**Re: No Action Closure Letter**  
**FPPC No. 2021-00424; Danielle Guillen for Redlands School Board 2020, Guillen**

Dear Committee and Ms. Guillen:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“FPPC”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).<sup>1</sup> On March 2, 2021, we received a referral from the County of San Bernardino alleging that you failed to file a semi-annual campaign statement for the reporting period of October 18, 2020 through December 31, 2020 by the February 1, 2021 deadline.

The Enforcement Division has completed its review of the facts in this case. Specifically, we found that you filed the required semi-annual campaign statement before you were contacted by the Enforcement Division. For this reason, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this case without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, the County of San Bernardino.
