his Statement of Economic Interests up to \$1 million in investments in Linn Energy, a fracking company, and soon to be parent of Berry Fracking, which has large California fracking interests. Maviglio contends he sold the stock shortly after taking office, but his Statement of Economic Interests form does not reflect this fact. Two other top Assembly aides have similar holdings – Katie Vavao, of the Speaker's Office of Member Services, and Linda Roper-Ayala of Rules Committee. Vavao holds stock in Exxon Mobil and PPL Corporation, both frackers, and Roper-Ayala has stock in Pacific Gas & Electric and Alliant Energy. Greg Campbell, the Assembly Speaker's Chief of Staff, held \$25,000 in Chevron stock but was on leave during the decision-making.

The anti-fracking legislation took mysterious and unprecedented turns in the Assembly before dying, including the recall back from the Senate of one bill that had already passed the Assembly. Environmentalists reported to Consumer Watchdog the odd course of the bills and conflicts among the aides.

Hi Gary,

Sorry, just got back from vacation. Here is the core of the complaint:

Four top aides to Assembly Speaker John Perez have significant financial holdings in fracking companies. The Assembly killed key antifracking bills this year and, in a highly unusual measure, recalled from the state Senate one that had already passed. Under state fair political practices rules, public officials, including legislative aides, are supposed to recuse themselves from official decisions if they have more than \$2,000 in economic interest in the decision.

Perez Communications Chief Steve Maviglio, who claims signifiant income from environmental consulting work, reports in his state of economic interest filings up to \$1 million in investments in the Linn Energy, a fracking company, and soon to be parent of Berry Fracking, which has large California fracking interest. Chief of Staff Campbell owns only one stock -- \$25K in Chevron, which would have been hurt by the antifracking effort. Two other top aides similarly have holdings --Vavao #2 in political shop. In charge of liaison pol to members, and Roper # 2 in Rules.

A timeline is below. The question is whether Maviglio, Campbell, Vavao and Roper recused themselves on the bills.

Here's the FPPC reference and our understanding: The FPPC says \$2,000 of economic interest is the threshold for triggering a conflict of interest. You don't need a vote on the issue, you just need to be in a position to advise a decision maker on the issue at hand. If a conflict exists you are supposed to announce and document it, and leave the room. Did mavig with up to \$1 million in interest at stake announce his potential conflict and leave the room? The decision to allow frakcing had a direct effect on the value of his Linn stock. And Campbell, Vavao, or Roper? All had \$2,000 or more and their stock values were effected by fracking bills outcome. Here is the FPPC Page.

Galena,

In response to the FPPC's investigation into allegations in our report Brown's Dirty Hands, I am writing to supply new evidence that we have obtained.

Internal documents from the California Democratic Party have surfaced that provide additional grounds for investigation.

Exhibit A is a document obtained from an insider in the California Democratic Party that shows that the 2014 fundraising campaign by the Governor took Governor Brown's wife, Ann Gust Brown, or "AGB" as she is referred to here, to all the top lobbying firms in Sacramento to ask for funds. She was accompanied by California Democratic Party CFO Angie Tate.

Obviously, many of these firms' clients contributed to the Governor's re-election campaign and the Party. The list provides you with witnesses who heard the fundraising pitch from Ms. Gust Brown and Tate.

Rex Frazier, who is on the list, told the Los Angeles Times at the time about a visit. "They outlined the governor's upcoming reelection campaign and the need for resources," said Frazier, who oversees three lobbyists. (<u>http://www.latimes.com/local/politics/la-me-pol-brown-money-20141031-story.html</u>)

Given the rivalries among firms, and experiences since then with the Administration, it is very likely that some of these lobbyists will be very candid in what was discussed and whether the pitch for Party funds, as Frazier suggests in the Times article, was implicitly or explicitly earmarked for the Governor's race. The evidence of who attended these meetings provides a long list of potential witnesses in a case.

The theory we have heard about this Democratic Party operation run by Ms. Tate is that Governor Brown was too stingy to create his own fundraising operation so he took over the Democratic Party's for his own purposes.

The presence of the First Lady of California at lobbying firms is certainly a message that the Governor's interests were preeminent in these meetings. Her presence, of course, speaks an implicit threat, as well, that the fate of the firm's clients was at stake.

Remember Governor Brown faced no real opposition in the 2014 election.

Why would the Democratic Party then transfer massive funds to the Governor's race, given the far more urgent need for funds in highly contested races, if there was no prior agreement that the funds were to be earmarked? It defies rational logic.

The mixing of Administration and Party officials in this Democratic fundraising effort also raises troubling questions about whether Gubernatorial actions were being leveraged in exchange for contributions.

Huestis emails a list of open Cubernatorial Appointments to het private email, then emails the list Exhibit B, another internal Democratic Party document, confirms this impression.

The document is a printout of an email exchange between Tate and the private email of Brown's Assistant Appointments Secretary Sonia Huestis. Huestis emails a list of open Gubernatorial Appointments to her private email, then emails the list from her private email to Tate at the Democratic Party.

The email exchange, clearly meant to keep the email to Tate from being produced as part of a Public Records Act request, is evidence that Tate may have been putting a "for sale" sign on Gubernatorial Appointments and using them in her fundraising pitches.

The unseemly mixing of official gubernatorial business with Party fundraising machinery meant that Brown's Cabinet Secretary Dana Williamson (and former PG&E staffer) was on the payroll for the Democratic Party during 2013 and 2014. Nancy Fadden didn't join the Party payroll until June 2015, but subsequently made \$104,000. McFadden was pictured at Democratic Party headquarters during the reelection campaign. With these interests so intertwined the type of influence peddling the email exchange suggests becomes a very likely reality.

This is particularly true in the context of the 'Dirty Hands' report's revelation about the synchronicity of key contributions to the party from companies who won significant benefits from the Administration.

Exhibit C is further evidence of the leveraging of Brown Administration officials' positions in their fundraising roles and of Brown's actions for contributions.

The Exhibit is an invitation to a post-election Brown For Reelection fundraiser in the Capitol hosted by a lobbying firm, but obtained through the Democratic Party.

The Governor had a massive surplus of funds given his lack of opposition in the election, yet it was continuing its fundraising weeks after the election for his reelection account. This appears to violate the prohibition that reelection committees can only fundraise to retire debt post-election (Gov. Code Sec. 85316)

§85316. Post-Election Fundraising Restrictions; State Officeholder Accounts.(a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), a contribution for an election may be accepted by a candidate for elective state office after the date of the election only to the extent that the contribution does not exceed net debts outstanding from the election, and the contribution does not otherwise exceed the applicable

contribution limit for that election.

(b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), an elected state officer may accept contributions after the date of the election for the purpose of paying expenses associated with holding the office provided that the contributions are not expended for any contribution to any state or local committee. Contributions received pursuant to this subdivision shall be deposited into a bank account established solely for the purposes specified in this subdivision.

The invitation states the funds are for Brown's Re-election committee and does not mention the Democratic party. It seeks \$5,000 contributions. However, Brown's re-election committee does not report any contributions after the day of the election, in accordance with Gov. Code Se. 85316.

What's interesting is that the Democratic Party does report many contributions in the amount of \$5,000 multiples following the election (Exhibit D). It would appear, if the event occurred, that contributions were funneled to the Democratic Party, which would show the mixing of Party and reelection funds that appears to have occurred throughout the period.

AEG, for example, donated two \$10,000 contributions on 11/5 (election 11/4). It's mentioned in the Dirty Hands report. Cooperative of American Physicians gave \$50,000, right after Brown stayed out of the Prop 46 campaign that threatened the malpractice insurance companies' interests with a patient safety campaign. California State Law Enforcement Association gave \$75,000 on the day after the event.

There are also many Brown re-elect contributors who have given contributions to the party in the final days before the election, in multiples of \$5,000, possibly for the event, and who had already maxed out their contributions to Brown. (Exhibit E). These entities could obviously explain whether they attended the event or gave in connection with it, showing once again the fungible money associated with these efforts. There are also contributors to Brown's re-election campaign on election day in multiples of \$5,000, possibly for this event, who had not maxed out until that time. (Exhibit F)

In addition, the post-election re-election event proves the principal purpose of the fundraising by the Governor was not his election, as he would face no more reelections, but the wielding of his influence to raise money for his political purposes, ballot measures, through his re-election committee, and to build a war chest at his disposal rather than the party's (for ballot measures etc).

Internal evidence from the Party suggests the fact that the LA Times reporters who wrote the October 31, 2014 story, "Once A Crusader Against Big Money, Brown Is Raising Millions," called about the November 17th post-election reelection event was deeply troubling to Ms. Tate. (We can discuss this further it helpful.)

Tate, as you may know, while CFO of the Party, received payments from Brown's Re-election Committee.

Tate was paid \$97,500 since 2013 by Brown for Governor.

Tate was paid \$50,000 on December 18, 2015 from "Brown For Governor 2014". It says it is for "2015 consulting"

Tate was paid \$22,500 on December 17, 2014 from Brown for Governor 2014". For "Campaign consultants"

Tate was paid \$25,000 on December 22, 2013 from "Brown for Governor 2014". This one says just "Bonus."

Lawyers for the Party may suggest that the Governor appropriately accounted for this share of fundraising costs through the hiring of Tate. Likewise, they might state that the hiring of Williamson by the party accounted for its costs.

However, the mixing of official business and government officials with this fundraising effort, the timing of official acts with the receipt of contributions to the Party, the post-election re-election event, and the inexplicable transfer of Party funds to a Governor who didn't the need the money suggest foul play. This is true with regard to both the earmarking of funds that were undisclosed and violated campaign committee limits, as well the potentially illegal trading of official positions for campaign funds.


