No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2023-00730; Rocio Moustafa

Dear Rocio Moustafa:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from California Correctional Health Care Services (“CCHCS”) regarding your failure to timely file your Assuming Office, 2019 Annual, 2020 Annual, and 2022 Annual Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your position as a Staff Psychiatrist with CCHCS.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the missing SEIs. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action. Although the Enforcement Division is closing this matter without seeking a penalty, you are still required to pay any late filing fees assessed by your filing officer, CCHCS.
