Dear Ms. White-Brown:

This is in response to your request for assistance under the newly-enacted revolving door provisions of the Political Reform Act. 1/ Since you are writing to confirm previous telephone advice and are not seeking advice on behalf of any specific official, your letter is considered a request for informal assistance. 2/

QUESTION

Is Section 87406.1 applicable to former board members of the South Coast Air Quality Management District who left office prior to the statute's January 1, 1995 operative date?

CONCLUSION

Section 87406.1 applies only to persons who become former board members on or after the operative date of the statute.

DISCUSSION

Section 87406.1, Stats. 1994, Ch. 747 is a new "revolving door" provision of the Act. This provision essentially prohibits any member or former member of an air quality management district

from lobbying the district for a period of one year after leaving office. Subparagraph (d) of that provision states: "[t]his section applies to members and former members of district hearing boards."

We interpret the language "former board members" to mean members who left service <u>after</u> the operative date of the statute (January 1, 1995.)
