Re: Order Granting Exemption From Conflict of Interest Code Requirement Our File No. E-25-001

Dear Amy Frusetta,

This letter is in response to your July 31, 2025, request on behalf of the Fresno County Self Insurance Group ("FCSIG"), a public risk sharing pool established pursuant to a Joint Powers Agreement for the purpose of self-funding workers compensation, for an exemption from the requirement to file a conflict-of-interest code pursuant to Government Code Section 87300.¹

FCSIG satisfies the Fair Political Practices Commission's ("Commission") governing regulation criteria, and the exemption request is granted. (Regulation 18751(d).). Regulation 18751(d) states an agency that does not have a "designated employee" within the meaning of Government Code Section 82019 may be exempt from the adoption of a conflict-of-interest code required under Section 87300. A "designated employee" does not include any public official specified in Section 87200. (Section 82019(b)(1).) All positions within FCSIG are Section 87200 filers, therefore FCSIG has no designated employees.

Please note that interested parties may submit a request for the Commission to reconsider this approval within 30 days after the exemption approval is posted on the Commission's website. The Commission Chair will consider the request, and if, at the Chair's discretion, good cause exists for reconsideration, the Chair will schedule the matter for a hearing before the Commission. (Regulation 18751(f).)

Upon being issued, an exemption remains in effect until the basis for the grant of exemption no longer exists or the expiration of two years, whichever occurs earlier. FCSIG must submit an extension request if it wishes to continue the exemption. (Regulation 18751(g).)

The regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission are contained in Sections 18104 through 18998 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations. All regulatory references are to Title 2, Division 6 of the California Code of Regulations, unless otherwise indicated.
