No Action Closure Letter re: FPPC No. 2024-00995; Randy Carrasco

Dear Randy Carrasco:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission (“Commission”) enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ This letter is in response to a referral from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation alleging that you failed to timely file your Assuming Office and 2023 Annual Statements of Economic Interests (“SEIs”) for your position as a Parole Agent III with the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.

The Enforcement Division found that you successfully completed the Commission’s Political Reform Education Program (PREP) course regarding SEIs. In addition, you have filed the missing SEIs. For these reasons, we are closing this matter without further action.

Moreover, completion of PREP exempts you from paying late filing fees for the violations listed in the PREP Agreement, i.e., failure to timely file an Assuming Office and 2023 Annual SEIs, assessed by your filing officer, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, pursuant to Section 91013.
