4. A Statement to Respondent; and,

5. Copies of Sections 11506, 11507.5, 11507.6 and 11507.7 of the Government Code.

Government Code section 11506 provides that failure of a respondent to file a Notice of Defense within fifteen days after being served with an Accusation shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing on the merits of the Accusation. The Statement to Respondent, served on the Committee and Bertani stated that a Notice of Defense must be filed in order to request a hearing. The Committee and Bertani failed to file a Notice of Defense within fifteen days of being served with an Accusation. Government Code Section 11520 provides that, if the respondent fails to file a Notice of Defense, the Commission may take action, by way of a default, based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence, and that affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to the respondent.

The Committee and Bertani violated the Political Reform Act as described in Exhibit 1, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein. Exhibit 1 is a true and accurate summary of the law and evidence in this matter. This Default Decision and Order is submitted to the Commission to obtain a final disposition of this matter.

INTRODUCTION

Respondent Pam Bertani for Solano County Supervisor 2014 ("Committee") is a candidate-controlled committee for Pam Bertani ("Bertani"). Bertani was a successful candidate for Solano County Board of Supervisors in the June 3, 2014 Primary Election but lost the November 4, 2014 General Election. Bertani has been a member of the Fairfield City Council since 2011.

The Political Reform Act ("Act")¹ requires candidate-controlled committees to disclose all contributions received and expenditures made during the period covered by the campaign statement as well as the occupation and employer of contributors of \$100 or more. The Act also requires candidate-controlled committees to file 24-Hour Contribution Reports for contributions of \$1,000 or more received during the 90 days preceding an election.

This matter arose out of an informal complaint filed with the Fair Political Practices Commission's ("Commission") Enforcement Division alleging that the Committee and Bertani violated the Act's campaign reporting provisions.

As a controlled committee and its candidate, the Committee and Bertani had a duty to timely disclose contributions received and expenditures made during the reporting period as well as specific information about any contributor of \$100 or more. The Committee and Bertani also had a duty to timely file 24-Hour Contribution Reports. The Committee and Bertani failed to timely disclose contributions, expenditures, and contributor information on two pre-election and one semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting periods of January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014. The Committee and Bertani also failed to timely file three 24-Hour Contribution Reports for contributions received on April 24, 2014, May 5, 2014, and October 28, 2014.

DEFAULT PROCEEDINGS UNDER THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT

When the Commission determines that there is probable cause for believing that the Act has been violated, it may hold a hearing to determine if a violation has occurred.² Notice of the hearing, and the hearing itself, must be conducted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act (the "APA").³ A hearing to determine whether the Act has been violated is initiated by the

filing of an accusation, which shall be a concise written statement of the charges, specifying the statutes and rules which the respondent is alleged to have violated.⁴

Included among the rights afforded a respondent under the APA, is the right to file the Notice of Defense with the Commission within 15 days after service of the accusation, by which the respondent may (1) request a hearing; (2) object to the accusation on the ground it does not state acts or omissions upon which the agency may proceed; (3) object to the form of the accusation on the ground that it is so indefinite or certain that the respondent cannot identify the transaction or prepare a defense; (4) admit the accusation in whole or in part; (5) present new matter by way of a defense; or (6) object to the accusation on the ground that, under the circumstances, compliance with a Commission regulation would result in a material violation of another department's regulation affecting substantive rights.⁵

The APA provides that a respondent's failure to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service of an accusation constitutes a waiver of the respondent's right to a hearing. Moreover, when a respondent fails to file a Notice of Defense, the Commission may take action based on the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to the respondent.

PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS AND HISTORY

A. <u>Initiation of the Administrative Action</u>

The service of the probable cause hearing notice, as required by Section 83115.5, upon the person alleged to have violated starts the administrative action.⁸

A finding of probable cause may not be made by the Commission unless the person alleged to have violated the Act is 1) notified of the violation by service of process or registered mail with return receipt requested; 2) provided with a summary of the evidence; and 3) informed of his or her right to be present in person and represented by counsel at any proceeding of the Commission held for the purpose of considering whether probable cause exists for believing the person violated the Act. Additionally, the required notice to the alleged violator shall be deemed made on the date of service, the date the registered mail receipt is signed, or if the registered mail receipt is not signed, the date returned by the post office. On the commission of the registered mail receipt is not signed, the date returned by the post office.

No administrative action pursuant to Chapter 3 of the Act alleging a violation of any of the provisions of Act may be commenced more than five years after the date on which the violation occurred.¹¹

Documents supporting the procedural history are included in the attached Certification of Records ("Certification") filed herewith at Exhibit 1, A-1 through A-16, and incorporated herein by reference.

In accordance with Sections 83115.5 and 91000.5, the Enforcement Division initiated the administrative action against the Committee and Bertani in this matter by serving them with a Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause (the "Report") (Certification, Exhibit A-1) by certified mail, return receipt requested, ¹² on March 15, 2017. (Certification, Exhibit A-2.) The administrative action commenced on March 31, 2017, the date the certified mail receipt was signed (Certification, Exhibit A-2), and the five-year statute of limitations was effectively tolled on this date.

As required by Section 83115.5, the packet served on the Committee and Bertani contained a cover letter and a memorandum describing probable cause proceedings, advising that the Committee and Bertani had 21 days in which to request a probable cause conference and/or to file a written response to the Report. (Certification, Exhibit A-3.)

The Committee and Bertani requested discovery of the evidence in possession of the Enforcement Division on April 21, 2017. The discovery was sent via email and certified mail on May 23, 2017, and received via certified mail on May 27, 2017. The Committee and Bertani did not respond to the discovery.

B. Ex Parte Request for a Finding of Probable Cause

Because the Committee and Bertani failed to request a probable cause conference or submit a written response by the statutory deadline, the Enforcement Division submitted an Ex Parte Request for a Finding of Probable Cause and an Order that an Accusation Be Prepared and Served to the Hearing Officer of the Commission on July 25, 2017. (Certification, Exhibit A-4.)

On August 2, 2017, Hearing Officer Brian Lau, Senior Commission Counsel, Legal Division, issued a Finding of Probable Cause and an Order to Prepare and Serve an Accusation on the Committee and Bertani. (Certification, Exhibit A-5.)

C. The Issuance and Service of the Accusation

Under the Act, if the Hearing Officer makes a finding of probable cause, the Enforcement Division must prepare an accusation pursuant to Section 11503 of the APA, and have it served on the persons who are the subject of the probable cause finding.¹³

Section 11503 states:

A hearing to determine whether a right, authority, license, or privilege should be revoked, suspended, limited, or conditioned shall be initiated by filing an accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force. The accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force shall be a written statement of charges that shall set forth in ordinary and concise language the acts or omissions with which the respondent is charged, to the end that the respondent will be able to prepare his or her defense. It shall specify the statutes and rules that the respondent is alleged to have violated, but shall not consist merely of charges phrased in the language of those statutes and rules. The accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force shall be verified unless made by a public officer acting in his or her official capacity or by an employee of the agency before which the proceeding is to be held. The verification may be on information and belief.

Upon the filing of the accusation, the agency must 1) serve a copy thereof on the respondent as provided in Section 11505, subdivision (c); 2) include a post card or other form entitled Notice of Defense that, when signed by or on behalf of the respondent and returned to the agency, will acknowledge service of the accusation and constitute a notice of defense under Section 11506; 3) include (i) a statement that respondent may request a hearing by filing a notice of defense as provided in Section 11506 within 15 days after service upon the respondent of the accusation, and that failure to do so will constitute a waiver of the respondent's right to a hearing, and (ii) copies of Sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7.14 The APA also sets forth the language required in the accompanying statement to the respondent.15

The Accusation and accompanying information may be sent to the respondent by any means selected by the agency, but no order adversely affecting the rights of the respondent may be made by the agency in any case unless the respondent has been served personally or by registered mail as set forth in the APA. ¹⁶

On September 11, 2017, the Commission's Chief of Enforcement, Galena West, issued an Accusation against the Committee and Bertani. (Certification, Exhibit A-6.) In accordance with Section 11505, the Accusation and accompanying information, consisting of a Statement to Respondent, two copies of a Notice of Defense Form for each respondent, copies of Government

Code Sections 11506, 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7, were served upon the Committee and Bertani on September 16, 2017. (Certification, Exhibit A-7.)

Along with the Accusation, the Enforcement Division served the Committee and Bertani with a "Statement to Respondent," which notified them that they could request a hearing on the merits and warned that, unless a Notice of Defense was filed within 15 days of service of the Accusation, they would be deemed to have waived the right to a hearing. (Certification, Exhibit A-8.) The Committee and Bertani did not file a Notice of Defense within the statutory time period, which ended on October 2, 2017.

As a result, on October 30, 2017, the Enforcement Division sent a letter to the Committee and Bertani advising that this matter would be submitted for a Default Decision and Order at the Commission's public meeting scheduled for November 16, 2017. (Certification, Exhibit A-16.) A copy of the Default Decision and Order, and this accompanying Exhibit 1 with attachments, was included with the letter

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

The Act and its regulations are amended from time to time. The violations in this case occurred in 2014. For this reason, all legal references and discussions of law pertain to the Act's provisions as they existed at that time.

An express purpose of the Act is to ensure voters are fully informed and improper practices are inhibited by requiring all candidates, as well as the committees that support or oppose them, to disclose all contributions and expenditures made throughout a campaign.¹⁷ In furtherance of this purpose, the Act requires candidate-controlled committees to file campaign statements at specific times disclosing information regarding contributions received and expenditures made.¹⁸

Controlled committees must file semi-annual campaign statements twice per year and preelection campaign statements during election years. ¹⁹ A campaign statement must accurately account for the committee's total contributions received and expenditures made during the relevant period. ²⁰ A campaign statement must also disclose the occupation and employer of contributors of \$100 or more. ²¹

During the 90 days prior to an election, the Act requires controlled committees to file a 24-Hour Contribution Report within 24 hours of receiving a contribution of \$1,000 or more, or within 48 hours of receiving a non-monetary contribution worth \$1,000 or more.

SUMMARY OF THE EVIDENCE

The Committee qualified as a committee on or about October 7, 2013, when it filed a Statement of Organization with the Secretary of State. Bertani was a successful candidate for the Solano County Board of Supervisors in the June 3, 2014 Primary Election but lost the November 4, 2014 General Election. Bertani has been a member of the Fairfield City Council since 2011.

This case was initiated in 2014 after an informal complaint alleged that the Committee and Bertani failed to timely report monetary and non-monetary contributions from the Service Employees International Union Local 1021 Candidate PAC ("SEIU") and failed to report occupation and employer information for multiple contributors.

On March 24, 2014, the Committee filed the first pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2014 through March 17, 2014. On this campaign statement, the Committee failed to disclose 8 out of 16 contributors required occupations and 11 out of 14 contributors required employers. (Certification, Exhibit A-9.) On October 23, 2014, the Committee filed an amended campaign statement for that pre-election period, which included all of the required occupation and employer information for contributors. (Certification, Exhibit A-10.)

On May 22, 2014, the Committee filed the second pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of March 18, 2014 through May 17, 2014. On this campaign statement, the Committee disclosed \$26,814.00 in contributions received and \$29,749.00 in expenditures made. The Committee failed to disclose 26 out of 27 contributors required occupations and all contributors required employers. (Certification, Exhibit A-11.)

On October 23, 2014, the Committee filed an amended campaign statement for the second pre-election period and reported \$39,766.75 in contributions received and \$43,073.39 in expenditures made. All of the required occupation and employer information for contributors was disclosed. (Certification, Exhibit A-12.) The amendment showed that the Committee failed to timely disclose \$12,952.75 in contributions and \$13,324.39 in expenditures. Overall, 32 percent of the Committee's contributions and 30 percent of the Committee's expenditures during the second pre-election campaign statement period were unreported until four months after the June election.

On July 31, 2014, the Committee filed a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of May 18, 2014 through June 30, 2014. On this campaign statement, the Committee disclosed \$31,754.73 in contributions received and \$47,235.84 in expenditures made. The Committee failed to disclose 3 out of 7 contributors required occupations and all contributors required employers. (Certification, Exhibit A-13.)

On October 23, 2014, the Committee filed an amended campaign statement for that semi-annual period and reported \$49,663.19 in contributions received and \$64,499.74 in expenditures made. All of the required occupation and employer information for contributors was disclosed. (Certification, Exhibit A-14.) The amendment showed that the Committee failed to timely disclose

\$17,908.46 in contributions and \$17,263.90 in expenditures. Overall, 36 percent of the Committee's contributions and 26 percent of the Committee's expenditures during the semi-annual campaign statement period were unreported until almost three months after the campaign statement deadline.

The 90 day late contributions reporting period prior to the June 3, 2014 Primary Election was between March 5, 2014 and June 2, 2014, and prior to the November 4, 2014 General Election was between August 6, 2014 and November 3, 2014. The Committee failed to timely file 24-Hour Contribution Reports for the following non-monetary contributions from the SEIU: a \$2,488.00 received on April 24, 2014; a \$2,592.40 received on May 5, 2014; and a \$7,741.61 received on October 28, 2014. The Committee was informed of these non-monetary contributions in letters sent on April 25, 2017, May 9, 2014, and October 29, 2014. (Certification, Exhibit A-15.) The non-monetary contributions that were never reported on 24-Hour Contribution Reports totaled \$12,822.01. All of these contributions were reported on the Committee's campaign statements, but the contribution of \$7,741.61 was not disclosed until after the election to which it related.

On September 14, 2016, October 4, 2016, and January 4, 2017, the Enforcement Division sent the Committee and Bertani three settlement offers. The Enforcement Division also contacted the Committee and Bertani via email and phone at least seventeen times regarding the settlement. At various points, the Committee and Bertani engaged in the process but ultimately failed to complete the terms of the settlement offers.

Summary of Contact

Overall, the Committee and Bertani were contacted at least twenty-six times regarding the case, including at least seventeen times regarding the possible settlement.

VIOLATIONS

The Committee and Bertani committed six violations of the Act, as follows:

COUNT 1

Failure to Timely Disclose Contributor Information on a Pre-election Campaign Statement

The Committee and Bertani had a duty to disclose contributor information on the preelection campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2014 through March 17, 2014 by March 24, 2014. By failing to timely disclose contributor information on this campaign statement, the Committee and Bertani violated Government Code Section 84211, subdivision (f).

COUNT 2

Failure to Timely Disclose Contributions, Expenditures, and Contributor Information on a Pre-election Campaign Statement

The Committee and Bertani had a duty to disclose contributions received, expenditures made, and contributor information on the pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period of March 18, 2014 through May 17, 2014 by May 22, 2014. By failing to timely disclose contributions received, expenditures made, and contributor information on this campaign statement, the Committee and Bertani violated Government Code Section 84211, subdivisions (a)-(f).

COUNT 3

Failure to Timely Disclose Contributions, Expenditures, and Contributor Information on a Semi-Annual Campaign Statement

The Committee and Bertani had a duty to disclose contributions received, expenditures made, and contributor information on the semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of May 18, 2014 through June 30, 2014 by July 31, 2014. By failing to timely disclose contributions received, expenditures made, and contributor information on this campaign

statement, the Committee and Bertani violated Government Code Section 84211, subdivisions (a)-(f).

COUNT 4

Failure to Timely File a 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Bertani had a duty to file a 24-Hour Contribution Report within 48 hours of receiving a non-monetary contribution from the SEIU which was made on April 24, 2014. By failing to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report for this non-monetary contribution, the Committee and Bertani violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

COUNT 5

Failure to Timely File a 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Bertani had a duty to file a 24-Hour Contribution Report within 48 hours of receiving a non-monetary contribution from the SEIU which was made on May 5, 2014. By failing to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report for this non-monetary contribution, the Committee and Bertani violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

COUNT 6

Failure to Timely File a 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Bertani had a duty to file a 24-Hour Contribution Report within 48 hours of receiving a non-monetary contribution from the SEIU which was made on October 28, 2014. By failing to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report for this non-monetary contribution, the Committee and Bertani violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

CONCLUSION

This matter consists of six counts of violating the Act, which carry a maximum total administrative penalty of \$30,000.²²

In determining the appropriate penalty for a particular violation of the Act, the Enforcement Division considers the typical treatment of a violation in the overall statutory scheme of the Act, with an emphasis on serving the purposes and intent of the Act. Additionally, the Enforcement Division considers the facts and circumstances of the violation in the context of the following factors set forth in Regulation 18361.5 subdivision (d)(1) through (6): (1)The seriousness of the violation; (2) The presence or absence of any intention to conceal, deceive or mislead; (3) Whether the violation was deliberate, negligent or inadvertent; (4) Whether the violator demonstrated good

faith by consulting the Commission staff or any other governmental agency in a manner not constituting complete defense under Government Code section 83114(b); (5) Whether the violation was isolated or part of a pattern and whether the violator has a prior record of violations of the Political Reform Act or similar laws; and (6) Whether the violator, upon learning of a reporting violation, voluntarily filed amendments to provide full disclosure.

In this matter, the Committee and Bertani failed to timely disclose contributions, expenditures, and contributor information on two pre-election and one semi-annual campaign statement. The Committee and Bertani also failed to timely file three 24-Hour Contribution Reports.

The public harm in this case is the public was deprived of full and time-sensitive information regarding the sources and amounts of campaign activity. The Committee and Bertani filed amended campaign statements and disclosed the required contributor information as well as previously unreported contributions and expenditures; however, disclosure did not occur until after the June 3, 2014 Primary Election. The non-monetary contributions that were never reported on 24-Hour Contribution Reports were disclosed on the Committee's campaign statements, but one of the contributions was disclosed after the November 4, 2014 General Election.

Bertani was an unsuccessful candidate for Solano County Board of Supervisors; however; she is currently a member of the Fairfield City Council and has been since 2011. The Committee and Bertani have no prior history of violating the Act.

The Enforcement Division also takes into consideration previous cases that were approved by the Commission in determining penalties. In this matter, the following cases were used as guidelines:

Counts 1-3

• In the Matter of Sonny Dhaliwal, Sonny Dhaliwal for City Council 2010, and Sarbjit Dhaliwal, FPPC No. 12/806. (The Commission approved a default decision on June 19, 2014.) Sonny Dhaliwal was elected to the Lathrop City Council in 2006 and re-elected in 2010. In 2012, he was elected Mayor of Lathrop. The respondents, among other violations, failed to timely report contributions received on two pre-election and two semi-annual campaign statements, totaling \$4,600. The contributions were disclosed on amended campaign statements filed almost three years after the election. Although the contributions that were not disclosed over multiple campaign periods was relatively small, the Enforcement Division sought a higher fine since these contributions were deposited into a personal bank account as opposed to the committee bank account. The Commission imposed a penalty of \$4,000 per count for each campaign statement.

In Count 1, the Committee and Bertani failed to report 50% of required occupations and 79% of required employers. During this period, the Committee received approximately \$25,429 in contributions and made \$9,826 in expenditures. The Committee properly disclosed the amounts

received and expenditures made, with only minor inaccuracies, and were not charged with any other disclosure violations during this period.

In Count 2, the Committee and Bertani failed to report 96% of required occupations and 100% of required employers. During this period, the Committee received approximately \$39,766 in contributions and made \$43,073 in expenditures. Of these amounts, the Committee underreported \$12,952 in contributions received and \$13,324 in expenditures made, which were not disclosed until four months after the June election.

In Count 3, the Committee and Bertani failed to report 43% of required occupations and 100% of required employers. During this period, the Committee received approximately \$49,663 in contributions and made \$64,499 in expenditures. Of these amounts, the Committee underreported approximately \$17,917 in contributions and \$17,263 in expenditures, which were not reported until almost three months after the campaign statement deadline.

Since Count 1 only failed to report occupation and employer information as opposed to Counts 2 and 3 that failed to disclose occupation employer information along with contributions received and expenditures made during the relevant reporting periods, Enforcement recommends a lower penalty of \$3,000 for Count 1 and \$4,000, consistent with the prior case, for Counts 2 and 3.

Counts 4-6

• In the Matter of Angel Santiago, Friends of Angel Santiago for Inland Empire Utilities Agency Director Division 4, and Valerie Santiago, FPPC No. 13/547. (The Commission approved a default decision on December 17, 2015.) Angel Santiago was a member of the Inland Empire Utilities Agency Board of Directors in 2002-2013. The respondents, among other violations, failed to timely file four 24-Hour Contribution Reports. The contributions that were never reported on 24-Hour Contribution Reports, included contributions in the amounts of \$1,500, \$5,000, \$1,000 and \$3,000 that were disclosed on campaign statements filed three years after the election. The Commission imposed a penalty of \$4,000 per count for the unfiled 24-Hour Contribution Reports.

In the current case the effect of the non-filing was mitigated by the fact that all but one of the non-monetary contributions were reported on other statements before the relevant election whereas in the prior comparable case the contributions were not disclosed until three years after the election. Even though the undisclosed contributions are relatively similar between the comparable case and the current case, the contributor, SEIU, timely filed 24-Hour Reports as well as, Bertani and the Committee disclosed multiple other contributions timely from SEIU. As a result, the public harm was lessened. Enforcement recommends a lower penalty of \$2,500 for Counts 4-6.

PROPOSED PENALTY

After considering the factors of Regulation 18361.5 and the penalties imposed in prior
cases, a penalty of \$3,000 for Count 1, \$4,000 for Counts 2 and 3, and \$2,500 for Counts 4-6, for
a total penalty of \$18,500, is recommended.

Reports for contributions of \$1,000 or more received during the 90 days preceding an election. The Committee violated the Act by failing to timely disclose contributions and contributor information on its campaign statements and failing to timely file five 24-Hour Contribution Reports.

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

All legal references and discussions of law pertain to the Act's provisions as they existed in 2014. Jurisdiction

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") has administrative jurisdiction to enforce the provisions of the Act.²

Probable Cause Proceedings

Prior to the Enforcement Division commencing an administrative action, the General Counsel of the Commission or her designee (the "hearing officer"), must make a finding that there is probable cause to believe the respondent has violated the Act.³ After a finding of probable cause, the Commission may hold a noticed hearing in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act⁴ to determine whether violations occurred, and levy an administrative penalty of up to \$5,000 for each violation.⁵

Standard for Finding Probable Cause

To make a finding of probable cause, the hearing officer must be presented with sufficient evidence to lead a person of ordinary caution and prudence to believe, or entertain a strong suspicion, that a respondent committed or caused a violation.⁶

Need for Liberal Construction and Vigorous Enforcement of the Political Reform Act

When enacting the Political Reform Act, the people of the state of California found and declared that previous laws regulating political practices suffered from inadequate enforcement by state and local authorities.⁷ To that end, the Act must be liberally construed to achieve its purposes.⁸

There are many purposes of the Act. One purpose is to ensure voters are fully informed and improper practices are inhibited by requiring all committees that support or oppose ballot measures to timely disclose all contributions and expenditures made throughout a campaign.9 Another is to provide adequate enforcement mechanisms so that the Act will be "vigorously enforced." 10

Campaign Statements

The Act requires a committee to file semi-annual campaign statements twice per year and preelection campaign statements during election years. 11 A campaign statement must accurately account for the committee's total contributions received and expenditures made during the relevant period. 12 A statement must also disclose the occupation and employer of contributors of \$100 or more. 13

24-Hour Contribution Reports

During the 90 days prior to an election, the Act requires a Committee to file a 24-Hour Contribution Report within 24 hours of receiving a contribution of \$1,000 or more, or within 48 hours of receiving a non-monetary contribution worth \$1,000 or more. 14

Liability for Violations

Any person who violates any provision of the Act, who purposely or negligently causes any other person to violate any provision of the Act, or who aids and abets any other person in the violation of any provision of the Act, is liable for administrative penalties up to \$5,000 per violation. 15 This only applies to persons who have filing or reporting obligations under the Act, or who are compensated for services involving the planning, organizing or directing of any activity regulated or required by the Act. 16

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SUMMARY OF THE EVIDENCE

The Committee qualified as a candidate-controlled committee on or about October 7, 2013, when it filed a Statement of Organization with the Secretary of State. Bertani was a successful candidate for the Solano County Board of Supervisors in the June 3, 2014 primary, but lost the November 4, 2014 general election. She is currently a member of the Fairfield City Council.

This case was initiated in 2014 after an informal complaint alleged that the Committee and Bertani failed to timely report monetary and non-monetary contributions from the Service Employees International Union Local 1021 Candidate PAC (SEIU), and failed to report occupation and employer information for multiple contributors.

June 2014 Primary Pre-Election Campaign Statements

On the Committee's first pre-election campaign statement for January 1, 2014 through March 17, 2014, only 8 out of 16 contributors' required occupations and 3 out of 14 contributors' required employers were disclosed. The Committee filed an amended statement for that pre-election period on October 23, 2014, which included all of the required occupation and employer information for contributors.

The Committee's second pre-election campaign statement for March 18, 2014 through May 17, 2014 disclosed \$26,814.00 in contributions received and \$29,749.00 in expenditures made. Out of 27 contributions that required the contributor's occupation to be disclosed, only 1 occupation was disclosed. The statement did not disclose any of the required employer information for contributors.

An amended statement filed on October 23, 2014 for the second pre-election period reported \$39,766.75 in contributions received and \$43,073.39 in expenditures made. At that time, all of the required occupation and employer information for contributors was disclosed. But, this amendment showed that \$12,952.75 in contributions and \$13,324.39 in expenditures were not timely disclosed. Overall, 32 percent of the Committee's contributions and 30 percent of the Committee's expenditures during the second preelection campaign statement period were unreported until four months after the June election.

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First Semi-Annual Campaign Statement

The Committee reported receiving \$31,754.73 in contributions and making \$47,235.84 in expenditures on its semi-annual campaign statement for May 18, 2014 through June 30, 2014. Contributors' occupations were disclosed for just four of the seven contributors of \$100 or more and no employer information for those contributors was disclosed.

On an amended statement for May 18, 2014 through June 30, 2014, which was filed October 23, 2014, the Committee reported receiving contributions totaling \$49,663.19 and making expenditures totaling \$64,499.74. The amendment disclosed all of the required occupation and employer information for contributors, and showed that the Committee failed to timely report \$17,917.46 in contributions and \$17,263.90 in expenditures. Thus, 36 percent of contributions received and 26 percent of expenditures made during the semi-annual campaign statement period were not reported until almost three months after the statement deadline.

24-Hour Contribution Reports

During Bertani's campaign for the Solano County Board of Supervisors, the Committee failed to file 24-Hour Contribution Reports for the following non-monetary contributions from the SEIU: a \$2,488.00 contribution on April 24, 2014; a \$2,592.40 contribution on May 5, 2014; a \$6,747.81 contribution on May 21, 2014; a \$7,352.60 contribution on May 22, 2014, and a \$7,741.61 contribution on October 29, 2014.

The non-monetary contributions that were never reported on 24-Hour Contribution Reports totaled \$29,922.42. All of these contributions were reported on the Committee's campaign statements, but three of the five were not disclosed until after the election to which they related.

VIOLATIONS

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

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") is proceeding with an administrative action against you for your failure to comply with the filing and disclosure provisions of the Political Reform Act (the "Act"), as described in our previous correspondence dated September 14, 2016, October 4, 2016, and January 4, 2017. The enclosed Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause (the "Report") contains a summary of the alleged violations and the relevant law and evidence.

You have the right to file a written response to the Report. That response may contain any information you think is relevant and that you wish to bring to the attention of the Hearing Officer. In your response, please indicate whether you would like the Hearing Officer to make a determination of probable cause based on the written materials alone (the Report and your response) or request a conference, during which you may orally present your case to the Hearing Officer. Probable cause conferences are held in our office, which is located at 428 J Street, Ste. 620, Sacramento, CA 95814. You may appear at the conference in person or by telephone and you are entitled to be represented by counsel. If you wish to submit a written response or request a probable cause conference, it must be filed with the Commission Assistant at the address listed above within 21 days from the date of service of this letter. You can reach the Commission Assistant at (916) 327-8269.

Please note that probable cause conferences are not settlement conferences. The sole purpose of a probable cause conference is to determine whether there is probable cause to believe that the Act was violated. However, settlement discussions are encouraged by the Commission and may take place at any time except during a probable cause conference. If you are interested in reaching a settlement in this matter, please contact me at (916) 322-7771 or akelly@fppc.ca.gov.

Finally, you have the right to request discovery of the evidence in possession of, and relied upon by, the Enforcement Division. This request must also be filed with the Commission Assistant within 21 days from the date of service of this letter. Should you request discovery, the Enforcement Division will provide the evidence by service of process or certified mail. From the date you are served with the evidence, you would have an additional 21 days to file a written response to the Report, just as described above.

Should you take no action within 21 days from the date of service of this letter, your rights to respond and to request a conference are automatically waived and the Enforcement Division will independently pursue the issuance of an accusation.

For your convenience, I have enclosed a fact sheet on probable cause proceedings and copies of the most relevant statutes and regulations.

PROBABLE CAUSE FACT SHEET

INTRODUCTION

The Fair Political Practices Commission is required by law to determine whether probable cause exists to believe that the Political Reform 'Act (the "Act") was violated before a public administrative accusation may be issued.

The probable cause proceedings before the Fair Political Practices Commission are unique, and most respondents and their attorneys are unfamiliar with them. Therefore, we have prepared this summary to acquaint you with the process.

THE LAW

Government Code sections 83115.5 and 83116 set forth the basic requirement that a finding of probable cause be made in a "private" proceeding before a public accusation is issued and a public hearing conducted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

The Commission has promulgated regulations further defining the probable cause procedure and delegating to the General Counsel (the "Hearing Officer" for purposes of these proceedings) the authority to preside over such proceedings and decide probable cause. A copy of these statutes and regulations are attached for your convenience.

In summary, the statutes and regulations entitle you to the following:

- a) A written probable cause report containing a summary of the law alleged to have been violated, and a summary of the evidence, including any exculpatory and mitigating information and any other relevant material and arguments;
- b) The opportunity to request discovery, respond in writing, and to request a probable cause conference within 21 days of service of the probable cause report;
- c) If the Commission met to consider whether a civil lawsuit should be filed in this matter, a copy of any staff memoranda submitted to the Commission and a transcript of staff discussions with the Commission at any such meeting; and
- d) If a timely request was made, a non-public conference with the General Counsel and the Enforcement Division staff to consider whether or not probable cause exists to believe the Act was violated.

THE PROCEDURE

Probable Cause Report

Administrative enforcement proceedings are commenced with the service, by registered or certified mail or in person, of a probable cause report. The report will contain a summary of the law and the evidence, including any exculpatory and mitigating information of which the staff has knowledge and any other relevant material and arguments. It is filed with the Hearing Officer.

Discovery

Within 21 calendar days following the service of the probable cause report, you may request discovery of the evidence in the possession of the Enforcement Division. This is not a right to full discovery of the Enforcement Division file, but to the evidence relied upon by the Division along with any exculpatory or mitigating evidence¹.

This request must be sent by registered or certified mail to the Commission Assistant.

Response to Probable Cause Report

Within 21 calendar days following the service of the probable cause report (or, if you timely requested discovery, within 21 calendar days from the service of the evidence) you may submit a response to the Report. By regulation, the written response may contain, "... a summary of evidence, legal arguments, and any mitigating or exculpatory information." (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § 18361.4, subd. (c).)

You must file your response with the Commission Assistant and provide a copy, by service of process or registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, to all other proposed respondents listed in the probable cause report.

Staff Reply

Within 10 calendar days following the date the response was filed with the Commission Assistant, Commission staff may submit any evidence or argument in rebuttal. You will be served with a copy of any such reply.

Probable Cause Conference

Probable cause conferences are held at the offices of the Fair Political Practices Commission, which is located at 428 J Street, Ste. 620, Sacramento, CA 95814. You may appear at the conference in person or by telephone. The proceedings are not public unless all proposed respondents agree to open the conference to the public. Otherwise, the probable cause report, any written responses, and the probable cause conference itself are confidential.

Unless the probable cause conference is public, the only persons who may attend are the staff of the Commission, any proposed respondent and his or her attorney or representative, and, at the discretion of the Hearing Officer, witnesses.

The Hearing Officer may, but need not, permit testimony from witnesses. Probable cause conferences are less formal than court proceedings. The rules of evidence do not apply. The conferences will be recorded and a copy of the recording will be provided upon request.

Since it has the burden of proof, the Enforcement Division is permitted to open and close the conference presentations. The Hearing Officer may also hold the record open to receive additional evidence or arguments.

Probable cause conferences are not settlement conferences. The sole purpose of a probable cause conference is to determine whether or not there is probable cause to believe that the

Political Reform Act was violated. Anyone who wishes to discuss settlement with the Enforcement Division may do so before or after the probable cause conference but not during the conference.

Pursuant to Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18361.4, subdivision (e), the Hearing Officer will find probable cause "if the evidence is sufficient to lead a person of ordinary caution and prudence to believe or entertain a strong suspicion that a proposed respondent committed or caused a violation."

Ordinarily, probable cause determinations are made based upon the written probable cause report, any written response by the respondent, any written reply by the Enforcement Division, and the oral arguments presented at the conference. Timely written presentations are strongly recommended.

Probable Cause Order and Accusation

Once the matter is submitted to the Hearing Officer, the probable cause decision will normally be made within ten days. If the Hearing Officer finds probable cause, he will issue a Finding of Probable Cause, which will be publicly announced at the next Commission Meeting. An accusation will be issued soon after the Finding of Probable Cause is publicly announced.

Continuances

Every reasonable effort is made to accommodate the schedules of parties and counsel. However, once a date has been set it is assumed to be firm and will not be continued except upon the order of the Hearing Officer after a showing of good cause. Settlement negotiations will be considered good cause only if the Hearing Officer is presented with a fully executed settlement, or is convinced that settlement is imminent.

Settlements

Settlement discussions may take place at any time except during the probable cause conference. In order to open settlement discussions, a proposed respondent or his or her counsel or representative should present a written offer to settle stating, where appropriate, the violations to be admitted, and the monetary penalty or other remedy to be tendered.

The Enforcement Division attorney assigned to the case will negotiate any potential settlement on behalf of the Fair Political Practices Commission, and will draft the language of the settlement agreement. The Hearing Officer will not directly participate in the negotiations, but will be represented by Enforcement Division attorneys. Staff attorneys will present settlement offers to the Hearing Officer for his/her approval.

CONCLUSION

This fact sheet was intended to give you a brief summary of the probable cause process at the Fair Political Practices Commission. Such a summary cannot answer every question that might arise in such proceedings. Therefore, if you have any questions that are not addressed by this fact sheet or the copies of the law and regulations we have attached, feel free to contact the attorney whose name appears on the probable cause report.

CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE

Probable Cause Statutes

§ 83115.5. Probable cause; violation of title; notice of violation; summary of evidence; notice of rights; private proceedings

No finding of probable cause to believe this title has been violated shall be made by the commission unless, at least 21 days prior to the commission's consideration of the alleged violation, the person alleged to have violated this title is notified of the violation by service of process or registered mail with return receipt requested, provided with a summary of the evidence, and informed of his right to be present in person and represented by counsel at any proceeding of the commission held for the purpose of considering whether probable cause exists for believing the person violated this title. Notice to the alleged violator shall be deemed made on the date of service, the date the registered mail receipt is signed, or if the registered mail receipt is not signed, the date returned by the post office. A proceeding held for the purpose of considering probable cause shall be private unless the alleged violator files with the commission a written request that the proceeding be public.

§ 83116. Violation of title; probable cause; hearing; order

When the Commission determines there is probable cause for believing this title has been violated, it may hold a hearing to determine if a violation has occurred. Notice shall be given and the hearing conducted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500), Part 1, Division 3, Title 2, Government Code). The Commission shall have all the powers granted by that chapter. When the Commission determines on the basis of the hearing that a violation has occurred, it shall issue an order that may require the violator to do all or any of the following:

- (a) Cease and desist violation of this title.
- (b) File any reports, statements, or other documents or information required by this title.
- (c) Pay a monetary penalty of up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per violation to the General Fund of the state. When the Commission determines that no violation has occurred, it shall publish a declaration so stating.

REGULATIONS OF THE FAIR POLITICAL PRACTICES COMMISSION TITLE 2, DIVISION 6 OF THE CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS

Probable Cause Regulations

§ 18361 (b). Delegation by the Executive Director Pertaining to Enforcement Proceedings and Authority to Hear Probable Cause Proceedings.

Probable cause proceedings under Regulation 18361.4 shall be heard by the General Counsel or an attorney from the Legal Division. The General Counsel may delegate the authority to hear probable cause proceedings, in writing, to an administrative law judge.

§ 18361.4. Probable Cause Proceedings

- (a) <u>Probable Cause Report</u>. If the Chief of the Enforcement Division decides to commence probable cause proceedings pursuant to Sections 83115.5 and 83116, he or she shall direct the Enforcement Division staff to prepare a written report, hereafter referred to as "the probable cause report." The probable cause report shall contain a summary of the law and evidence gathered in connection with the investigation, including any exculpatory and mitigating information of which the staff has knowledge and any other relevant material and arguments. The evidence recited in the probable cause report may include hearsay, including declarations of investigators or others relating the statements of witnesses or concerning the examination of physical evidence.
- (b) No probable cause hearing will take place until at least 21 calendar days after the Enforcement Division staff provides the following, by service of process or registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, to all proposed respondents:
 - (1) A copy of the probable cause report;
 - (2) Notification that the proposed respondents have the right to respond in writing to the probable cause report and to request a probable cause conference at which the proposed respondent may be present in person and represented by counsel, and;
 - (3) If the Commission met in executive session on this matter pursuant to Regulation 18361.2, a copy of any staff memoranda submitted to the Commission at that time along with the recording of any discussion between the Commission and the staff at the executive session as required in subdivision (b) of Regulation 18361.2.

(c) Response to Probable Cause Report.

- (1) Each proposed respondent may submit a written response to the probable cause report. The response may contain a summary of evidence, legal arguments, and any mitigating or exculpatory information. A proposed respondent who submits a response must file it with the Commission Assistant who will forward the response to the General Counsel or an attorney in the Legal Division (the "hearing officer") and provide a copy, by service of process or registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, to all other proposed respondents listed in the probable cause report not later than 21 days following service of the probable cause report.
- (2) Within 21 calendar days following the service of the probable cause report, a proposed

respondent may request discovery of evidence in the possession of the Enforcement Division. This request must be sent by registered or certified mail to the Commission Assistant. Upon receipt of the request, the Enforcement Division shall provide discovery of evidence relied upon by the Enforcement Division sufficient to lead a person of ordinary caution and prudence to believe or entertain a strong suspicion that a proposed respondent committed or caused a violation, along with any exculpatory or mitigating evidence. This is not a right to full discovery of the Enforcement Division file. The Enforcement Division shall provide access to documents for copying by the Respondent, or upon agreement among the parties, the Enforcement Division will provide copies of the requested documents upon payment of a fee for direct costs of duplication. The Enforcement Division shall provide such evidence by service of process or registered or certified mail with return receipt requested to all respondents, with a copy to the Commission Assistant. A respondent may submit a written response to the probable cause report described in subsection (1) no later than 21 calendar days after service of discovery.

- (3) The Commission staff may submit any evidence or argument in rebuttal to the response. When the Commission staff submits evidence or argument in rebuttal to the response, it shall provide a copy, by service of process or registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, to all proposed respondents listed in the probable cause report not later than 10 calendar days following the date the response was filed with the Commission Assistant. The hearing officer may extend the time limitations in this section for good cause. At any time prior to a determination of probable cause, the hearing officer may allow additional material to be submitted as part of the initial response or rebuttal.
- (d) Probable Cause Conference. Any proposed respondent may request a probable cause conference. The request shall be served upon the Commission Assistant and all other proposed respondents not later than 21 days after service of the probable cause report unless the hearing officer extends the time for good cause. The Commission Assistant shall fix a time for the probable cause conference and the hearing officer shall conduct the conference informally. The conference shall be closed to the public unless a proposed respondent requests and all other proposed respondents agree to a public conference. If the conference is not public, only members of the Commission staff, any proposed respondent and his or her legal counsel or representative shall have the right to be present and participate. The hearing officer may allow witnesses to attend and participate in part or all of the probable cause conference. In making this determination, the hearing officer shall consider the relevancy of the witness' proposed testimony, whether the witness has a substantial interest in the proceedings, and whether fairness requires that the witness be allowed to participate. Representatives of any civil or criminal prosecutor with jurisdiction may attend the conference at the discretion of the hearing officer if they agree to respect the confidential nature of the proceedings. If the conference is not open to the public and none of the parties and the presiding officer object, the conference may be conducted in whole or in part by telephone. The probable cause conference shall be recorded. The hearing officer may determine whether there is probable cause based solely on the probable cause report, any responses or rebuttals filed and any arguments presented at the probable cause conference by the interested parties. If the hearing officer requires additional information before determining whether there is probable cause, he or she may permit any party to submit additional evidence at the probable cause conference.

(e) Finding of Probable Cause. The hearing officer may find there is probable cause to believe a violation has occurred if the evidence is sufficient to lead a person of ordinary caution and prudence to believe or entertain a strong suspicion that a proposed respondent committed or caused a violation. A finding of probable cause by the hearing officer does not constitute a finding that a violation has actually occurred. The hearing officer shall not make a finding of probable cause if he or she is presented with clear and convincing evidence that, at a time prior to the alleged violation, the violator consulted with the staff of the Commission in good faith, disclosed truthfully all the material facts, and committed the acts complained of either in reliance on the advice of the staff or because of the staff's failure to provide advice. If the hearing officer makes a finding of probable cause, the Enforcement Division shall prepare an Accusation pursuant to Section 11503 and have it served upon the person or persons who are subjects of the probable cause finding. The hearing officer shall publicly announce the finding of probable cause. The announcement shall contain a summary of the allegations and a cautionary statement that the respondent is presumed to be innocent of any violation of the Act unless a violation is proved in a subsequent proceeding. The Chief of the Enforcement Division shall be responsible for the presentation of the case in support of the Accusation at an administrative hearing held pursuant to Section 83116.

§ 18362. Access to Complaint Files

- (a) Access to complaints, responses thereto, and investigative files and information shall be granted in accordance with the requirements of the Public Records Act (Government Code Section 6250, et seq.).
- (b) When release of material is requested pursuant to subdivision (a), the Executive Director, or his or her designee, shall review the material prior to its release or prior to a claim of exemption to determine that the requirements of the Public Records Act have been satisfied.
- (c) Any person requesting copies of material pursuant to subdivision (a) shall reimburse the Commission \$0.10 per page for each page copied or supply copying equipment and make copies in the offices of the Commission. Documents may not be removed from the offices of the Commission. If the request is for copies totaling ten pages or less, the copies shall be provided without charge for copying since the administrative costs do not warrant collection of \$1.00 or less. If the request is for copies totaling more than ten pages, reimbursements of copying costs shall include the cost for the first ten pages. Charges imposed pursuant to this subdivision are for the purpose of recovering the cost of copying.
- (d) Requests for access and copies pursuant to subdivision (a) shall be made in writing and shall specifically identify the documents sought.

§ 18361.2. Memorandum Respecting Civil Litigation.

(a) If the Executive Director concludes civil litigation should be initiated, he or she shall submit to the Commission a written memorandum, which shall be first reviewed by the General Counsel, or an attorney from the Legal Division, summarizing the facts and the applicable law of the case and recommending the initiation of a lawsuit. The memorandum shall include all exculpatory and mitigating information known to the staff.

- (b) The Commission shall review the memorandum at an executive session. The General Counsel, or an attorney from the Legal Division, and the Commission Assistant shall be in attendance. No other member of the staff may be present unless the Commission meets with a member of the staff for that person to answer questions. The Commission may not resume its deliberations until the person is no longer present. Any communication between the Commission and the person during the executive session shall be recorded. After review of the memorandum, the Commission may direct the Executive Director to do any of the following:
 - (1) Initiate civil litigation.
 - (2) Decide whether probable cause proceedings should be commenced pursuant to 2 Cal. Code of Regulations Section 18361.4.
 - (3) Return the matter to the staff for further investigation.
 - (4) Take no further action on the matter or take any other action it deems appropriate.
- (c) If the Commission decides to initiate civil litigation, the Commission may then permit other members of the staff to attend the executive session.
- (d) If the Executive Director deems it necessary, he or she may call a special meeting of the Commission to review a staff memorandum recommending the initiation of civil litigation.
- (e) It is the intent of the Commission in adopting this section to preserve for the members of the Commission the authority to decide whether alleged violations should be adjudicated in administrative hearings or in civil litigation, while at the same time avoiding the possibility that discussions with members of the staff might cause members of the Commission to prejudge a case that might be heard by the Commission under Government Code Section 83116.

EX PARTE REQUEST FOR A FINDING OF PROBABLE CAUSE AND AN ORDER RE: ACCUSATION

In the cover letter dated March 15, 2017, and the attached materials, Bertani and the Committee were advised that they could respond in writing to the Report, and orally present the case to the Hearing Officer at a probable cause conference to be held in Sacramento. Bertani and the Committee were further advised that in order to have a probable cause conference, they needed to make a written request for one, on or before 21 days of the date they received the Report. Bertani and the Committee were advised that within the 21 days of the date they received the report, they could request Discovery. Further, Bertani and the Committee were advised that they could submit a written response to the Probable Cause Report within 21 days of receiving Discovery. Additionally, Bertani and the Committee were advised that if they did not request a probable cause conference, such a conference would not be held, and probable cause would be determined based solely on the Report and any written response that Bertani and the Committee submitted within 21 days of the date Bertani and the Committee were served with the Report. Bertani and the Committee responded in writing only requesting Discovery in this matter. Bertani and the Committee's written response is attached as "Exhibit C." Bertani and the Committee were served with Discovery on May 27, 2017. The proof of service via certified mail for Discovery is attached as "Exhibit D." Bertani and the Committee have not responded after service of the Discovery and have exceeded the 21 days to respond in writing based on receipt of Discovery.

WHEREFORE, based on the attached Report, the Enforcement Division requests a finding by the Hearing Officer that probable cause exists to believe that Bertani and the Committee committed seven violations of the Act, stated as follows:

- Count 1: The Committee and Bertani failed to disclose contributor information on the preelection campaign statement for the period of January 1, 2014 through March 17, 2014, in violation of Section 84211, subdivisions (a)–(f).
- Count 2: The Committee and Bertani failed to disclose contributions, expenditures, and contributor information on the pre-election campaign statement for the period of March 18, 2014 through May 17, 2014, in violation of Section 84211, subdivisions (a)–(f).
- Count 3: The Committee and Bertani failed to disclose contributions, expenditures, and

REPORT IN SUPPORT OF FINDING OF PROBABLE CAUSE FPPC Case No. 14/1112 Reports for contributions of \$1,000 or more received during the 90 days preceding an election. The Committee violated the Act by failing to timely disclose contributions and contributor information on its campaign statements and failing to timely file five 24-Hour Contribution Reports.

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

All legal references and discussions of law pertain to the Act's provisions as they existed in 2014.

<u>Jurisdiction</u>

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") has administrative jurisdiction to enforce the provisions of the Act.²

Probable Cause Proceedings

Prior to the Enforcement Division commencing an administrative action, the General Counsel of the Commission or her designee (the "hearing officer"), must make a finding that there is probable cause to believe the respondent has violated the Act.³ After a finding of probable cause, the Commission may hold a noticed hearing in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act⁴ to determine whether violations occurred, and levy an administrative penalty of up to \$5,000 for each violation.⁵

Standard for Finding Probable Cause

To make a finding of probable cause, the hearing officer must be presented with sufficient evidence to lead a person of ordinary caution and prudence to believe, or entertain a strong suspicion, that a respondent committed or caused a violation.⁶

Need for Liberal Construction and Vigorous Enforcement of the Political Reform Act

When enacting the Political Reform Act, the people of the state of California found and declared that previous laws regulating political practices suffered from inadequate enforcement by state and local authorities. To that end, the Act must be liberally construed to achieve its purposes. 8

There are many purposes of the Act. One purpose is to ensure voters are fully informed and improper practices are inhibited by requiring all committees that support or oppose ballot measures to timely disclose all contributions and expenditures made throughout a campaign. Another is to provide adequate enforcement mechanisms so that the Act will be "vigorously enforced."

Campaign Statements

The Act requires a committee to file semi-annual campaign statements twice per year and preelection campaign statements during election years. ¹¹ A campaign statement must accurately account for the committee's total contributions received and expenditures made during the relevant period. ¹² A statement must also disclose the occupation and employer of contributors of \$100 or more. ¹³

24-Hour Contribution Reports

During the 90 days prior to an election, the Act requires a Committee to file a 24-Hour Contribution Report within 24 hours of receiving a contribution of \$1,000 or more, or within 48 hours of receiving a non-monetary contribution worth \$1,000 or more.¹⁴

Liability for Violations

Any person who violates any provision of the Act, who purposely or negligently causes any other person to violate any provision of the Act, or who aids and abets any other person in the violation of any provision of the Act, is liable for administrative penalties up to \$5,000 per violation. This only applies to persons who have filing or reporting obligations under the Act, or who are compensated for services involving the planning, organizing or directing of any activity regulated or required by the Act. 16

SUMMARY OF THE EVIDENCE

The Committee qualified as a candidate-controlled committee on or about October 7, 2013, when it filed a Statement of Organization with the Secretary of State. Bertani was a successful candidate for the Solano County Board of Supervisors in the June 3, 2014 primary, but lost the November 4, 2014 general election. She is currently a member of the Fairfield City Council.

This case was initiated in 2014 after an informal complaint alleged that the Committee and Bertani failed to timely report monetary and non-monetary contributions from the Service Employees International Union Local 1021 Candidate PAC (SEIU), and failed to report occupation and employer information for multiple contributors.

June 2014 Primary Pre-Election Campaign Statements

On the Committee's first pre-election campaign statement for January 1, 2014 through March 17, 2014, only 8 out of 16 contributors' required occupations and 3 out of 14 contributors' required employers were disclosed. The Committee filed an amended statement for that pre-election period on October 23, 2014, which included all of the required occupation and employer information for contributors.

The Committee's second pre-election campaign statement for March 18, 2014 through May 17, 2014 disclosed \$26,814.00 in contributions received and \$29,749.00 in expenditures made. Out of 27 contributions that required the contributor's occupation to be disclosed, only 1 occupation was disclosed. The statement did not disclose any of the required employer information for contributors.

An amended statement filed on October 23, 2014 for the second pre-election period reported \$39,766.75 in contributions received and \$43,073.39 in expenditures made. At that time, all of the required occupation and employer information for contributors was disclosed. But, this amendment showed that \$12,952.75 in contributions and \$13,324.39 in expenditures were not timely disclosed. Overall, 32 percent of the Committee's contributions and 30 percent of the Committee's expenditures during the second pre-election campaign statement period were unreported until four months after the June election.

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First Semi-Annual Campaign Statement

The Committee reported receiving \$31,754.73 in contributions and making \$47,235.84 in expenditures on its semi-annual campaign statement for May 18, 2014 through June 30, 2014. Contributors' occupations were disclosed for just four of the seven contributors of \$100 or more and no employer information for those contributors was disclosed.

On an amended statement for May 18, 2014 through June 30, 2014, which was filed October 23, 2014, the Committee reported receiving contributions totaling \$49,663.19 and making expenditures totaling \$64,499.74. The amendment disclosed all of the required occupation and employer information for contributors, and showed that the Committee failed to timely report \$17,917.46 in contributions and \$17,263.90 in expenditures. Thus, 36 percent of contributions received and 26 percent of expenditures made during the semi-annual campaign statement period were not reported until almost three months after the statement deadline.

24-Hour Contribution Reports

During Bertani's campaign for the Solano County Board of Supervisors, the Committee failed to file 24-Hour Contribution Reports for the following non-monetary contributions from the SEIU: a \$2,488.00 contribution on April 24, 2014; a \$2,592.40 contribution on May 5, 2014; a \$6,747.81 contribution on May 21, 2014; a \$7,352.60 contribution on May 22, 2014, and a \$7,741.61 contribution on October 29, 2014.

The non-monetary contributions that were never reported on 24-Hour Contribution Reports totaled \$29,922.42. All of these contributions were reported on the Committee's campaign statements, but three of the five were not disclosed until after the election to which they related.

VIOLATIONS

Count 1: Failure to Timely Disclose Contributor Information on a Pre-Election Campaign Statement

The Committee and Bertani failed to disclose contributor information on the pre-election campaign statement for the period of January 1, 2014 through March 17, 2014, in violation of Section 84211, subdivisions (a)—(f).

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CONCLUSION

Probable cause exists to believe that the Committee and Bertani violated the Act by failing to timely disclose contributions and contributor information on three campaign statements and failing to timely file four 24-Hour Contribution Reports. The Enforcement Division respectfully requests an order finding probable cause pursuant to Section 83115.5 and Regulation 18361.4.

FINDING OF PROBABLE CAUSE AND ORDER TO PREPARE AND SERVE AN ACCUSATION

Gov. Code § 83115.5

By means of an Ex Parte Request for an Order Finding Probable Cause and an Order that an Accusation be Prepared and Served, dated July 25, 2017, the Enforcement Division submitted the above-entitled matter to the Hearing Officer for a determination of Probable Cause. As set forth in the Ex Parte Request, the Enforcement Division served a Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause (the Report) to Respondents Pam Bertani and Pam Bertani for Solano County Supervisor 2014 (the Committee) concerning this matter on March 31, 2017. Service was made by certified mail. Accompanying the Report was a packet of materials that informed Bertani and the Committee of their right to: request discovery, file a written response to the Report within 21 days following service of the Report, and to request a probable cause conference. During the 21 days that followed service of the Report, Bertani and the Committee requested discovery. Discovery was served on Bertani and the Committee by certified mail on May 27, 2017. Bertani and the Committee have not filed a written response within 21 days of receipt of the discovery. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 2, Section 18361.4, determination of probable cause may be made solely on papers submitted when the respondent does not request that a probable cause conference be held.\frac{1}{2}

In making a probable cause determination, it is the duty of the Hearing Officer of the Fair Political Practices Commission to determine whether probable cause exists for believing that a respondent has violated the Political Reform Act as alleged by the Enforcement Division in the probable cause report served on the respondent.

Probable cause to believe a violation has occurred can be found to exist when "the evidence is sufficient to lead a person of ordinary caution and prudence to believe or entertain a strong suspicion that the proposed respondent(s) committed or caused a violation."²

The Probable Cause Report served on Bertani and the Committee and the subsequent Ex Parte Request for an Order Finding Probable Cause and an Order that an Accusation be Prepared and Served in this matter allege seven violations of the Political Reform Act were committed, as follows:

- Count 1: The Committee and Bertani failed to disclose contributor information on the preelection campaign statement for the period of January 1, 2014 through March 17, 2014, in violation of Section 84211, subdivisions (a)-(f).
- Count 2: The Committee and Bertani failed to disclose contributions, expenditures, and contributor information on the pre-election campaign statement for the period of March 18, 2014 through May 17, 2014, in violation of Section 84211, subdivisions (a)-(f).
- Count 3: The Committee and Bertani failed to disclose contributions, expenditures, and contributor information on the semi-annual campaign statement for the period of May 18, 2014 through June 30, 2014, in violation of Section 84211, subdivisions (a)–(f).
- Count 4: The Committee and Bertani failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report for a non-monetary contribution made on April 24, 2014, in violation of Sections 84203 and 84203.3.
- Count 5: The Committee and Bertani failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report for a non-monetary contribution made on May 5, 2014, in violation of Sections 84203 and 84203.3.
- Count 6: The Committee and Bertani failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report for non-monetary contributions made on May 21 and 22, 2014, in violation of Sections 84203 and 84203.3.
- Count 7: The Committee and Bertani failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report for a

non-monetary contribution made on October 29, 2014, in violation of Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

Based on the Ex Parte Request for a Finding of Probable Cause and an Order that an Accusation be Prepared and Served given to me, I find that notice has been given to the Committee and Bertani.³ I further find, based on the Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause and the Ex Parte Request for a Finding of Probable Cause and an Order that an Accusation be Prepared and Served, that there is probable cause to believe Bertani and the Committee violated the Political Reform Act as alleged in Counts 1 through 7, above.

I therefore direct that the Enforcement Division issue an Accusation against Bertani and the Committee in accordance with this Finding.

In framing a proposed order following a finding of a violation pursuant to Section 83116, the Commission and the administrative law judge shall consider all the surrounding circumstances including but not limited to: (1) The seriousness of the violation; (2) The presence or absence of any intention to conceal, deceive or mislead; (3) Whether the violation was deliberate, negligent or inadvertent; (4) Whether the violator demonstrated good faith by consulting the Commission staff or any other government agency in a manner not constituting a complete defense under Section 83114(b); (5) Whether the violation was isolated or part of a pattern and whether the violator has a prior record of violations of the Act or similar laws; and (6) Whether the violator, upon learning of a reporting violation, voluntarily filed amendments to provide full disclosure.¹⁰

MITIGATING OR EXCULPATORY FACTORS

67. Bertani and the Committee filed amendments to disclose the occupation and employer information, contributions received and expenditures made, albeit after the election.

AGGRAVATING FACTORS AND OTHER RELEVANT MATERIALS

68. Bertani is currently a Fairfield City Councilmember.

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays as follows:

- 1. That the Commission, pursuant to section 83116, subdivision (c), order Bertani and the Committee to pay a monetary penalty of up to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the violation of the Act alleged in Count 1;
- 2. That the Commission, pursuant to section 83116, subdivision (c), order Bertani and the Committee to pay a monetary penalty of up to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the violation of the Act alleged in Count 2;
- 3. That the Commission, pursuant to section 83116, subdivision (c), order Bertani and the Committee to pay a monetary penalty of up to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the violation of the Act alleged in Count 3;

California Government Code sections 11506 through 11508

§ 11506. Filing of notice of defense or notice of participation; Contents; Right to hearing on the merits

- (a) Within 15 days after service of the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force the respondent may file with the agency a notice of defense, or, as applicable, notice of participation, in which the respondent may:
 - (1) Request a hearing.
- (2) Object to the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force upon the ground that it does not state acts or omissions upon which the agency may proceed.
- (3) Object to the form of the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force on the ground that it is so indefinite or uncertain that the respondent cannot identify the transaction or prepare a defense.
 - (4) Admit the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force in whole or in part.
 - (5) Present new matter by way of defense.
- (6) Object to the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force upon the ground that, under the circumstances, compliance with the requirements of a regulation would result in a material violation of another regulation enacted by another department affecting substantive rights.
- **(b)** Within the time specified the respondent may file one or more notices of defense, or, as applicable, notices of participation, upon any or all of these grounds but all of these notices shall be filed within that period unless the agency in its discretion authorizes the filing of a later notice.
- (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense or notice of participation, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense or notice of participation shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing. Unless objection is taken as provided in paragraph (3) of subdivision (a), all objections to the form of the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force shall be deemed waived.
- (d) The notice of defense or notice of participation shall be in writing signed by or on behalf of the respondent and shall state the respondent's mailing address. It need not be verified or follow any particular form.

(e) As used in this section, "file," "files," "filed," or "filing" means "delivered or mailed" to the agency as provided in Section 11505.

§ 11507. Amended or supplemental accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force; Objections

At any time before the matter is submitted for decision, the agency may file, or permit the filing of, an amended or supplemental accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force. All parties shall be notified of the filing. If the amended or supplemental accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force presents new charges, the agency shall afford the respondent a reasonable opportunity to prepare his or her defense to the new charges, but he or she shall not be entitled to file a further pleading unless the agency in its discretion so orders. Any new charges shall be deemed controverted, and any objections to the amended or supplemental accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force may be made orally and shall be noted in the record.

§ 11507.3. Consolidated proceedings; Separate hearings

- (a) When proceedings that involve a common question of law or fact are pending, the administrative law judge on the judge's own motion or on motion of a party may order a joint hearing of any or all the matters at issue in the proceedings. The administrative law judge may order all the proceedings consolidated and may make orders concerning the procedure that may tend to avoid unnecessary costs or delay.
- (b) The administrative law judge on the judge's own motion or on motion of a party, in furtherance of convenience or to avoid prejudice or when separate hearings will be conducive to expedition and economy, may order a separate hearing of any issue, including an issue raised in the notice of defense or notice of participation, or of any number of issues.

§ 11507.5. Exclusivity of discovery provisions

The provisions of Section 11507.6 provide the exclusive right to and method of discovery as to any proceeding governed by this chapter.

§ 11507.6. Request for discovery

After initiation of a proceeding in which a respondent or other party is entitled to a hearing on the merits, a party, upon written request made to another party, prior to the hearing and within 30 days after service by the agency of the initial pleading or within 15 days after the service of an additional pleading, is entitled to (1) obtain the names and addresses of witnesses to the extent known to the other party, including, but not limited to, those intended to be called to testify at the hearing, and (2) inspect and make a copy of any of the following in the possession or custody or under the control of the other party:

- (a) A statement of a person, other than the respondent, named in the initial administrative pleading, or in any additional pleading, when it is claimed that the act or omission of the respondent as to this person is the basis for the administrative proceeding;
- **(b)** A statement pertaining to the subject matter of the proceeding made by any party to another party or person;
- (c) Statements of witnesses then proposed to be called by the party and of other persons having personal knowledge of the acts, omissions or events which are the basis for the proceeding, not included in (a) or (b) above;
- (d) All writings, including, but not limited to, reports of mental, physical and blood examinations and things which the party then proposes to offer in evidence;
 - (e) Any other writing or thing which is relevant and which would be admissible in evidence;
- (f) Investigative reports made by or on behalf of the agency or other party pertaining to the subject matter of the proceeding, to the extent that these reports (1) contain the names and addresses of witnesses or of persons having personal knowledge of the acts, omissions or events which are the basis for the proceeding, or (2) reflect matters perceived by the investigator in the course of his or her investigation, or (3) contain or include by attachment any statement or writing described in (a) to (e), inclusive, or summary thereof.

For the purpose of this section, "statements" include written statements by the person signed or otherwise authenticated by him or her, stenographic, mechanical, electrical or other recordings, or transcripts thereof, of oral statements by the person, and written reports or summaries of these oral statements.

Nothing in this section shall authorize the inspection or copying of any writing or thing which is privileged from disclosure by law or otherwise made confidential or protected as the attorney's work product.

§ 11507.7. Motion to compel discovery; Order

- (a) Any party claiming the party's request for discovery pursuant to Section 11507.6 has not been complied with may serve and file with the administrative law judge a motion to compel discovery, naming as respondent the party refusing or failing to comply with Section 11507.6. The motion shall state facts showing the respondent party failed or refused to comply with Section 11507.6, a description of the matters sought to be discovered, the reason or reasons why the matter is discoverable under that section, that a reasonable and good faith attempt to contact the respondent for an informal resolution of the issue has been made, and the ground or grounds of respondent's refusal so far as known to the moving party.
- (b) The motion shall be served upon respondent party and filed within 15 days after the respondent party first evidenced failure or refusal to comply with Section 11507.6 or within 30 days after request was made and the party has failed to reply to the request, or within another time provided by stipulation, whichever period is longer.
- (c) The hearing on the motion to compel discovery shall be held within 15 days after the motion is made, or a later time that the administrative law judge may on the judge's own motion for good cause determine. The respondent party shall have the right to serve and file a written answer or other response to the motion before or at the time of the hearing.
- (d) Where the matter sought to be discovered is under the custody or control of the respondent party and the respondent party asserts that the matter is not a discoverable matter under the provisions of Section 11507.6, or is privileged against disclosure under those provisions, the administrative law judge may order lodged with it matters provided in subdivision (b) of Section 915 of the Evidence Code and examine the matters in accordance with its provisions.
- (e) The administrative law judge shall decide the case on the matters examined in camera, the papers filed by the parties, and such oral argument and additional evidence as the administrative law judge may allow.
- (f) Unless otherwise stipulated by the parties, the administrative law judge shall no later than 15 days after the hearing make its order denying or granting the motion. The order shall be in writing setting forth the matters the moving party is entitled to discover under Section 11507.6. A copy of the order shall forthwith be served by mail by the administrative law judge upon the parties. Where the order grants the motion in whole or in part, the order shall not become

effective until 10 days after the date the order is served. Where the order denies relief to the moving party, the order shall be effective on the date it is served.

§ 11508. Time and place of hearing

- (a) The agency shall consult the office, and subject to the availability of its staff, shall determine the time and place of the hearing. The hearing shall be held at a hearing facility maintained by the office in Sacramento, Oakland, Los Angeles, or San Diego and shall be held at the facility that is closest to the location where the transaction occurred or the respondent resides.
- (b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), the hearing may be held at either of the following places:
- (1) A place selected by the agency that is closer to the location where the transaction occurred or the respondent resides.
 - (2) A place within the state selected by agreement of the parties.
- (c) The respondent may move for, and the administrative law judge has discretion to grant or deny, a change in the place of the hearing. A motion for a change in the place of the hearing shall be made within 10 days after service of the notice of hearing on the respondent.

Unless good cause is identified in writing by the administrative law judge, hearings shall be held in a facility maintained by the office.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ENTER DEFAULT DECISION AND ORDER

In the Matter of Pam Bertani for Solano County Supervisor 2014 and Pam Bertani

Dear Ms. Bertani:

Enclosed please find a copy of the Default Decision and Order, and accompanying Exhibit and attachments, for the above-referenced matter. The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") will consider these papers at its public meeting on November 16, 2017, and decide whether to impose an administrative penalty of \$18,500 against you.

You were previously served a Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause, commonly known as a Probable Cause Report, advising you of your right to request a probable cause conference or submit a written response to the probable cause report. You did not request a probable cause conference, nor did you submit anything in writing for the Commission's Hearing Officer to consider in his determination of probable cause.

Following the issuance of the Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause, the Commission's Hearing Officer found probable cause that you committed seven violations of the Political Reform Act's campaign provisions. Thereafter, the Commission's Chief of Enforcement issued an Accusation against you on six of these violations. The Accusation was personally served on you on September 16, 2017. Under the law, you have therefore received adequate notice of these proceedings and the action filed against you. Under the Administrative Procedure Act, you were required to file your Notices of Defense within 15 days after service of the Accusation. You failed to file the Notice of Defense forms. As such, your right to an administrative hearing on this matter has been forfeited, and you are in a default position.

You may, but you are not required to, provide a response brief, along with any supporting materials, no later than five calendar days before the Commission hearing at which the default is scheduled to be heard. Your response brief must be served on the Commission Assistant, at the above address.

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Following the issuance of the default order and imposition of the administrative penalty, we will commence legal proceedings to collect this fine, which may include converting the Commission's order to a court judgment. Please be advised that administrative penalties for violations of the Political Reform Act cannot be discharged in bankruptcy proceedings.

This letter is your last opportunity to resolve this matter informally by way of a stipulated settlement, before the default proceedings are commenced. If we do not reach a resolution, the enclosed documents will be placed on the Commission's agenda for the November 16, 2017 meeting. Please contact me at (916) 324-8787 if you wish to enter into a negotiated settlement.
