Dear Mr. Koretz:

You have requested confirmation of telephone advice provided to you regarding the campaign provisions of the Political Reform ${\sf Act.}^1$

You are currently a City Councilman in West Hollywood. Another candidate used your stationery for soliciting funds to his campaign. The value of the stationery is estimated at \$10.00. You have received a check, from that candidate, to pay for the use of your stationery.

Section 82015 states that the term "contribution" includes any transfer of anything of value received by a committee from another committee, unless full and adequate consideration is received. If \$10.00 is the fair market value of the stationery received by the other candidate, then full and adequate consideration has been received.

You may deposit the check into your campaign account and should report the transaction on the campaign statement covering the appropriate time period. The transaction should be reported on Schedule G (Miscellaneous Increases to Cash,) line 2--increases to cash under \$100 this period (not itemized).

Government Code Sections 81000-91015. All statutory references are to the Government Code unless otherwise indicated. Commission regulations appear at 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18000, et seq. All references to regulations are to Title 2, Division 6 of the California Code of Regulations.
