The following are enforcement decisions approved by the Fair Political Practices Commission at its regular monthly meeting held on Thursday, April 16, 2015. Decisions are listed by category and include a brief summary of each case and the total amount of any administrative fine or fines in each case.

Campaign Reporting

Salud O. Carbajal, Salud Carbajal for Supervisor 2012, and David Peri, Treasurer - This matter arose out of an audit performed by the Political Reform Audit Program of the Franchise Tax Board. Salud O. Carbajal, and his candidate controlled committee, Salud Carbajal for Supervisor 2012 ("Committee"), failed to file three late contribution reports. In addition, Carbajal, the Committee, and its treasurer, David Peri, accepted a contribution in the form of a cashier's check in the amount of \$15,000 not drawn on the account of the donor. \$7,500 fine.

San Mateo County Democratic Central Committee and Xavier Martinez - This matter arose from an audit performed by the Political Reform Audit Program of the Franchise Tax Board. In 2012, the San Mateo County Democratic Central Committee and its former treasurer, Xavier Martinez, failed to file pre-election campaign statements for the reporting periods of January 1 through March 17 and March 18 through May 19 by the due dates of March 22 and May 24, respectively. \$2,500 fine.

Steven A. Pappas, Steve Pappas for 3rd District Supervisor 2012, and Trent J. Benedetti - This matter arose out of an audit performed by the Political Reform Audit Program of the Franchise Tax Board. Steve Pappas, his candidate-controlled committee, Steve Pappas for 3rd District Supervisor 2012, and its treasurer, Trent J. Benedetti, failed to maintain detailed accounts, records, bills, and receipts that were necessary to prepare campaign statements for the reporting periods January 1, 2009 through June 30, 2012, in violation of Government Code Section 84104 (1 count). **\$1,500 fine.**

Preserve Liberty and Mark Matta, Treasurer - Preserve Liberty and Mark Matta, as treasurer, failed to timely file the semi-annual statement, Form 461, covering the period January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014, due July 31, 2014, with the Office of the Secretary of State. **\$200 fine.**

Major Donor Reporting

Sean Fieler - failed to timely file one Major Donor Committee Campaign Statement (Form 461) for the period January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013, due on January 31, 2014. **\$2,400 fine.**

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
