The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to our investigation concerning a sworn complaint in connection with the above referenced case, alleging you, in your capacity as a Pittsburg City Council Member, violated the Act’s conflict of interest provisions. After conducting our investigation and review of the case, we are closing this matter because the allegations have been disproven.

Our investigation determined that you did not make, participate in making, or attempt to use your position as a City Council Member to influence a governmental decision in which you had a financial interest. For this reason, we are closing this case without further action.
