EXHIBIT 1

INTRODUCTION

Respondent Anna Song ("Song") was an unsuccessful incumbent candidate for Santa Clara County Board of Education, Trustee of Area 5, in the November 3, 2020 General Election. Respondent, Friends of Anna Song for County Board of Education for 2020 (ID# 1241672) (the "Committee"), is Song's controlled committee. Song serves as the Committee's treasurer.

This matter arose from filing officer referrals from the County of Santa Clara and a sworn complaint.

The Political Reform Act (the "Act")¹ requires controlled committees to timely file certain campaign statements and reports to disclose contributions received and expenditures made.

As a controlled committee, its candidate, and its treasurer, the Committee and Song violated the Act by failing to timely file eight semi-annual campaign statements, four pre-election campaign statements, and 24-hour contribution reports for 12 late contributions received.

DEFAULT PROCEEDINGS UNDER THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT

When the Commission determines probable cause exists for believing that the Act has been violated, it may hold a hearing to determine if a violation has occurred.² Notice of the hearing, and the hearing itself, must be conducted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act (the "APA").³ A hearing to determine whether the Act has been violated is initiated by the filing of an accusation, which shall be a concise written statement of the charges specifying the statutes and rules which the respondent is alleged to have violated.⁴

Included among the rights afforded a respondent under the APA, is the right of the respondents to file a Notice of Defense with the Commission within 15 days after service of the accusation, by which the respondent may (1) request a hearing; (2) object to the accusation on the ground it does not state acts or omissions upon which the agency may proceed; (3) object to the form of the accusation on the ground that it is so indefinite or certain that the respondent

cannot identify the transaction or prepare a defense; (4) admit the accusation in whole or in part; (5) present new matter by way of defense; or (6) object to the accusation on the ground that, under the circumstances, compliance with a Commission regulation would result in a material violation of another department's regulation affecting substantive rights.⁵

The APA provides that a respondent's failure to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service of an accusation constitutes a waiver of the respondent's right to a hearing.⁶ Moreover, when a respondent fails to file a Notice of Defense, the Commission may take action based on the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to the respondent.⁷

PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS AND HISTORY

A. <u>Initiation of the Administrative Action</u>

The service of the probable cause hearing notice, as required by Section 83115.5, upon the person alleged to have violated the Act starts the administrative action.⁸

A finding of probable cause may not be made by the Commission unless the person alleged to have violated the Act is (1) notified of the violation by service of process or registered mail with return receipt requested; (2) provided with a summary of the evidence; and (3) informed of his or her right to be present in person and represented by counsel at any proceeding of the Commission held for the purpose of considering whether probable cause exists for believing the person violated the Act.⁹ Additionally, the required notice to the alleged violator shall be deemed made on the date of service, the date the registered mail receipt is signed, or if the registered mail receipt is not signed, the date returned by the post office.¹⁰

No administrative action pursuant to Chapter 3 of the Act alleging a violation of any of the provisions of the Act may be commenced more than five years after the date on which the violation occurred.¹¹

Documents supporting the procedural history are included in the attached Certification of Records ("Certification") filed herewith at Exhibit 1, A-1 through A-16, and incorporated herein by reference.

In accordance with Sections 83115.5 and 91000.5, the Enforcement Division initiated an administrative action against the Committee and Song in this matter by serving them with a

Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause (the "Report") (Certification, Exhibit A-1) by certified mail. ¹² The Committee and Song were served with the Report on April 1, 2022. (Certification, Exhibit A-2.) The administrative action commenced on April 1, 2022, and the five-year statute of limitations was effectively tolled on this date.

As required by Section 83115.5, the packet served on the Committee and Song contained a cover letter and a memorandum describing probable cause proceedings, advising that the Committee and Song had 21 days to request a probable cause conference and/or to file a written response to the Report. The Committee and Song did not request a probable cause conference or submit a written response to the Report within the statutory period, which ended on April 22, 2022.

B. Ex Parte Request for a Finding of Probable Cause

Because the Committee and Song failed to request a probable cause conference or submit a written response to the Report by the statutory deadline, the Enforcement Division submitted an Ex Parte Request for a Finding of Probable Cause and an Order that an Accusation Be Prepared and Served to the Hearing Officer of the Commission on May 2, 2022. (Certification, Exhibit A-3.)

On or around May 10, 2022, the Hearing Officer, Legal Division, Jack Woodside, issued a Finding of Probable Cause and an Order to Prepare and Serve an Accusation on the Committee and Song. (Certification, Exhibit A-4.)

C. The Issuance and Service of the Accusation

Under the Act, if the Hearing Officer makes a finding of probable cause, the Enforcement Division must prepare an accusation pursuant to Section 11503 of the APA and have it served on the persons who are the subject of the probable cause finding.¹³

Section 11503 states:

A hearing to determine whether a right, authority, license, or privilege should be revoked, suspended, limited, or conditioned shall be initiated by filing an accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force. The accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force shall be a written statement of charges that shall set forth in ordinary and concise language the acts or omissions with which the respondent is charged, to the end that the respondent will be able to prepare his or her defense. It shall specify the statutes and rules that the respondent is alleged to have violated, but shall not consist merely of charges phrased in the language of those statutes and rules. The accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force shall be verified unless made by a public officer acting in his or her official

capacity or by an employee of the agency before which the proceeding is to be held. The verification may be on information and belief.

Upon the filing of the accusation, the agency must (1) serve a copy thereof on the respondent as provided in Section 11505, subdivision (c); (2) include a postcard or other form entitled Notice of Defense that, when signed by or on behalf of the respondent and returned to the agency, will acknowledge service of the accusation and constitute a notice of defense under Section 11506; (3) include (i) a statement that respondent may request a hearing by filing a notice of defense as provided in Section 11506 within 15 days after service upon the respondent of the accusation, and that failure to do so will constitute a waiver of the respondent's right to a hearing, and (ii) copies of Sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7.14 The APA also sets forth the language required in the accompanying statement to the respondent.15

The Accusation and accompanying information may be sent to the respondent by any means selected by the agency. Still, no order adversely affecting the rights of the respondent may be made by the agency in any case unless the respondent has been served personally or by registered mail as set forth in the APA.¹⁶

On August 5, 2022, the Commission's Chief of Enforcement, Angela Brereton, issued an Accusation against the Committee and Song. (Certification, Exhibit A-5.) In accordance with Section 11505, the Accusation and accompanying information, consisting of a Statement to Respondent, two copies of a Notice of Defense Form for each respondent, copies of Government Code Sections 11506, 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7, were served upon the Committee and Song by personal service on August 16, 2022. (Certification, Exhibit A-6.)

Along with the Accusation, the Enforcement Division served the Committee and Song with a "Statement to Respondent," which notified them that they could request a hearing on the merits and warned that, unless a Notice of Defense was filed within 15 days of service of the Accusation, they would be deemed to have waived the right to a hearing. (Certification, Exhibit A-7.) The Committee and Song did not file a Notice of Defense within the statutory time period, which ended on September 1, 2022.

As a result, on October 31, 2023, the Enforcement Division sent a letter to the Committee and Song advising that this matter would be submitted for a Default Decision and Order at the Commission's public meeting scheduled for January 18, 2024. (Certification, Exhibit A-15.)

On November 28, 2023, the Enforcement Division sent another letter to the Committee and Song advising that this matter would be submitted for a Default Decision and Order at the Commission's public meeting scheduled for January 18, 2024. (Certification, Exhibit A-16.) A copy of the Default Decision and Order, and this accompanying Exhibit 1 with attachments, was included with the letter.

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

The Act and its regulations are amended from time to time. The violations in this case occurred in 2018 through 2022. For this reason, all legal references and discussions of law pertain to the Act's provisions as they existed at that time.

An express purpose of the Act is to ensure voters are fully informed and improper practices are inhibited by requiring all candidates, as well as the committees controlled by them, to disclose all contributions and expenditures made throughout a campaign. Another is to provide adequate enforcement mechanisms so the Act will be "vigorously enforced."

A "recipient committee" is a person or combination of persons who directly or indirectly receive contributions totaling \$2,000 or more in a calendar year.¹⁹ A "controlled committee" includes a recipient committee controlled directly or indirectly by a candidate.²⁰

The Act requires candidates, committees, and treasurers to file campaign statements at specific times disclosing information regarding contributions received and expenditures made by campaign committees.²¹ If the filing due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or official state holiday, then the filing due date for such a statement or report shall be extended to the next regular business day.²² This extension does not apply to 24-hour contribution reports when the due date for these reports falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or official state holiday immediately before an election.²³

Recipient committees must file semi-annual campaign statements each year no later than July 31 for the period ending June 30, and no later than January 31 for the period ending December 31.²⁴

All candidates appearing on the ballot at the next election, and their controlled committees, must file pre-election campaign statements.²⁵ The first pre-election campaign statement, for the period ending 45 days before the election, must be filed no later than 40 days before the election.²⁶ The second preelection campaign statement, for the period ending 17 days before the election, must be filed no later than 12 days before the election.²⁷

If a candidate or elected officer controls more than one committee for the purpose of election to office, including committees established for a different elective office, the candidate or elected officer must file campaign statements for each of these committees on the dates the candidate or elected officer is required to file pre-election campaign statements in connection with their election to office.²⁸

A "late contribution" includes a contribution or loan that totals in the aggregate \$1,000 or more and is made to or received by a candidate or a controlled committee during the 90-day period preceding the date of the election or on the date of the election, at which the candidate is to be voted on.²⁹ Each committee that receives a late contribution shall report the late contribution within 24 hours of the time it is received.³⁰ Each committee that receives a late non-monetary contribution shall report the late non-monetary contribution within 48 hours of the time it is received.³¹

Filing obligations continue until termination of the committee.³² A treasurer of a recipient committee may terminate the committee's status as a committee only by completing the termination section on the statement of organization declaring, under penalty of perjury, that the committee: (1) has ceased to receive contributions and make expenditures; (2) has eliminated or has declared that it has no intention or ability to discharge all of its debts, loans received and other obligations; (3) has no surplus funds; and (4) has filed all required campaign statements disclosing all reportable transactions.³³

SUMMARY OF THE EVIDENCE

Song was first elected to the Santa Clara County Board of Education in the November 7, 2000 General Election and was reelected in 2004, 2008, 2012, and 2016. Song was unsuccessful in the November 3, 2020 General Election, receiving 46.6% of the votes, and left office with the Santa Clara County Board of Education on December 11, 2020. (Certification, Exhibit A-8.) Additionally, Song appeared on the March 3, 2020 Primary Election ballot as a candidate for State Assembly, District 25. (Certification, Exhibit A-8.) Anna Song for Assembly 2020 (ID# 1418764) was Song's controlled committee. Song was unsuccessful in the March 3, 2020 Primary Election receiving 12.7% of the votes. (Certification, Exhibit A-8.)

Song redesignated the Committee for the 2020 General Election by filing an amendment to the statement of organization on August 6, 2020. (Certification, Exhibit A-9.) Between July 1, 2017 and December 31, 2021, the Committee reported approximately \$175,938 in contributions and \$157,961 in expenditures. (Certification, Exhibits A-10, A-11, A-12, A-13.) To date, the Committee remains open.

Failure to Timely File Semi-Annual and Pre-Election Campaign Statements

The Committee was required to file semi-annual campaign statements until the Committee terminated. Since Song appeared on the March 3, 2020 Primary Election ballot as a candidate for State Assembly, the Committee was required to file pre-election campaign statements prior to the March 3, 2020 Primary Election. Since Song appeared on the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot, the Committee was required to file pre-election campaign statements prior to the election.

According to the County of Santa Clara, the Committee filed pre-election and semi-annual campaign statements as follows (Certification, Exhibits A-10, A-11, A-12.):

To date, the Committee has not filed a statement of organization to terminate the Committee's status as a committee. Thus, the Committee continues to have filing obligations.³⁶

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Reports

Since Song appeared on the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot, the Committee was required to timely file 24-hour contribution reports within 24 hours of receiving a late monetary contribution or within 48 hours of receiving a late non-monetary contribution during the 90-day period preceding the election, which began on August 5, 2020. The Committee's campaign statements reported late contributions and late non-monetary contributions received that were required to be disclosed on 24-hour contribution reports. (Certification, Exhibit A-11.)

According to the County of Santa Clara, the Committee filed 24-hour contribution reports as follows (Certification, Exhibit A-13.):

In summary, the Committee failed to timely file 24-hour contribution reports for 12 late contributions received totaling \$170,259. The Committee reported these late contributions on the date of the election on 24-hour contribution reports. Additionally, certain contributors, including Charter Public Schools PAC (ID# 1302433) and Santa Clara Charter Advocates for Great Schools (ID# 1384928), disclosed the late contributions they made to the Committee before the election on timely filed 24-hour contribution reports.

Summary of Contact

The Enforcement Division contacted the Committee and Song multiple times regarding this matter. At various points, Song engaged in the process but ultimately failed to participate.

- November 28, 2023: Notice of Intent to Enter Default Decision and Order sent via first class mail to the Committee and Song informing them that the Default Decision and Order would be presented at the January 18, 2024 meeting for Commission action

VIOLATIONS

The Committee and Song committed 15 violations of the Act as follows:

COUNT 1

Failure to Timely File Semi-Annual Campaign Statements

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file semi-annual campaign statements for the reporting periods ending December 31, 2017, June 30, 2018, and December 31, 2018, by the January 31, 2018, July 31, 2018, and January 31, 2019, respective due dates. By failing to timely file the applicable semi-annual campaign statements, by the respective due dates, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Section 84200.

COUNT 2

Failure to Timely File Semi-Annual Campaign Statements

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file semi-annual campaign statements for the reporting periods ending June 30, 2019, December 31, 2019, and June 30, 2020, by the July 31, 2019, January 31, 2020, and July 31, 2020, respective due dates. By failing to timely file the applicable semi-annual campaign statements, by the respective due dates, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Section 84200.

COUNT 3

Failure to Timely File Pre-Election Campaign Statements

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file pre-election campaign statements for the reporting periods ending January 18, 2020 and February 15, 2020, by the January 23, 2020 and February 20, 2020, respective due dates. By failing to timely file the applicable pre-election campaign statements, by the respective due dates, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Sections 84200.5 and 84200.8, and Regulation 18405.

COUNT 4

Failure to Timely File Pre-Election Campaign Statement

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file a pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period ending September 19, 2020, by the September 24, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file a pre-election campaign statement by the September 24, 2020 due date, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Sections 84200.5 and 84200.8.

COUNT 5

Failure to Timely File Pre-Election Campaign Statement

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file a pre-election campaign statement for the reporting period ending October 17, 2020, by the October 22, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file a pre-election campaign statement by the October 22, 2020 due date, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Sections 84200.5 and 84200.8.

COUNT 6

Failure to Timely File Semi-Annual Campaign Statement

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period ending June 30, 2021, by the August 2, 2021 due date. By failing to timely

file a semi-annual campaign statement by the August 2, 2021 due date, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Section 84200.

COUNT 7

Failure to Timely File Semi-Annual Campaign Statement

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period ending December 31, 2021, by the January 31, 2022 due date. By failing to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement by the January 31, 2022 due date, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Section 84200.

COUNT 8

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Reports

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports for a late contribution of \$4,410 by the August 7, 2020 due date and for a late contribution of \$6,000 by the August 10, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports by the August 7, 2020 and August 10, 2020 respective due dates, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Section 84203.

COUNT 9

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Reports

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports for a late contribution of \$10,000 by the September 28, 2020 due date and for two late contributions totaling \$2,000 by the October 5, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports by the September 28, 2020 and October 5, 2020 respective due dates, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Section 84203.

COUNT 10

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution of \$22,440 by the October 7, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file a 24-hour contribution report by the October 7, 2020 due date, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

COUNT 11

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution of \$40,000 by the October 12, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file a 24-hour contribution report by the October 12, 2020 due date, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

COUNT 12

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Reports

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports for a late non-monetary contribution of \$4,000 by the October 13, 2020 due date and for a late non-monetary contribution of \$15,088 by the October 19, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports by the October 13, 2020 and October 19, 2020 respective due dates, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

COUNT 13

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution of \$22,440 by the October 15, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file a 24-hour contribution report by the October 15, 2020 due date, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

COUNT 14

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution of \$21,944 by the October 23, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file a 24-hour contribution report by the October 23, 2020 due date, the Committee and Song violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

COUNT 15

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song had a duty to timely file 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution of \$21,937 by the October 28, 2020 due date. By failing to timely file a 24-hour contribution report by the October 28, 2020 due date, the Committee and Song

violated Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

CONCLUSION

This matter consists of 15 counts of violating the Act, which carry a maximum total administrative penalty of \$75,000.³⁷

In determining the appropriate penalty for a particular violation of the Act, the Enforcement Division considers the typical treatment of a violation in the overall statutory scheme of the Act, with an emphasis on serving the purposes and intent of the Act. Additionally, the Enforcement Division considers the facts and circumstances of the violation in the context of the following factors set forth in Regulation 18361.5 subdivision (e)(1) through (8): (1) The extent and gravity of the public harm caused by the specific violation; (2) The level of experience of the violator with the requirements of the Political Reform Act; (3) Penalties previously imposed by the Commission in comparable cases; (4) The presence or absence of any intention to conceal, deceive or mislead; (5) Whether the violation was deliberate, negligent or inadvertent; (6) Whether the violator demonstrated good faith by consulting the Commission staff or any other governmental agency in a manner not constituting complete defense under Government Code Section 83114(b); (7) Whether the violation was isolated or part of a pattern and whether the violator has a prior record of violations of the Political Reform Act or similar laws; and (8) Whether the violator, upon learning of a reporting violation, voluntarily filed amendments to provide full disclosure.³⁸

In this matter, between January 31, 2018 and January 31, 2022, the Committee and Song failed to timely file eight semi-annual campaign statements, four pre-election campaign statements, and 11 24-hour contribution reports.

The failure to comply with campaign filing obligations resulted in a lack of complete and accurate information for the voting public regarding the Committee's and Song's campaign activity before the November 3, 2020 General Election. All of the Committee's expenditures occurred between September 20, 2020 through the date of the election and were not reported until election day. Further, the late contributions received during the 90-day period represent 100% of the Committee's total contributions received.

Song is experienced with the requirements of the Act as Song has had a controlled committee since at least 2001. Song had previously campaigned for the position with the Santa Clara County Board of Education in 2000, 2004, 2008, and 2012 and filed the required campaign statements.

In this matter, there was no evidence to support an intent to conceal, deceive or mislead the public as to the Committee's receipts and expenditures; however, the evidence establishes that certain filings were not voluntary either, as they were only made after numerous

Enforcement Division contacts and the filing of an Injunction. There is no evidence to suggest that Song consulted with Commission staff or any other governmental agency regarding the Committee's filing obligations.

The violations presented here are not isolated but instead appear to be part of a pattern. The Committee and Song have failed to timely file campaign statements since 2017 and continued to late-file campaign statements after receiving contact from the Enforcement Division regarding this matter. Further, Song has a prior history of violating the Act. On June 21, 2011, the Enforcement Division issued a Warning Letter to Song and Song's controlled committee for Assembly for its failure to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period ending June 30, 2010.³⁹ On March 21, 2019, the Commission approved a default judgment against the Committee and Song for two counts of failing to timely file semi-annual campaign statements for the reporting periods ending December 31, 2016 and June 30, 2017, with a total penalty of \$8,000.⁴⁰ Thus, Song knew, or should have known, of the Committee's filing obligations under the Act.

While the Committee and Song eventually filed the outstanding campaign statements and reports, the statements and reports were filed after the Committee and Song received multiple requests to file from the Enforcement Division. Between November 4, 2019 and October 30, 2020, the Enforcement Division contacted Song at least 13 times in writing and 12 times via phone regarding the Committee's outstanding campaign statements. After not receiving compliance, on October 30, 2020, the Enforcement Division filed an Injunction against the Committee and Song with the County of Santa Clara Superior Court. (Certification, Exhibit A-14.) On November 2, 2020, the Enforcement Division issued a press release concerning the filing of the Injunction. On November 3, 2020, the day of the election, the Committee filed the outstanding campaign statements and reports as discussed above. Since the outstanding campaign statements and reports had been filed, the Enforcement Division requested for the Injunction to be dismissed which was approved by the Court.

The Enforcement Division also considers previous cases the Commission approved in determining penalties. In this matter, the following cases were used as guidelines.

Counts 1-2

• In the Matter of D. Shelly Yarbrough and Yarbrough for Val Verde School Board 2014; FPPC No. 16/117. (The Commission approved a default decision on February 18, 2021). The respondents, among other violations, failed to timely file seven semi-annual campaign statements. Yarbrough had prior experience with the Act and a prior enforcement history for failing to timely file semi-annual campaign statements. In aggravation, at the time of the default, these semi-annual campaign statements remained outstanding. The Commission imposed a penalty of \$3,000 per count for seven counts.

Here, the Committee and Song failed to timely file six semi-annual campaign statements. Unlike *Yarbrough*, the Committee and Song filed the outstanding campaign statements after receiving contact from the Enforcement Division. The statements reported no campaign activity during the reporting periods. Similar to *Yarbrough*, Song had prior experience with the Act and a prior enforcement history for failing to timely file semi-annual campaign statements. In consideration of the factors and since the outstanding statements have been filed which reported no campaign activity, a penalty of \$5,000 per count is recommended for two counts.

Count 3

• In the Matter of Joe Aguirre and Friends of Joe Aguirre for Delano City Council 2014; FPPC No. 17/193. (The Commission approved a default decision on March 24, 2022.) The respondents, among other violations, failed to timely file two pre-election campaign statements prior to the November 8, 2016 General Election. Aguirre had prior experience with the Act and eventually filed the outstanding campaign statements after receiving contact from the Enforcement Division and after the relevant election. The Enforcement Division determined that these violations would have qualified for the Commission's Streamline Program as they resulted in low public harm. The Commission imposed a penalty of \$5,000 per count for two counts.

Here, since Song appeared on the March 3, 2020 Primary Election ballot as a candidate for State Assembly, the Committee and Song were also required to file pre-election campaign statements prior to the election but failed to do so. Song's controlled Assembly committee, Anna Song for Assembly 2020, timely filed pre-election campaign statements prior to the March 3, 2020 Primary Election. Similar to *Aguirre*, the outstanding campaign statements were filed after receiving contact from the Enforcement Division and after the relevant election. Unlike *Aguirre*, the statements reported no campaign activity during the reporting periods. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$5,000 per count is recommended for one count.

Counts 4-5

• In the Matter of Alfonso Sanchez and Alfonso Sanchez for School Board 2016; FPPC No. 16/20105. (The Commission approved a default decision on January 15, 2020.) The respondents, among other violations, failed to timely file two pre-election campaign statements prior to the November 8, 2016 General Election. The Enforcement Division filed an Injunction with the County of San Bernardino Superior Court and an order was issued to compel respondents to file the outstanding campaign statements. Later, respondents filed the outstanding campaign statements. Sanchez had prior experience with the Act but no prior enforcement history. The Commission imposed a penalty of \$5,000 per count for two counts.

Here, the Committee and Song failed to timely file two pre-election campaign statements

prior to the November 3, 2020 General Election. After receiving notification from the Enforcement Division that an Injunction had been filed against the Respondents in this matter, the Committee and Song filed the outstanding pre-election campaign statements on the day of the election. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$5,000 per count is recommended for two counts.

Counts 6-7

• In the Matter of Thomas Benson for Signal Hill City Council 2017 and Thomas Benson; FPPC No. 2018/00171. (The Commission approved a default decision on September 16, 2021.) The respondents failed to timely file three semi-annual campaign statements. These statements disclosed or would have disclosed no campaign activity during the relevant reporting periods. Benson had prior experience with the Act and a prior enforcement history for failing to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement. The Commission imposed a penalty of \$3,000 per count for three counts.

Here, the Committee and Song failed to timely file two semi-annual campaign statements to disclose \$5,712 in expenditures. After receiving contact from the Enforcement Division, the outstanding campaign statements were filed. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$3,500 per count is recommended for two counts.

Counts 8-15

• In the Matter of Californians in Support of Mike Antonovich State Senate 2016 and Shelley Levine; FPPC Nos. 2017/01397 and 2018/00821. (The Commission approved a default decision on March 24, 2022.) The respondents, among other violations, failed to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports for late contributions received of \$10,000 and \$3,000. The reports were filed after the relevant election and the late contributions at issue were not disclosed prior to the election. The respondents did not have prior experience with the Act; however, the respondents were aware of the 24-hour filing obligation as they had previously, and timely, filed a 24-hour contribution report. The Commission imposed a penalty of \$4,500 for one count.

Here, as to Counts 8-15, unlike *Antonovich*, the Committee and Song were experienced with the Act. Also, unlike *Antonovich*, the Committee and Song filed the reports on the day of the election after receiving notification from the Enforcement Division that an Injunction had been filed.

As to Count 8, the Committee and Song failed to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports for two late contributions received of \$4,410 and \$6,000. In mitigation, the source of the \$6,000 contribution disclosed the late contribution made on a timely filed preelection campaign statement and 24-hour contribution report. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$3,500 is recommended for one count.

As to Count 9, the Committee and Song failed to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports for two late contributions received of \$10,000 and \$2,000. In mitigation, the source of the \$10,000 contribution disclosed the late contribution made on a timely filed pre-election campaign statement and 24-hour contribution report. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$3,500 is recommended for one count.

As to Count 10, the Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution received totaling \$22,440. In mitigation, the source of this late non-monetary contribution disclosed the late contribution made on a timely filed pre-election campaign statement and 24-hour contribution report. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$4,000 is recommended for one count.

As to Count 11, the Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution received totaling \$40,000. In mitigation, the source of this late non-monetary contribution disclosed the late contribution made on a timely filed pre-election campaign statement and 24-hour contribution report. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$4,500 is recommended for one count.

As to Count 12, the Committee and Song failed to timely file two 24-hour contribution reports for two late non-monetary contributions received of \$4,000 and \$15,088. In mitigation, the source of these late non-monetary contributions disclosed the late contributions made on a timely filed pre-election campaign statement and 24-hour contribution report. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$4,000 is recommended for one count.

As to Count 13, the Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution received totaling \$22,440. In mitigation, the source of this late non-monetary contribution disclosed the late contribution made on a timely filed pre-election campaign statement and 24-hour contribution report. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$4,000 is recommended for one count.

As to Count 14, the Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution received totaling \$21,944. In mitigation, the source of this late non-monetary contribution disclosed the late contribution made on a timely filed pre-election campaign statement and 24-hour contribution report. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$4,000 is recommended for one count.

As to Count 15, the Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-hour contribution report for a late non-monetary contribution received totaling \$21,937. In mitigation, the source of this late non-monetary contribution disclosed the late contribution made on a timely filed pre-election campaign statement and 24-hour contribution report. In consideration of the factors, a penalty of \$4,000 is recommended for one count.

PROPOSED PENALTY

After considering the factors of Regulation 18361.5 and the penalties imposed in prior cases, the following penalties are proposed:

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SUMMARY OF THE LAW

The Act and its regulations are amended from time to time. The discussion below regarding jurisdiction, the standard for finding probable cause, and the contents of the probable cause report includes references to current law. Unless otherwise noted, all other legal references and discussions of law pertain to the Act's provisions as they existed at the time of the violations in this case.

Jurisdiction

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") has primary responsibility for the impartial, effective administration and implementation of the Act.² This includes enforcement through administrative prosecution.³ However, before the Commission's Enforcement Division may commence administrative prosecution by filing/serving an Accusation, a hearing officer (either the General Counsel of the Commission or another attorney in the Commission's Legal Division) must determine whether there is probable cause that supports a reasonable belief or strong suspicion that one or more violations of the Act occurred.⁴ Any finding of probable cause is required by law to be announced publicly, which includes the posting of a summary of the allegations on the Commission's website.⁵ After a finding of probable cause, the Commission may then hold a hearing to determine what violations have occurred—and levy an administrative penalty of up to \$5,000 for each violation.⁶

Standard for Finding Probable Cause

For the hearing officer to make a finding of probable cause, it is only necessary that they be presented with evidence that sufficiently supports a reasonable belief or strong suspicion that the Act has been violated.⁷ Probable cause may only be found if the Respondents were notified of the violations at least 21 days prior to the hearing officer's consideration of the alleged violations.⁸

Contents of the Probable Cause Report

The probable cause report is required to contain a summary of the law and evidence that supports a finding of probable cause that each alleged violation of the Act has occurred, as well as a description

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of any exculpatory evidence indicating a violation alleged in the report did not occur. The evidence recited in the probable cause report may include hearsay.⁹

Need for Liberal Construction and Vigorous Enforcement of the Political Reform Act

When enacting the Act, the people of California found and declared that previous laws regulating political practices suffered from inadequate enforcement by state and local authorities. ¹⁰ For this reason, the Act is to be construed liberally to accomplish its purposes. ¹¹

A central purpose of the Act is to promote transparency by ensuring that receipts and expenditures in election campaigns are fully and truthfully disclosed so that voters are fully informed and improper practices are inhibited. ¹² Another is to provide adequate enforcement mechanisms so that the Act will be "vigorously enforced." ¹³

Controlled Committee

A "recipient committee" is a person or combination of persons who directly or indirectly receive contributions totaling \$2,000 or more in a calendar year. ¹⁴ A "controlled committee" includes a recipient committee that is controlled directly or indirectly by a candidate. ¹⁵

Duty to File Campaign Statements

The Act requires candidates, committees, and treasurers to file campaign statements at specific times disclosing information regarding contributions received and expenditures made by the campaign committees.¹⁶

If the filing due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or official state holiday, then the filing due date for such a statement or report shall be extended to the next regular business day.¹⁷ This extension does not apply to 24-Hour Contribution Reports when the due date for these types of reports falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or official state holiday immediately before an election.¹⁸

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Semi-Annual Campaign Statements

Recipient committees shall file semi-annual campaign statements each year no later than July 31 for the period ending June 30, and no later than January 31 for the period ending December 31.¹⁹

Pre-Election Campaign Statements

All candidates appearing on the ballot at the next election, and their controlled committees, shall file pre-election campaign statements. ²⁰ The first pre-election campaign statement, for the period ending 45 days before the election, shall be filed no later than 40 days before the election. ²¹ The second preelection campaign statement, for the period ending 17 days before the election, shall be filed no later than 12 days before the election.²²

If a candidate or elected officer controls more than one committee for the purpose of election to office, including committees established for a different elective office, the candidate or elected officer shall file campaign statements for each of these committees on the dates the candidate or elected officer is required to file pre-election campaign statements in connection with their election to office. ²³

24-Hour Contribution Reports

A "late contribution" includes a contribution, including a loan, that totals in the aggregate \$1,000 or more and is made to or received by a candidate or a controlled committee during the 90-day period preceding the date of the election, or on the date of the election, at which the candidate is to be voted on.²⁴ Each committee that receives a late contribution shall report the late contribution within 24 hours of the time it is received. ²⁵ Each committee that receives a late non-monetary contribution shall report the late non-monetary contribution within 48 hours of the time it is received. ²⁶

Terminating a Committee

A treasurer of a recipient committee may terminate the committee's status as a committee, only by completing the termination section on the statement of organization declaring, under penalty of

perjury, that the committee: (1) has ceased to receive contributions and make expenditures; (2) has eliminated or has declared that it has no intention or ability to discharge all of its debts, loans received and other obligations; (3) has no surplus funds; and (4) has filed all required campaign statements disclosing all reportable transactions.²⁷

Candidate and Treasurer Liability

Any person who has a filing or reporting obligation and who violated the Act shall be liable.²⁸ Under the Act, it is a duty of the candidate and the treasurer of a controlled committee to ensure that the committee complies with all of the requirements of the Act concerning the receipt, expenditure, and reporting of funds.²⁹ The candidate and treasurer may be held jointly and severally liable, along with the committee, for violations committed by the committee.³⁰

Liability for Violations

When the Commission determines a violation has occurred, the Commission may issue an order that the respondent pay up to \$5,000 per violation.³¹

SUMMARY OF THE EVIDENCE

Song was first elected to the Santa Clara County Board of Education in the November 7, 2000 General Election and was reelected in 2004, 2008, 2012, and 2016. Song was unsuccessful in the November 3, 2020 General Election, receiving 46.6% of the votes, and left office with the Santa Clara County Board of Education on December 11, 2020. Additionally, Song appeared on the March 3, 2020 Primary Election ballot as a candidate for State Assembly, District 25. Anna Song for Assembly 2020 (ID# 1418764) was Song's controlled committee. Song was unsuccessful in the March 3, 2020 Primary Election receiving 12.7% of the votes.

According to records obtained from the Secretary of State, the Committee qualified as committee on October 30, 2000. The Committee was redesignated for Song's 2020 Board of Education campaign on August 6, 2020. To date, the Committee remains open. According to records obtained from the

County of Santa Clara, between July 1, 2017 and December 31, 2020, the Committee reported approximately \$168,840 in contributions and \$147,840 in expenditures.

Failure to Timely File Semi-Annual and Pre-Election Campaign Statements

The Committee was required to file semi-annual campaign statements until the Committee was terminated. Song appeared on the March 3, 2020 Primary Election ballot and on the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot; thus, the Committee was required to file pre-election campaign statements prior to each election. Even though Song was a candidate for State Assembly, the Committee was required to file pre-election campaign statements prior to the March 3, 2020 Primary Election because Song appeared on the ballot. According to the County of Santa Clara, the Committee filed or failed to file pre-election and semi-annual campaign statements as follows:

The semi-annual campaign statement filed January 29, 2021, for the reporting period of October 18, 2020 to December 31, 2020, reported the Committee's ending cash balance as \$26,142.99. As of the date of this report, the Committee had not filed a statement of organization to terminate the Committee's status as a committee. Thus, the Committee is required to continue filing semi-annual campaign statements until the Committee is terminated.

On October 30, 2020, the Enforcement Division filed a Complaint for Injunctive Relief and Monetary Penalties ("Injunction") with the County of Santa Clara Superior Court. On or around November 20, 2020, the Enforcement Division requested for the Injunction to be dismissed because the Committee filed its outstanding campaign statements. Further, the Enforcement Division contacted Song at least 17 times in writing and 19 times via phone between November 4, 2019 and January 31, 2022 regarding the Committee's outstanding campaign statements. As of the date of this report, the Committee had not yet filed the campaign statements for the reporting periods ending June 30, 2021 and December 31, 2021.

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Reports

Song appeared on the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot; thus, the Committee was required to timely file 24-Hour Contribution Reports within 24 hours of receiving a late monetary contribution or within 48 hours of receiving a late non-monetary contribution. The 90-day period preceding the November 3, 2020 General Election began on August 5, 2020. The Committee's campaign statements reported late contributions and late non-monetary contributions received that were required to be disclosed on 24-Hour Contribution Reports. According to the County of Santa Clara, the Committee filed 24-Hour Contribution Reports as follows:

In summary, the Committee failed to timely file 24-Hour Contribution Reports for 12 late contributions received totaling \$170,259. The Committee reported these late contributions on the date of the election on 24-Hour Contribution Reports. The Charter Public Schools PAC (ID# 1302433) disclosed the late contributions it made to the Committee prior to the election on timely filed 24-Hour Contribution Reports.

Count 18: Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report to disclose a late non-monetary contribution, totaling \$40,000, received on October 8, 2020, by the October 12, 2020 due date, in violation of Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

Count 19: Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report to disclose a late non-monetary contribution, totaling \$4,000, received on October 11, 2020, by the October 13, 2020 due date, in violation of Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

Count 20: Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report to disclose a late non-monetary contribution, totaling \$22,440, received on October 13, 2020, by the October 15, 2020 due date, in violation of Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

Count 21: Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report to disclose a late non-monetary contribution, totaling \$15,088, received on October 15, 2020, by the October 19, 2020 due date, in violation of Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

Count 22: Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report to disclose a late non-monetary contribution, totaling \$21,944, received on October 21, 2020, by the October 23, 2020 due date, in violation of Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.

Count 23: Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Report

The Committee and Song failed to timely file a 24-Hour Contribution Report to disclose a late non-monetary contribution, totaling \$21,937, received on October 26, 2020, by the October 28, 2020 due date, in violation of Government Code Sections 84203 and 84203.3.





In the cover letter dated March 29, 2022, and the attached materials, Respondents were advised they could respond in writing to the PC Report and orally present the case to the Hearing Officer at a probable cause conference to be held in Sacramento. Respondents were further advised that in order to have a probable cause conference, they needed to make a written request for one on or before 21 days of the date they were served with the PC Report. Additionally, Respondents were advised if they did not request a probable cause conference, such a conference would not be held and probable cause would be determined based solely on the PC Report and any written response submitted within 21 days of the date they were served with the PC Report. To date, Respondents have not submitted a written response or requested a probable cause conference.

WHEREFORE, based on the attached PC Report, the Enforcement Division requests a finding by the Hearing Officer that probable cause exists to believe that Song and the Committee committed 23 violations of the Act, stated as follows:

- Count 1: The Committee and Song failed to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017, by the January 31, 2018 due date, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.
- Count 2: The Committee and Song failed to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2018 to June 30, 2018, by the July 31, 2018 due date, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.
- Count 3: The Committee and Song failed to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018, by the January 31, 2019 due date, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.
- Count 4: The Committee and Song failed to timely file a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of January 1, 2019 to June 30, 2019, by the July 31, 2019 due date, in violation of Government Code Section 84200.

By means of an Ex Parte Request for a Finding of Probable Cause and an Order that an Accusation be Prepared and Served ("Ex Parte Request"), the Enforcement Division submitted the above-entitled matter to the Hearing Officer for a determination of Probable Cause. As set forth in the Ex Parte Request, the Enforcement Division served a Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause ("PC Report") on Respondents, Anna Song ("Song") and Friends of Anna Song for County Board of Education for 2020 (ID# 1241672) (the "Committee") concerning this matter on April 1, 2022 by certified mail, return receipt requested. Accompanying the PC Report was a packet of materials that informed Respondents of their right to file a written response to the PC Report and to request a probable cause conference within 21 days following service of the PC Report, or transmittal of any requested records by the Enforcement Division. During the 21 days that followed service of the PC Report, Respondents did not file a response to the PC Report, request records, or request a probable cause conference. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 2, Section 18361.4, determination of probable cause may be made solely on papers submitted when the respondent does not request a probable cause conference.

In making a probable cause determination, it is the duty of the Hearing Officer of the Fair Political Practices Commission to determine whether probable cause exists to believe that a respondent violated the Political Reform Act as alleged by the Enforcement Division in the PC Report served on the respondent.

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B. Duty to File Campaign Statements

- 12. The Act requires candidates, committees, and treasurers to file campaign statements at specific times disclosing information regarding contributions received and expenditures made by the campaign committees.⁷
- 13. If the filing due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or official state holiday, then the filing due date for such a statement or report shall be extended to the next regular business day.⁸ This extension does not apply to 24-Hour Contribution Reports when the due date for these types of reports falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or official state holiday immediately before an election.⁹

C. Semi-Annual Campaign Statements

14. Recipient committees shall file semi-annual campaign statements each year no later than July 31 for the period ending June 30, and no later than January 31 for the period ending December 31.¹⁰

D. Pre-Election Campaign Statements

- 15. All candidates appearing on the ballot at the next election, and their controlled committees, shall file pre-election campaign statements.¹¹
- 16. The first pre-election campaign statement, for the period ending 45 days before the election, shall be filed no later than 40 days before the election. 12
- 17. The second pre-election campaign statement, for the period ending 17 days before the election, shall be filed no later than 12 days before the election. 13
- 18. If a candidate or elected officer controls more than one committee for the purpose of election to office, including committees established for a different elective office, the candidate or elected officer shall file campaign statements for each of these committees on the dates the candidate or elected officer is required to file pre-election campaign statements in connection with their election to office.¹⁴

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E. **24-Hour Contribution Reports**

- 19. A "late contribution" includes a contribution, including a loan, that totals in the aggregate \$1,000 or more and is made to or received by a candidate or a controlled committee during the 90-day period preceding the date of the election, or on the date of the election, at which the candidate is to be voted on. 15
- 20. Each committee that receives a late contribution shall report the late contribution within 24 hours of the time it is received. 16
- 21. Each committee that receives a late non-monetary contribution shall report the late nonmonetary contribution within 48 hours of the time it is received. 17

Terminating a Committee F.

22. A treasurer of a recipient committee may terminate the committee's status as a committee, only by completing the termination section on the statement of organization declaring, under penalty of perjury, that the committee: (1) has ceased to receive contributions and make expenditures; (2) has eliminated or has declared that it has no intention or ability to discharge all of its debts, loans received and other obligations; (3) has no surplus funds; and (4) has filed all required campaign statements disclosing all reportable transactions. 18

G. Factors to be Considered by the Fair Political Practices Commission

23. In framing a proposed order following a finding of a violation pursuant to Government Code Section 83116, the Commission and the administrative law judge shall consider all the surrounding circumstances including but not limited to the following factors set forth in Regulation 18361.5 subdivision (e)(1) through (8): (1) The extent and gravity of the public harm caused by the specific violation; (2) The level of experience of the violator with the requirements of the Political Reform Act; (3) Penalties previously imposed by the Commission in comparable cases; (4) The presence or absence of any intention to conceal, deceive or mislead; (5) Whether the violation was deliberate, negligent or inadvertent; (6) Whether the violator demonstrated good faith by consulting the Commission staff or any

- 37. The semi-annual campaign statement filed January 29, 2021, for the reporting period of October 18, 2020 to December 31, 2020, reported the Committee's ending cash balance as \$26,142.99.
- 38. As of the date of this Accusation, the Committee had not filed a statement of organization to terminate the Committee's status as a committee. Thus, the Committee is required to continue filing semi-annual campaign statements until the Committee is terminated.
- 39. As of the date of this Accusation, the Committee had not yet filed the campaign statements for the reporting periods ending June 30, 2021 and December 31, 2021.

Failure to Timely File 24-Hour Contribution Reports

- 40. Song appeared on the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot; thus, the Committee was required to timely file 24-Hour Contribution Reports within 24 hours of receiving a late monetary contribution or within 48 hours of receiving a late non-monetary contribution.
- 41. The 90-day period preceding the November 3, 2020 General Election began on August 5, 2020.
- 42. The Committee's campaign statements reported late contributions and late non-monetary contributions received that were required to be disclosed on 24-Hour Contribution Reports.

- 44. In summary, the Committee failed to timely file 24-Hour Contribution Reports for 12 late contributions or late non-monetary contributions received totaling \$170,259.
- 45. The Committee reported these late contributions or late non-monetary contributions on the date of the election on 24-Hour Contribution Reports.
- 46. The Charter Public Schools PAC (ID# 1302433) disclosed the late contributions it made to the Committee prior to the election on timely filed 24-Hour Contribution Reports.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

- 47. On October 30, 2020, the Enforcement Division filed a Complaint for Injunctive Relief and Monetary Penalties ("Injunction") with the County of Santa Clara Superior Court. On or around November 20, 2020, the Enforcement Division requested for the Injunction to be dismissed because the Committee filed its outstanding campaign statements.
- 48. The Enforcement Division contacted Song at least 17 times in writing and 19 times via phone between November 4, 2019 and January 31, 2022 regarding the Committee's outstanding campaign statements.
- 49. The Enforcement Division initiated an administrative action against the Committee and Song in this matter by serving a packet containing a cover letter, a Report in Support of a Finding of Probable Cause ("PC Report"), a fact sheet regarding probable cause proceedings, selected sections of the Government Code regarding probable cause proceedings for the Commission, selected regulations of the Commission regarding probable cause proceedings, and a probable cause checklist form.
- 50. Song was served with the PC Report, individually and on behalf of the Committee, via certified mail on April 1, 2022. The information contained in the PC Report packet advised the Committee

§ 11506. Filing of notice of defense or notice of participation; Contents; Right to hearing on the merits

- (a) Within 15 days after service of the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force the respondent may file with the agency a notice of defense, or, as applicable, notice of participation, in which the respondent may:
 - (1) Request a hearing.
- (2) Object to the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force upon the ground that it does not state acts or omissions upon which the agency may proceed.
- (3) Object to the form of the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force on the ground that it is so indefinite or uncertain that the respondent cannot identify the transaction or prepare a defense.
 - (4) Admit the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force in whole or in part.
 - (5) Present new matter by way of defense.
- (6) Object to the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force upon the ground that, under the circumstances, compliance with the requirements of a regulation would result in a material violation of another regulation enacted by another department affecting substantive rights.
- **(b)** Within the time specified the respondent may file one or more notices of defense, or, as applicable, notices of participation, upon any or all of these grounds but all of these notices shall be filed within that period unless the agency in its discretion authorizes the filing of a later notice.
- (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense or notice of participation, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense or notice of participation shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing. Unless objection is taken as provided in paragraph (3) of subdivision (a), all objections to the form of the accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force shall be deemed waived.
- (d) The notice of defense or notice of participation shall be in writing signed by or on behalf of the respondent and shall state the respondent's mailing address. It need not be verified or follow any particular form.

(e) As used in this section, "file," "files," "filed," or "filing" means "delivered or mailed" to the agency as provided in Section 11505.

§ 11507. Amended or supplemental accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force; Objections

At any time before the matter is submitted for decision, the agency may file, or permit the filing of, an amended or supplemental accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force. All parties shall be notified of the filing. If the amended or supplemental accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force presents new charges, the agency shall afford the respondent a reasonable opportunity to prepare his or her defense to the new charges, but he or she shall not be entitled to file a further pleading unless the agency in its discretion so orders. Any new charges shall be deemed controverted, and any objections to the amended or supplemental accusation or District Statement of Reduction in Force may be made orally and shall be noted in the record.

§ 11507.3. Consolidated proceedings; Separate hearings

- (a) When proceedings that involve a common question of law or fact are pending, the administrative law judge on the judge's own motion or on motion of a party may order a joint hearing of any or all the matters at issue in the proceedings. The administrative law judge may order all the proceedings consolidated and may make orders concerning the procedure that may tend to avoid unnecessary costs or delay.
- **(b)** The administrative law judge on the judge's own motion or on motion of a party, in furtherance of convenience or to avoid prejudice or when separate hearings will be conducive to expedition and economy, may order a separate hearing of any issue, including an issue raised in the notice of defense or notice of participation, or of any number of issues.

§ 11507.5. Exclusivity of discovery provisions

The provisions of Section 11507.6 provide the exclusive right to and method of discovery as to any proceeding governed by this chapter.

§ 11507.6. Request for discovery

After initiation of a proceeding in which a respondent or other party is entitled to a hearing on the merits, a party, upon written request made to another party, prior to the hearing and within 30 days after service by the agency of the initial pleading or within 15 days after the service of an additional pleading, is entitled to (1) obtain the names and addresses of witnesses to the extent known to the other party, including, but not limited to, those intended to be called to testify at the hearing, and (2) inspect and make a copy of any of the following in the possession or custody or under the control of the other party:

- (a) A statement of a person, other than the respondent, named in the initial administrative pleading, or in any additional pleading, when it is claimed that the act or omission of the respondent as to this person is the basis for the administrative proceeding;
- **(b)** A statement pertaining to the subject matter of the proceeding made by any party to another party or person;
- (c) Statements of witnesses then proposed to be called by the party and of other persons having personal knowledge of the acts, omissions or events which are the basis for the proceeding, not included in (a) or (b) above;
- (d) All writings, including, but not limited to, reports of mental, physical and blood examinations and things which the party then proposes to offer in evidence;
 - (e) Any other writing or thing which is relevant and which would be admissible in evidence;
- (f) Investigative reports made by or on behalf of the agency or other party pertaining to the subject matter of the proceeding, to the extent that these reports (1) contain the names and addresses of witnesses or of persons having personal knowledge of the acts, omissions or events which are the basis for the proceeding, or (2) reflect matters perceived by the investigator in the course of his or her investigation, or (3) contain or include by attachment any statement or writing described in (a) to (e), inclusive, or summary thereof.

For the purpose of this section, "statements" include written statements by the person signed or otherwise authenticated by him or her, stenographic, mechanical, electrical or other recordings, or transcripts thereof, of oral statements by the person, and written reports or summaries of these oral statements.

Nothing in this section shall authorize the inspection or copying of any writing or thing which is privileged from disclosure by law or otherwise made confidential or protected as the attorney's work product.

§ 11507.7. Motion to compel discovery; Order

- (a) Any party claiming the party's request for discovery pursuant to Section 11507.6 has not been complied with may serve and file with the administrative law judge a motion to compel discovery, naming as respondent the party refusing or failing to comply with Section 11507.6. The motion shall state facts showing the respondent party failed or refused to comply with Section 11507.6, a description of the matters sought to be discovered, the reason or reasons why the matter is discoverable under that section, that a reasonable and good faith attempt to contact the respondent for an informal resolution of the issue has been made, and the ground or grounds of respondent's refusal so far as known to the moving party.
- **(b)** The motion shall be served upon respondent party and filed within 15 days after the respondent party first evidenced failure or refusal to comply with Section 11507.6 or within 30 days after request was made and the party has failed to reply to the request, or within another time provided by stipulation, whichever period is longer.
- (c) The hearing on the motion to compel discovery shall be held within 15 days after the motion is made, or a later time that the administrative law judge may on the judge's own motion for good cause determine. The respondent party shall have the right to serve and file a written answer or other response to the motion before or at the time of the hearing.
- (d) Where the matter sought to be discovered is under the custody or control of the respondent party and the respondent party asserts that the matter is not a discoverable matter under the provisions of Section 11507.6, or is privileged against disclosure under those provisions, the administrative law judge may order lodged with it matters provided in subdivision (b) of *Section 915 of the Evidence Code* and examine the matters in accordance with its provisions.
- (e) The administrative law judge shall decide the case on the matters examined in camera, the papers filed by the parties, and such oral argument and additional evidence as the administrative law judge may allow.
- (f) Unless otherwise stipulated by the parties, the administrative law judge shall no later than 15 days after the hearing make its order denying or granting the motion. The order shall be in writing setting forth the matters the moving party is entitled to discover under Section 11507.6. A copy of the order shall forthwith be served by mail by the administrative law judge upon the parties. Where the order grants the motion in whole or in part, the order shall not become

effective until 10 days after the date the order is served. Where the order denies relief to the moving party, the order shall be effective on the date it is served.

§ 11508. Time and place of hearing

- (a) The agency shall consult the office, and subject to the availability of its staff, shall determine the time and place of the hearing. The hearing shall be held at a hearing facility maintained by the office in Sacramento, Oakland, Los Angeles, or San Diego and shall be held at the facility that is closest to the location where the transaction occurred or the respondent resides.
- **(b)** Notwithstanding subdivision (a), the hearing may be held at either of the following places:
- (1) A place selected by the agency that is closer to the location where the transaction occurred or the respondent resides.
 - (2) A place within the state selected by agreement of the parties.
- (c) The respondent may move for, and the administrative law judge has discretion to grant or deny, a change in the place of the hearing. A motion for a change in the place of the hearing shall be made within 10 days after service of the notice of hearing on the respondent.

Unless good cause is identified in writing by the administrative law judge, hearings shall be held in a facility maintained by the office.

located in the County of Santa Clara, and involving campaign statements required to be filed with the office of the County of Santa Clara Clerk, the County of Santa Clara Superior Court is the proper venue for this action.

Parties and Preliminary Facts

- 3. Plaintiff is a state agency created by the Act and authorized to bring a civil action to enforce the reporting requirements of the Act, pursuant to Government Code sections 90009, 91004, and 91005.5.
- 4. Defendant Anna Song ("Song"), an individual, has served as Trustee of Area 5 for the Santa Clara County Board of Education since 2000 and is a candidate on the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot for re-election.
- 5. Defendant Friends of Anna Song for County Board of Education 2020 (the "Committee") is a candidate-controlled campaign committee formed pursuant to the Act as Song's campaign committee for re-election to the Santa Clara County Board of Education in the November 3, 2020 General Election. Song serves as the Committee's treasurer.
- 6. On August 6, 2020, the Friends of Anna Song for County Board of Education 2016 was redesignated to the Committee for the November 3, 2020 General Election, thereby triggering the Committee's filing obligations under the Act.

Campaign Reporting Requirements

- 7. An express purpose of the Act, as set forth in Government Code section 81002, subdivision (a), is to ensure that the contributions and expenditures affecting election campaigns are fully and truthfully disclosed to the public, so that voters may be better informed, and so that improper practices may be inhibited.
- 8. In furtherance of this purpose of disclosure, the Act sets forth a comprehensive campaign reporting system. (Gov. Code, § 84200 et seq.)
- 9. A committee controlled directly or indirectly by a candidate, or that acts jointly with a candidate, is known as a candidate-controlled committee. (Gov. Code, § 82016.) A candidate-controlled committee must periodically file campaign statements that disclose the committee's financial information, including contributions received and expenditures made. (Gov. Code, § 84211.)

- 10. Candidates and candidate-controlled committees are required to file preelection campaign statements covering two reporting periods ending 45 days and 17 days before the election. (Gov. Code, §§ 84200.5(a), 84200.8, subds. (a), (b).) For the November 3, 2020 General Election, the reporting period for the first preelection campaign statement was July 1, 2020 through September 19, 2020. This first preelection campaign statement was required to be filed no later than September 24, 2020. (Gov. Code, § 84200.8, subd, (a).) The reporting period for the second preelection campaign statement was September 20, 2020 through October 17, 2020. This second preelection campaign statement was required to be filed no later than October 22, 2020. (Gov. Code, § 84200.8, subd. (b).)
- 11. Every committee must have a treasurer and it is the duty of the treasurer to ensure that the committee complies with all of the requirements of the Act concerning the receipt and expenditure of funds and the reporting of such activity. (Gov. Code, § 84100; Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § 18427, subd.

 (a).) A committee's treasurer may be held jointly and severally liable, along with the committee and the candidate, for any reporting violations committed by the committee. (Gov. Code, §§ 83116.5, 91006.)

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

(Violation of Government Code Sections 84200.5 and 84200.8)

- 12. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 11, as if fully set forth herein.
- 13. Defendants had a duty to timely file a preelection campaign statement for the reporting period of July 1, 2020 through September 19, 2020 (the "First Preelection Statement").
- 14. Defendants failed to timely file the First Preelection Statement by the September 24, 2020 deadline.
 - 15. To date, Defendants have not filed the First Preelection Statement.
- 16. By failing to timely file the First Preelection Statement, Defendants violated Government Code Sections 84200.5, subdivision (a), and 84200.8, subdivision (a).

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

(Violation of Government Code sections 84200.5 and 84200.8)

17. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 16, as if fully set forth herein.

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- 18. Defendants had a duty to timely file a preelection campaign statement for the reporting period of September 20, 2020 through October 17, 2020 (the "Second Preelection Statement").
- 19. Defendants failed to timely file the Second Preelection Statement by the October 22, 2020 deadline.
 - 20. To date, Defendants have not filed the Second Preelection Statement.
- 21. By failing to timely file the Second Preelection Statement, Defendants violated Government Code Sections 84200.5, subdivision (a), and 84200.8, subdivision (b).

Request for Injunctive Relief

- 22. Unless and until this court compels Defendants to file the preelection campaign statements referenced above, Defendants' wrongful conduct will cause great and irreparable harm to the voters of Santa Clara County by denying them important information to which they are entitled regarding who contributed to Song's campaign, and how Defendants spent those contributions.
- Plaintiff has no adequate remedy at law or through administrative action for the injuries 23. currently being suffered because the information sought must be available to the voters of Santa Clara County immediately as the pertinent election occurs on November 3, 2020. Any action in law or administrative action would not be sufficient because it would not compel Defendants to comply with the law immediately, thereby denying voters the information sought and subverting the intent of the law requiring timely disclosure of campaign contributions and expenditures.

Prayer for Relief

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays judgment against Defendants, and each of them, as follows:

- 1. For monetary penalties pursuant to Government Code section 91004, in an amount according to proof;
- 2. For monetary penalties pursuant to Government Code section 91005.5, in an amount according to proof, up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per violation;
- 3. For a preliminary injunction pursuant to Government Code section 90009 compelling Defendants to immediately file all campaign statements and reports required under the Political Reform Act as the result of Song's 2020 campaign for Santa Clara County Board of Education, Trustee of Area 5;

- 4. For a permanent injunction pursuant to Government Code section 90009 compelling Defendants to immediately file all campaign statements and reports required under the Political Reform Act as the result of Song's 2020 campaign for Santa Clara County Board of Education, Trustee of Area 5; and
 - 5. For such other and further relief as the court deems proper.

Dear Anna Song and Committee:

On August 16, 2022, you were personally served with an accusation in the above-referenced matter. Pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, you were required to file a notice of defense within 15 days after service of the accusation to request an administrative hearing. You did not file a notice of defense. As a result, you have waived your right to an administrative hearing.¹

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") will proceed with a default, decision and order ("default") against you. The initial notice of this default will appear on the published agenda for the Commission's public meeting on November 16, 2023. This agenda will be public and you could be contacted by the media with questions. The Commission will be asked to adopt the default at the subsequent public meeting on January 18, 2024 and impose an administrative penalty of \$63,500 against you.

Following the issuance of the default, the Commission will obtain a judgment in superior court for the amount owed and then take action to collect the judgment. Please be advised that administrative penalties for violations of the Political Reform Act cannot be discharged in bankruptcy proceedings.

You may still resolve this matter informally by way of a stipulated settlement if an agreement can be reached prior to this matter appearing for consideration by the Commission. Please contact me at (279) 237-5910 or rinehart@fppc.ca.gov if you wish to enter into a settlement to resolve this matter in its entirety.

On August 16, 2022, you were personally served with an accusation in the above referenced matter. Pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, you were required to file a notice of defense within 15 days after service of the accusation to request an administrative hearing. You did not file a notice of defense. As a result, you have waived your right to an administrative hearing.¹

The Fair Political Practices Commission (the "Commission") will proceed with a default, decision and order ("default") against you. The initial notice of this default appeared on the published agenda for the Commission's public meeting on November 16, 2023. The Commission will be asked to adopt the default at its public meeting scheduled for January 18, 2024 and impose an administrative penalty of \$63,500 against you. A copy of the default, decision, and order and accompanying exhibits the Commission will consider at its meeting on January 18, 2024 is enclosed with this letter.

You may, but you are not required to, provide a response brief, along with any supporting materials, no later than five calendar days before the Commission hearing at which the default is scheduled to be heard. Your response brief must be served on the Commission Assistant, at the above address or at CommAsst@fppc.ca.gov.

Following the issuance of the default order and imposition of the administrative penalty, we will commence legal proceedings to collect this fine, which may include converting the Commission's order to a court judgment. Please be advised that administrative penalties for violations of the Political Reform Act cannot be discharged in bankruptcy proceedings.

This letter is your last opportunity to resolve this matter informally by way of a stipulated settlement, before the default proceedings are commenced. If we do not reach a resolution, the enclosed documents will be placed on the Commission's agenda for the January 18, 2024 meeting.
