No Action Closure Letter: FPPC No. 19/538, Public Land, Public Benefit, No on E, Yes on G; and Nancy Haley

Dear Mr. Kaufman:

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission enforces the provisions of the Political Reform Act (the “Act”).¹ As you know, the Enforcement Division opened a proactive investigation into whether the committee Public Land, Public Benefit, No on E, Yes on G violated the advertising disclosure requirements of the Act. After conducting our investigation and review of the matter, we found that the subject advertisements were compliant. Therefore, because the allegations have been disproven, we are closing this matter without further action.
