Bite: Shortest possible information

Snack:

Summary, with enough information for an experienced voters



Meal:

Full details or instructions for voters learning or refreshing their knowledge

Progressive disclosure of ad information

What people most want to know

Minimal and unintrusive

Inviting exploration and discovery









Getting it right takes listening
