The response may should contain a 14 summary of law and evidence that supports a finding that the probable cause report fails to 15 establish probable cause that any or all of the alleged violations of the Act occurred. evidence, 16 legal arguments, and any mitigating or exculpatory information. 6	for each alleged violation of the Act. This is not a right to all evidence in the Enforcement
7	Division file. The Enforcement Division will provide copies of the requested documents upon
8	payment of a fee for direct costs of duplication or provide electronically without cost. The
9	Enforcement Division shall provide such evidence by electronic mail or U.S. mail to all
10	respondents, with a copy to the Commission Assistant. A respondent may submit a written
11	response to the probable cause report described in subsection (1) no later than 21 calendar days
12	after the evidence is sent. The Enforcement Division is not required to produce any confidential
13	or otherwise protected information. The evidence produced by the Enforcement Division
14	pursuant to this subdivision shall be considered the final production at the Probable Cause level
15	and is not appealable.
16	(3) The Commission staff may submit any evidence or argument in rebuttal to the

Representatives of any 6 civil or criminal prosecutor with jurisdiction may attend the conference at the discretion of the 7 hearing officer if they agree to respect the confidential nature of the proceedings. A finding of probable cause by the hearing officer does not constitute a 21 finding that a violation has actually occurred. The hearing officer shall not make a finding of 22 probable cause if he or she is presented with clear and convincing evidence that, at least 21 23 working days prior to the alleged violation, the respondent requested written advice from the

1 Commission staff pursuant to Section 83114(b), a time prior to the alleged violation, the violator 2 consulted with the staff of the Commission in good faith, disclosed truthfully all the material 3 facts, and committed the acts complained of either in reliance on formal the advice of the 4 Commission staff or because of the Commission staff's failure to provide advice. If the hearing 5 officer makes a finding of probable cause, then the Enforcement Division shall prepare an 6 Accusation pursuant to Section 11503 and have it served upon the person or persons who are 7 subjects of the probable cause finding. The hearing officer shall publicly announce the finding of 8 probable cause. The announcement shall contain a summary of the allegations and a cautionary 9 statement that the respondent is presumed to be innocent of any violation of the Act unless a 10 violation is proved in a subsequent proceeding. The Chief of the Enforcement Division shall be 11 responsible for the presentation of the case in support of the Accusation at an administrative 12 hearing held pursuant to Section 83116.
