Re: Your Request for Advice Our No. A-85-015

You have written requesting our advice based upon the following facts.

## FACTS

In 1982, I ran for an office and had to loan my committee funds. When I closed out the reports, the balance of the personal loan reverted to a contribution due to inability of the committee to repay same.

In 1984, I again ran for the same office and filed again as a committee with a new number. The 1984 campaign closed with a surplus in the account.

## QUESTION

Can the 1984 Committee make a contribution to the 1982 Committee and repay part of the unpaid loan?

## **ANSWER**

If the 1982 Committee terminated and closed its books, showing no remaining obligations, then there is no committee to which the 1984 Committee may contribute. See Government Code Section 84214 and Commission regulation 2 Cal. Adm. Code Section 18404. However, if you showed the loan as an outstanding obligation in the 1982 Committee's final statement, a contribution may be made to the 1982 Committee for the purpose of repaying the debt. Of course, a report must be filed. As to whether the loan may otherwise be paid off from the 1984

Committee, we suggest you consult with the Attorney General's Office as that agency, not ours, oversees the "personal use" law in Elections Code Sections 12400, et seq
